

Graduating with One of Three Honors Degree Designations

1. **University Honors Scholar**
 - Complete 8 Honors courses with grades of A or B
 - Complete an Honors project and/or course requirements in the major (Entrance and GPA requirements vary—consult your department/college office at end of sophomore year)
2. **General Studies Honors Scholar**
 - Complete 8 Honors courses with grades of A or B
 - Have a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher at time of graduation
3. **Departmental Honors Scholar**
 - Complete an Honors project and/or course requirements in the major (Entrance and GPA requirements vary—consult your department/college office at end of sophomore year)

Honors Courses

- Complete 6 lower-level Honors courses—including at least one UH 201 (Area IV), UH 202 (Area III), or UH 203 (Area V for non-science majors) course—by the time you finish your General Education curriculum (usually around the end of your sophomore year)
- Take 2 interdisciplinary UH 400 courses during junior/senior years

Honors Priority Registration

- Earn priority registration before registering for Winter quarter
- Priority registration allows you to register for classes before other undergraduate students

Honors Dialogues

- Freshman students are required to attend one Dialogue during their first year
- Dialogues are hour-long presentations/discussions led by Honors faculty
- Fall Quarter Dialogues are:
 - Thursday, September 17, 3:00 p.m.
 - Wednesday, October 7, 3:00 p.m.
 - Wednesday, November 4, 3:00 p.m.

Honors DARS

An Honors DARS report is an audit of the Honors courses that you have taken at Wright State. The purpose of an Honors DARS is to assist you in tracking your progress towards graduating with an Honors degree designation. Follow the steps below to run an Honors DARS.

1. Login to Wings Express
2. Click on the "Student & Financial Aid" tab
3. Click on the "Registration & Records" link
4. Click on the "DARS" link
5. Click on the "Submit an Audit" link
6. Click on the "What-If?" icon
7. Select "Other" from the College/School dropdown menu
8. Select "Non Degree" from the Degree dropdown menu
9. Select "Honors Program Checklist" from the Major dropdown menu
10. Select "Current Term"
11. Click on the "Run Analysis" icon
12. Follow the remaining on-screen steps to view your Honors DARS
