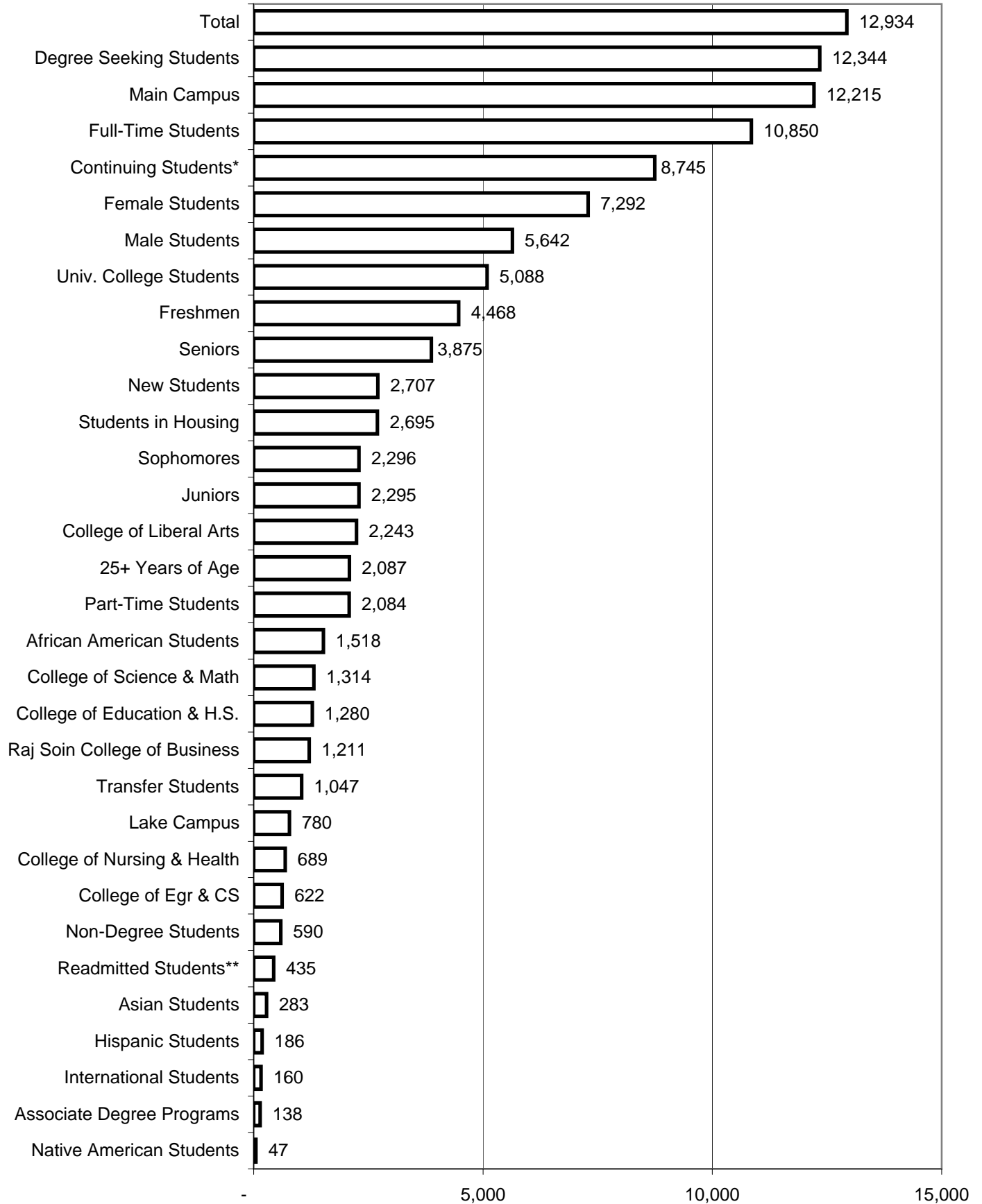

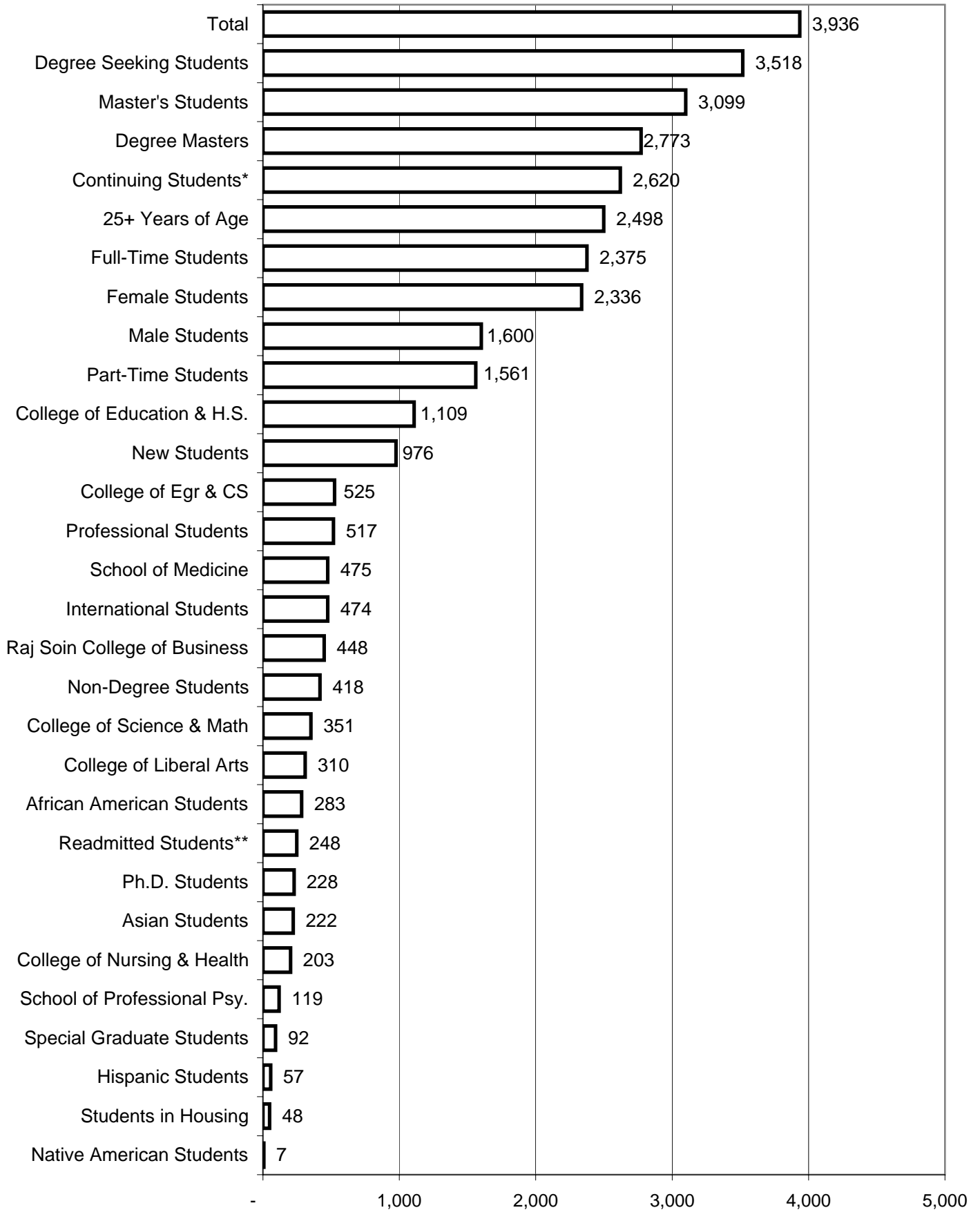

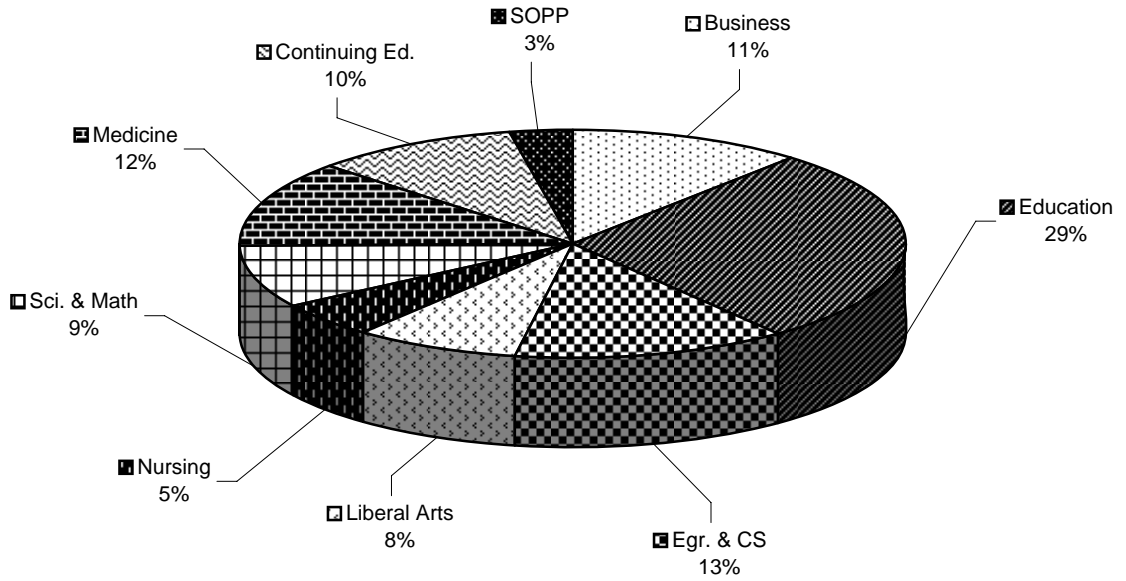

Age of Students



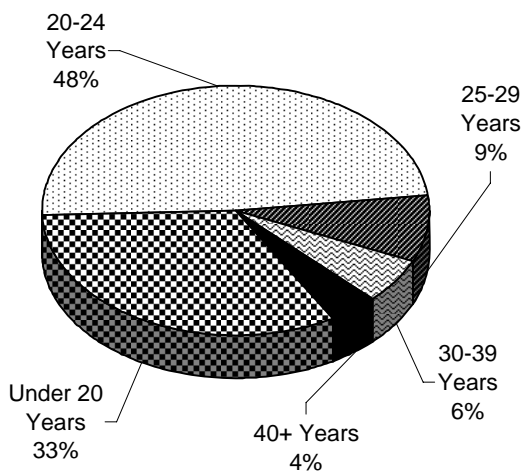

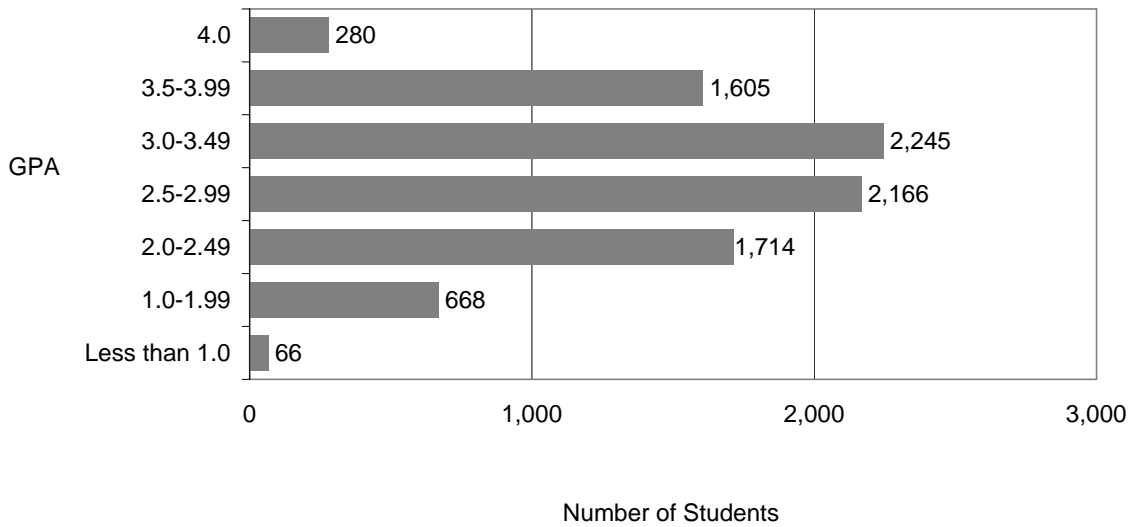

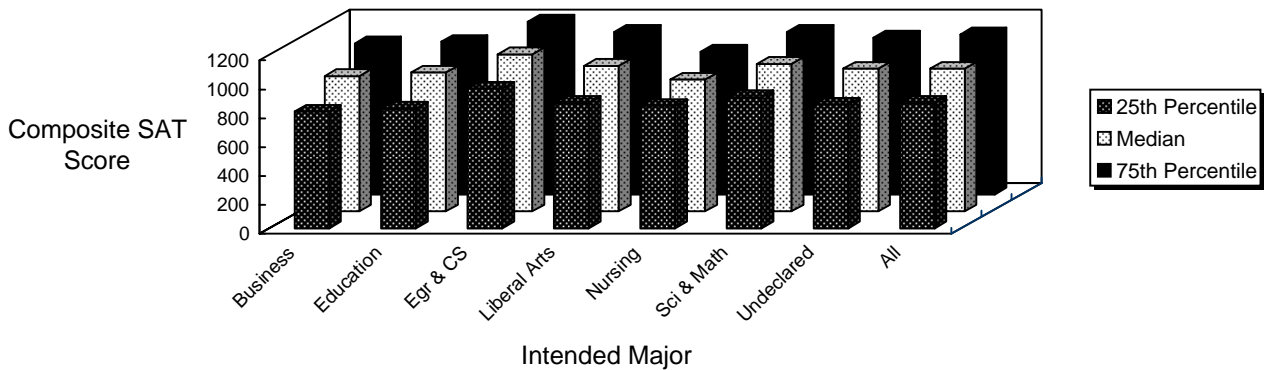

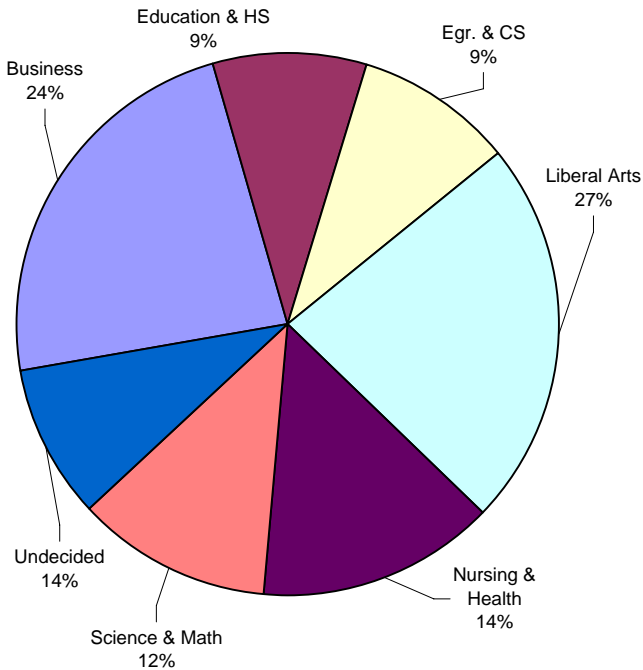

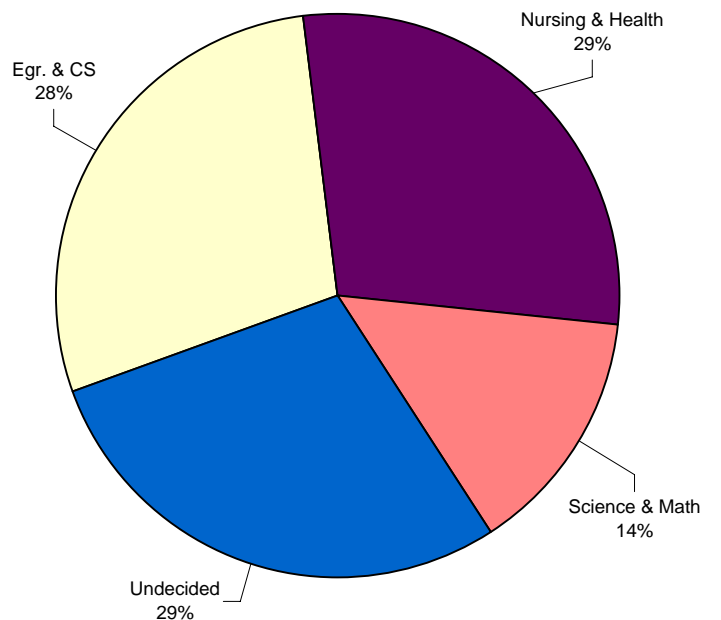
**African American Students Intended Area of Study

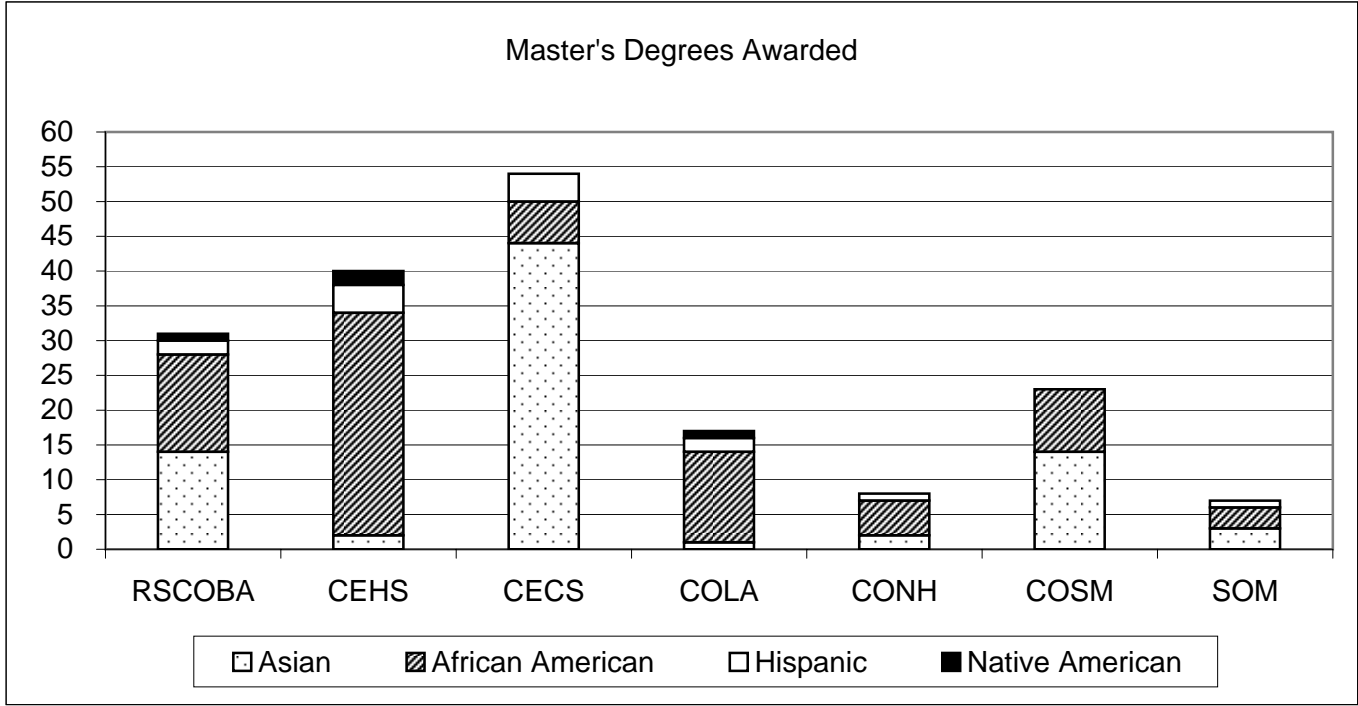
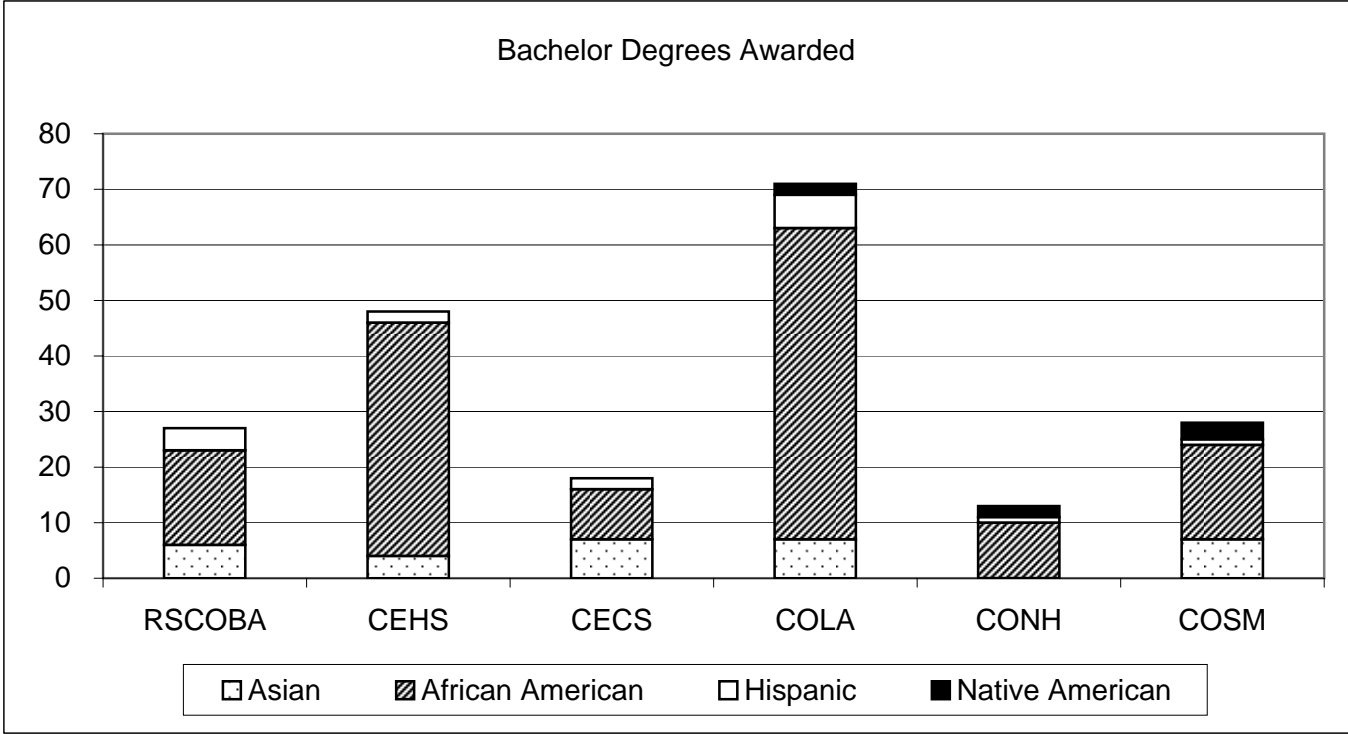

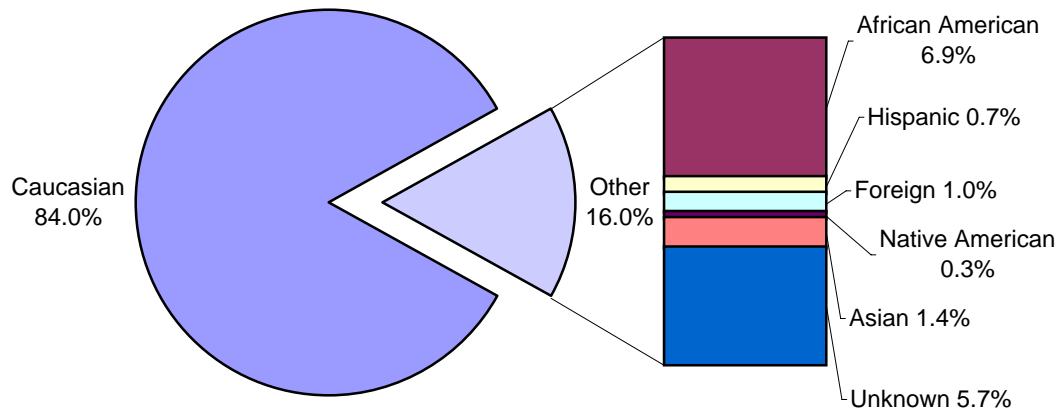
Degrees Awarded to Minorities by College
