



Classroom Features Key

Classroom Type

Computer Lab	The room contains a teaching station with a PC computer, DVD/VCR player, a cable to hook up a laptop computer, an on-campus-only phone and ceiling mounted data projector. All rooms have enhanced sound systems, internet connectivity, wireless access, and an overhead transparency projector. In addition, the rooms have individual PC computer workstations with internet connectivity for each student in the class. LX 034 is an Adaptive Computer Lab with no teaching station. Electronic Classroom	The room contains a teaching station with a PC computer, DVD/VCR player, a cable to hook up a laptop computer, an on-campus-only phone and ceiling mounted data projector. All rooms have enhanced sound systems, internet connectivity, wireless access, and an overhead transparency projector. The following rooms have a Macintosh computer (in addition to the PC Computer): All Allyn Hall classrooms, CA A020, CA A324, CA A330, CA M095, MM171, MM271, MM202. The Center for Teaching and Learning's website contains a complete list of available equipment by room.
Flexible Learning Classroom	The room contains a PC computer, DVD/VCR player, and 42" LCD monitor (all located on a moveable cart). All rooms have internet connectivity, wireless access, and an overhead transparency projector. There are two flexible learning classrooms available: JC191 and JC193.
General Classroom	The room contains a DVD/VCR player attached to a 27" monitor and an overhead transparency projector. All of the rooms have internet ports and wireless access.
Interactive Video Distance Learning Classroom(IVDL)	The room contains a teaching station with a PC computer, DVD/VCR player, a cable to hook up a laptop computer, an on-campus-only phone, an Elmo Document Camera, a Sympodium, and ceiling mounted data projector. All rooms have enhanced sound systems, internet connectivity, wireless access, Campus TV (Raidervision) connection and an overhead transparency projector. In addition, the rooms have equipment to allow classes from remote sites to fully participate in on-site classroom activities in real time. Faculty wishing to simultaneously teach onsite and remote site students should contact the

	Center for Teaching and Learning. IVDL classrooms include: AL270, RK050, RC146.
Video Recording & Playback Classroom	The room contains a teaching station with a PC computer, DVD/VCR player, a cable to hook up a laptop computer, an on-campus-only phone and ceiling mounted data projector. All rooms have enhanced sound systems, internet connectivity, wireless access, and an overhead projector. In addition, the room has the capacity to videotape instructor and student presentations. RC 302 will be available beginning with Fall 2009.

Classroom Features

Data Monitor	A device to display images from a laptop or from the DVD player and the VCR player attached to the monitor cart. Some classrooms have a TV data monitor. Rooms with a flat screen data monitor include: JC 191, JC 193, MS 212, MS 214, MS 218, MS 220, MS 204, MS 206.
Data Projector	A device to project the image from a computer onto the screen in the classroom. The projector can also display movies from the DVD player and the VCR player located in the teaching stations.
Document Camera (ELMO)	A high resolution camera on a stand that can display transparencies, books, papers, flat art work and three-dimensional items through the data projector onto the screen in the classroom. Rooms with a document camera include: AL270, RK050, RC146, OH109, OH112, FH101
Large Board	Wall writing surface (chalk or marker board) measuring a minimum of 20 linear feet including any side boards, with at least 16 feet of board space at the front of the classroom.
Overhead Projector	A device that allows instructors to display transparencies onto a screen in the classroom. Instructors can also write directly onto the acetate roll on the projector during class lectures.
Screen	A classroom equipped with a screen (either manual or automatic) for projecting images from either an overhead transparency projector or a ceiling mounted data projector.
Sympodium	A device with an interactive pen display enabling instructors to write over slides, websites, or multimedia files in digital ink and project the work onto a screen. The following rooms are installed with Sympodiums: All Rike Hall classrooms, AL270, BL165, CA A230, CA A324, CA A330, CA M095, CA M259, FH101, HC L150, MS035, MS120, NC236, OH109, OH112, OH340, RC144, RC145, RC146, RC148, RC150, RC153.
White Marker Board	Dry erase board with dry erase markers.
Wireless	A classroom with wireless connectivity to the internet for laptop use. All classrooms in the Registrar's Inventory have this feature.
Wireless Microphone	Rooms with a wireless microphone include: OH109, OH112, FH101, HS116

Classroom Seating

Fixed Tables & Moveable Chairs	A classroom in which the tables for students are immovable, but the chairs can be moved. Typically these are tiered classrooms. Examples include: BL 165, RK 016, RK 020, RK 041, RK 160, all of which are tiered.
Fixed Tablet Arm Chairs	A classroom in which the tables for students are immovable and the chairs are attached to the tables with a swivel mechanism. Examples include: FH 206, RC 144, RC 148, RC 153.
Moveable Desks	A classroom in which student seating consists of a desk-chair combination that may be moved. This provides flexibility in seating configurations for a variety of instructional styles. Most desks in this category have a larger writing surface as in CA A020, MM 171, RC 406, and many classrooms on the 3 rd floor of Oelman. Desks with a smaller tablet arm writing surface, include CA A330, FH 204, FH 210, MS 206, MS 208, MS 218, MS 220, OH 132, OH 236, and OH 248.
Moveable Tables/Chairs	A classroom in which both the tables and the chairs for student seating are moveable. Most of the seating in Allyn, Millett, Rike, and University Hall is of this type.
Tiered Classroom	Student seating is in layered ascending rows so that those seated further back can see over the heads of those in front. Examples include: BL 165, BS 103, BS 105, CA M252, FH 101, HS 116, MS 120, OH 103, OH 109, OH 112, OH 132, OH 340, RC 144, RK 016, RK 020, RK 041, and RK 160.
