



To all employees using university cell phones,

As you may know, Daylight Saving Time (DST) start and end dates for the United States are changing this year to comply with the Energy Policy Act of 2005.

DST will begin three weeks earlier than previously, and it will end one week later. That means we change our clocks one hour ahead at **2:00 A.M. Sunday, March 11, 2007** and change them back one hour at **2:00 A.M. on Sunday, November 4, 2007**.

Voice-only devices (phones) will automatically adjust to the new DST dates, **but many data devices will not automatically adjust**. This is because unlike voice handsets that simply use network time, smart phones—like desktop computers—maintain a local set of DST tables to support more complex features.

Device manufacturers have created solutions or **patches** for their respective devices, and we've compiled that information into one location on our website. The information is located at www.cingular.com/dst2007. Here you will find instructions for how to **download a patch** that will correct the problem.

Please note that your data and your end-users' data will not be lost while applying a fix. If the device is hard reset, however, the fix will have to be applied again.
