- ___ Include a minimum of 2 Writing Intensive (WI) courses in the major.
- ___ Complete at least 60 credit hours in upper division courses (those numbered 300 and above).

- ___ Complete residency requirements.*
 - ___ *Minimum of 45 WSU credit hours. At least 15 of last 45 credit hours from WSU

The Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Science Education through the College of Liberal Arts prepares you for the graduate level licensure program in education. Completing the undergraduate degree does NOT make you eligible for a teaching license. You must first complete the graduate level licensure program through the College of Education and Human Services to be eligible for licensure as an Integrated Social Studies teacher. This credential will allow you to teach students in grades 7-12.

GRADUATE LICENSURE PROGRAM

The admissions process to the program is two-fold. You need to apply to both the School of Graduate Studies and the Licensure Program. Criteria to determine eligibility for consideration are:

Admission to WSU School of Graduate Studies

- Application for Admission to a graduate Masters of Education Program
- Official transcripts with an undergraduate GPA of 2.7* or better
- *Admission Petition may be submitted for low GPA

Admission to the Graduate Licensure Program

- Application for Admission to the Graduate Licensure Program
- Writing sample
- Copy of transcript evaluation regarding desired licensure program prerequisites
- Short narrative which describes your experience working/volunteering with children and/or young adults
- Short narrative which attests to your level of computer literacy
- Two recommendation forms
- Personal interview(s)
