

2006-07 Liberal Arts Leadership Scholarship Recipients Selected by the COLA Alumni Advisory Committee



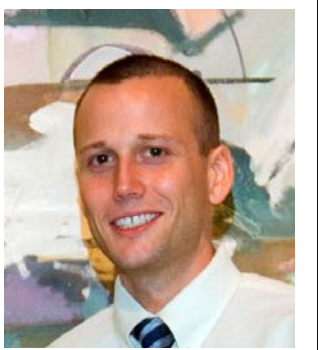
