We have been busy since school closed, wrapping up the spring quarter, meeting new students and their parents at orientation, and making preparations for your fall arrival. I would encourage you to look carefully through this newsletter and the

other publications in your mailer. Your assignment confirmation and roommate(s) names and phone numbers are included. It can be very helpful if you call them to discuss plans for the upcoming year. Don't depend on MYSPACE, FACEBOOK or GOOGLE.

When you arrive on campus, there will be volunteers to assist with transferring your

belongings to your new home. On Sunday, you will be able to attend a floor meeting to learn about the floor standards. It will also offer you the opportunity to meet your staff and many of your neighbors.

We welcome you to campus and hope your stay with us is a memorable experience.



BE AWARE:

Students found to be in possession of weapons on campus will be evicted from university housing and will be subject to university judicial action and /or criminal prosecution.

Possession/use of alcohol and drugs may also result in sanctions up to and including loss of housing privileges.

All residential facilities are smoke free communities.

CAMPUS SAFETY

The cooperation and involvement of students, faculty, and staff in any campus safety program is absolutely necessary. All members of the university community must assume responsibility for their own safety and the security of their property by taking simple, common-sense precautions.

Awareness, Avoidance and Risk Reduction are 90% of crime prevention.

The Wright State Police maintain a Crime Prevention Unit designed to reduce incidents of crime.

The Crime Prevention Unit coordinates a Campus Watch, Residence Hall Watch and Office Watch Programs. The "watches" receive 1 hour of basic training and meet once a month to pass on the latest crime prevention techniques. The "watches" are the eyes and ears of the Police.

In addition, the Crime Prevention Unit operates a 24 hour escort service (Student for Safe Escorts), Operations ID, and offers a variety of programs such as personal safety, sexual assault prevention drug and alcohol prevention and other related topics. The Crime Prevention Office can be reached at 775-2497.

Can I bring my pet?

No, not unless your pet is a fish.....

The pet policy at Wright State University allows residents to keep fish ONLY. But here are some things you will want to bring:

- Bed Linens: extra long twin size sheets (mattress size 36x80)
- Mattress pad or cover, pillows, and comforter/bedspread
- Towels

- Toiletries (shampoo, soap, razor, toilet paper, etc.)
- Seasonal clothing
- Umbrella
- Touch-tone phone
- Cleaning supplies
- Cooking utensils
- Plates, cups, silverware
- Desk lamp
- Alarm Clock

Along with your pet, leave these items at home, as they **ARE NOT** permitted in your room;

- Electric frying pan or any devices with an exposed element such as hot plates, space heaters, range top grills.
- Firearms, weapons (knives, soft air guns, paintball guns, bows, swords, etc.)
- Fireworks, incense, candles, or any other open-flame device.

Parking Permits

A returning resident student may purchase a parking permit for their respective community lot.

A community lot permit is sold subject to parking space availability for each residential community. To find out more you can contact Parking & Transportation Services at (937) 775-5690 or check out their website: www.wright.edu/admin/parking/permit.html

Purchasing a permit through the website before school starts is convenient, and avoids the long lines after

classes begin. First year residents of the Woods, Honors, and Hamilton Hall may purchase a remote parking permit for Lot 20.

Cancellation Information

We do understand that circumstances may arise to change your housing plans and cancellation may become necessary. **New incoming students in Residence Halls and Forest Lane ONLY** must request to cancel **IN WRITING**. This can be done by e-mail, fax, or U.S. postal mail. Verbal cancellation to the Office of Residence Services or other campus departments is **NOT VALID**. Residents of campus apartments (College Park, University Park, and The Village) are under binding agreement and are subject to the Replacement Lease Process as detailed in Section III- A & B of the [Campus Housing Terms & Conditions](#).
