## New Freshmen

(High school graduates or recipients of an equivalency diploma)

Complete and submit the following to WSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions:

1. Undergraduate Application
2. \$30 nonrefundable application fee (one-time fee; not required if previously paid)
3. High school transcript (partial one at time of application; final one at end of senior year) or GED/High School Equivalence Diploma scores
4. College Preparatory Curriculum Completion form (requested)
5. Official ACT or SAT scores

## Transfer Students and Current Students

(Students who have enrolled for credit at another college or university or students currently attending Wright State.)

Complete and submit the following to WSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions:

1. Undergraduate Application
2. \$30 nonrefundable application fee (one-time fee; not required if previously paid)
3. Official transcript from each college or university previously attended
4. Admissions Petition form\*
5. High school transcript (required of the following students)

- High school graduates of 1986 or before who are transferring with less than 12 quarter (9 semester) hours
  - High school graduates of 1987 or after who are transferring with less than 45 quarter (30 semester) hours
6. College Preparatory Curriculum Completion form (requested)

**If you have 45–89 quarter credit hours (30–59 semester hours) you must list an intended major**

**If you have 90 or more quarter credit hours (60 or more semester hours) you must choose a major and meet the entrance requirements for that major.**

## Returning Students

(Students who have attended Wright State as degree students but have not registered in the past four quarters)

## Adult Students

## Attention Male Students

A law passed by the Ohio Assembly requires state universities to charge nonresident fees to male (Ohio) students who have not registered with the Selective Service. Males born after December 31, 1960, who have not registered with the Selective Service may go to any U.S. Post Office to register. Call (708) 688-6888 between 8:30 a.m. and 6:45 p.m. Monday through Friday if you have registered but have lost your Selective Service number. A duplicate card will be sent within 10 days.

\*The admissions petition form must be completed by:

- transfer students** who have less than a 2.0 cumulative grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) from the last college/university of attendance where at least 12 quarter hours (9 semester hours) were attempted. Academically dismissed/suspended students are not eligible to enroll at WSU for one calendar year from the date of the dismissal.
  - returning students** who are reapplying for admission to WSU after completing the four-quarter dismissal period or have less than a 2.0 GPA from a college/university since last enrolled at Wright State. See (a).
  - academically dismissed students** who were dismissed/suspended from an academic institution. Academically dismissed/suspended students are not eligible to enroll at WSU for one calendar year from the date of dismissal.
  - disciplinarily dismissed students** who were dismissed/suspended for reasons other than academics are required to complete the petition form and submit a notarized release form.
  - any student who has been convicted** of a felony is required to complete the petition form and a signed notarized release form.
- **PLEASE NOTE: A student who has not attended a college or university for three (3) years or more is NOT required to complete this form, unless the student was disciplinarily dismissed/suspended or convicted of a felony.**
