

60 and Up Program

On a space-available basis, Ohio residents, age 60 or older, may enroll in university courses on a noncredit (audit) basis, and tuition is free. Eligible students who wish to earn academic credit for the tuition free courses **must also demonstrate financial need** as stipulated in section 3345.27 Ohio Revised Code (family income less than 200% of the federal poverty guideline). As of January 23, 2008, for a single person, the poverty guideline is an annual income of no more than \$10,4000; for a family of two, \$14,000; and for a family of four, \$21,200. A signed and dated copy of your current federal tax return (and spouse's, if you file separately) will serve as documentation of income.

Students in this program are responsible for lab fees, books and any other special fees and must meet course prerequisites or have instructor permission to enroll. *60 and Up* registration begins the first day of the term, and students must register in person at the Office of the Registrar, using the *60 and Up* registration form. Students in this program may not register prior to the first week of the quarter or register online using WINGS Express. The office is located in E244 Student Union or the Student Services Office in Dwyer Hall at Lake Campus. All registration changes (including changes in audit or credit status) must be completed by the 5th business day of a ten week quarter.

Students who take classes for credit and who are not eligible for free tuition based on income will not be considered part of the *60 and Up* program and do not need to complete this form. They may therefore register online earlier in the registration period and may wish to consider applying for financial aid. Information is available at <http://www.wright.edu/admissions/finaid/>.
