Student Sponsored Events:

Student organizations were more active than ever in planning 336 events. The office advises event planners and conducts risk reviews for all events. Of the 336 events students there were 7 high level events, 120 medium level events and 209 low level events.

First Weekend/Welcome Week: (August 23 - September 3)

First Weekend and Welcome Week were filled with many opportunities for new students to meet current students and their organizations. New programs included Wright Commitment: Striding in Stilettos. The event is a day of community service for our new and current students to raise funds for the Family Violence Prevention Center. A Semester Kick-Off Picnic started the academic year, which had over 300 students, faculty and staff in attendance.



Do the U: (August 24)

The Office of Student Activities' annual student organization fair for all new students was held in the Student Union. There were 69 student organization displays and over 1500 students in attendance. Billy Donolon, Head Men's Basketball Coach, emceed and introduced various entertainment acts.

Fall Fest: (August 29)

The University Activities Board hosted Fall Fest on the North Lawn for the entire Wright State Community. There were 135 student organizations, departments, colleges, and local Dayton vendors that participated in the event. There were over 2500 students who attended the event.

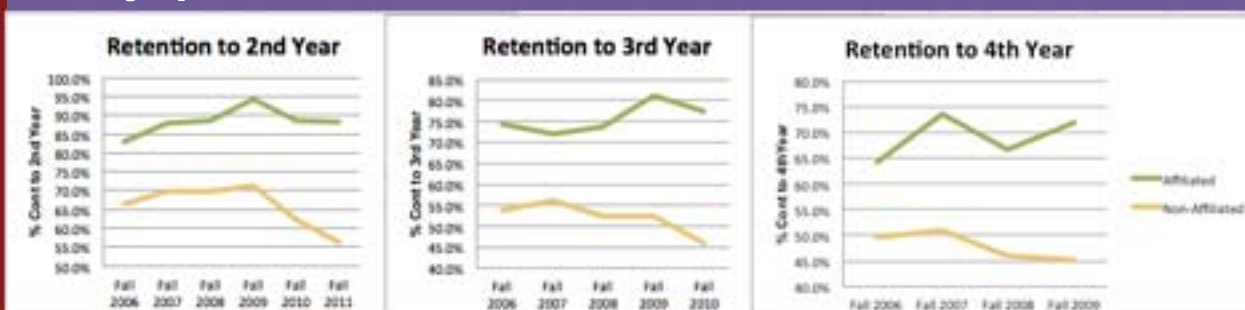

Retention and Graduation Rates:

This year presented a first-time opportunity to compare retention and graduation information between members of the fraternity and sorority community to the rest of their cohort group. The chart below shows how fraternity and sorority affiliated members (green lines) outpaced their cohort members (yellow lines) in retention and graduation numbers.

Community Service and Philanthropy: The fraternity and sorority community raised approximately \$30,000 for their philanthropy partners and participated in 5,240 hours of community service. A total of 32 community organizations were served. The entire community joined forces to raise money for Ally's Army, a local foundation to support families with children suffering from Leukemia and Lymphoma.

Workshops: During the year, workshops included a three hour new member education program with presentations on alcohol awareness based on “The Sam Spady Story”; the annual observance of National Hazing Prevention Week; 19 members of the community attended the Association of Fraternity Leadership and Values National Conference



in Indianapolis; and two members of our fraternity community received scholarships to attend the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute in Bloomington, Indiana.

Adding and Growing: This year the fraternity community welcomed a colony of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, a men’s group focused on music majors and music enthusiasts. We also welcomed back the gentlemen of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. The sorority community celebrated the chartering of the Alpha Zeta chapter of Phi Sigma Rho Sorority on April 14 th and the return of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. to campus. A record number of women participated in formal sorority recruitment . For the first time in 7 years, all of the sororities reached quota and total. During the spring semester, the community grew to the largest number of members in the last 5 years.

There were many successes this year with efforts to enhance the campus environment for Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning, and Ally (GLBTQA) individuals. Partners with the office include: the Women's Center, Counseling & Wellness, Rainbow Alliance, Allies: The Organization for GLBTQA Faculty & Staff, Career Services, and the President's Office. Many community organizations also collaborated with these organizations. Here are some of the highlights:

Safe Space and Panel Program:

The Safe Space and Panel Program celebrated its 5th year as a campus-wide program and its 10th year since originally presented by Rainbow Alliance. The year started with a revitalized curriculum and continued to be presented in 13 campus forums. The program has exceeded 501 pledges signed by participants of the program.

GLBTQA Resource Room:

The Resource Room celebrated its 2nd anniversary this year with continued efforts to provide a safe space for students, faculty & staff. Many were able to host meetings, conduct small gatherings, and use the extensive library of over 400 books and DVDs. Nineteen volunteers served over 600 hours to keep the room in operation.



GLBTQA Careers:

Out For Work, and organization for diversity change, awarded Career Services a Gold Certificate through their Career Center Certification Program, designed to enhance lesbian, gay, bisexual transgender, and queer specific resources in academic career centers across the United States. Through a collaborative partnership between Student Activities, Career Services, and Rainbow Alliance, Riley Folds, founder of Out for Work, presented on campus to speak with students about strategies for the workplace.

Fall & Spring Leadership Series:

Guest presenters from around the campus taught students leadership principles based on the designated learning outcomes of the office.

OrgSync:

The office celebrated its 4th year using the OrgSync as an organization management tool for student organizations. The software allows for continuous improvement in information sharing and delivery of services. This year saw several significant improvements including a single sign on for users. Students can now use their WSU User ID and login to access their organization information. Time was also spent improving forms and assuring that all forms were accessible online.



Voter Registration:

Being a Presidential election year, many student groups were interested in getting their peers registered to vote. The office collaborated with Student Support Services to develop a new training session for student organizations on voter registration. Organizational Spotlight: 4 Paws WSU:

WSU's 4 Paws has been on campus since fall quarter 2011. As of spring semester 2013 the organization fostered 45 service dogs in-training for the local non-profit, 4 Paws for Ability. The dogs that are fostered have a 75% better chance of completing the training program than dogs raised by the 4 Paws for Ability staff at their location. Dogs from WSU have gone as far as Japan, California, Indiana, Texas, and Arizona. One child, who is in a wheelchair and speaks with the assistance of a computer, had repeatedly asked his parents for a dog. They declined until one day the father asked him why he wanted a dog so badly. The little boy replied, "I want a best friend." The students find working with 4 Paws rewarding because they know that the dog they are fostering may be the reason a parent can finally have a night's rest without worrying if their child will have a life threatening seizure while sleeping. To date, there have been 142 students involved with 4 Paws.

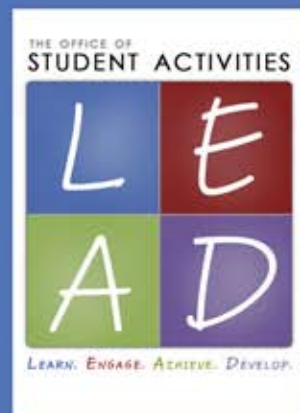

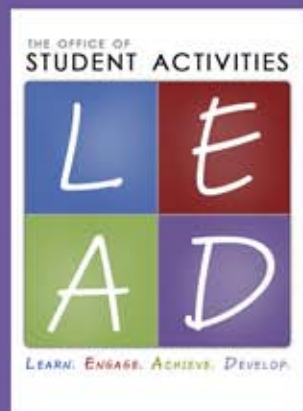

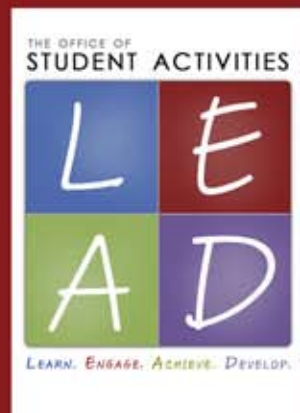
