Resolution 18-6: A Resolution in Support of a POW-MIA Chair of Honor at the Nutter Center

- **WHEREAS**, Since World War One, over 92,000 American Servicemen are unaccounted for in armed conflicts; and
- **WHEREAS,** POW is defined as a Prisoner of War taken captive by an opposing force, and MIA is defined as an individual who has gone Missing in Action in the line of duty; and
- WHEREAS, A Chair of Honor remains vacant in honor of all American Servicemen who are unaccounted for
- **WHEREAS**, Numerous stadiums around the nation have installed POW-MIA Chairs of Honor, including Ohio Stadium in Columbus and Great American Ballpark in Cincinnati; and
- **WHEREAS**, Approximately 1,000 students at Wright State University are current or former members of the United States armed forces; and
- WHEREAS, Wright State University Veteran and Military Center mission statement reads "To make Wright State University an environment where veterans and military-connected students feel like they belong;" now, therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED,** That the Student Government here assembled at Wright State University supports the proposal to install a POW-MIA Chair of Honor at the Wright State University Nutter Center.
