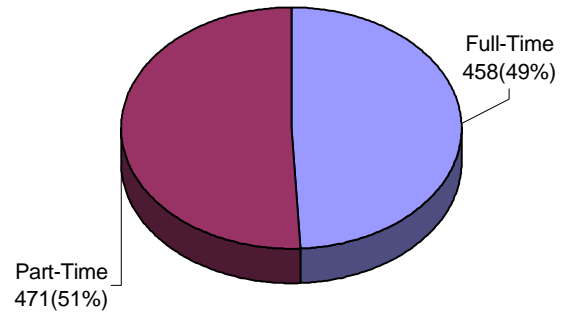

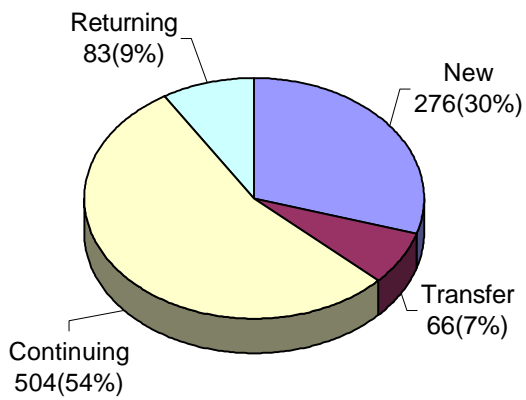

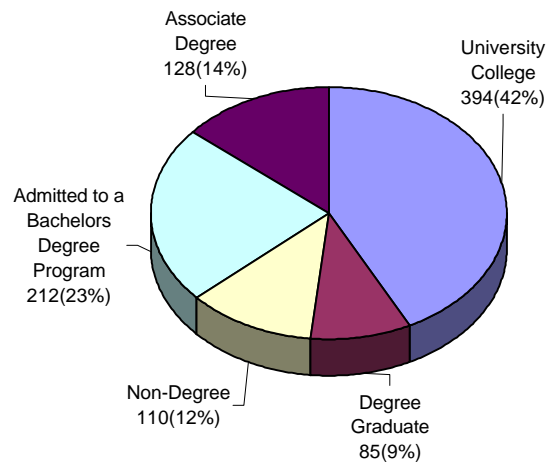

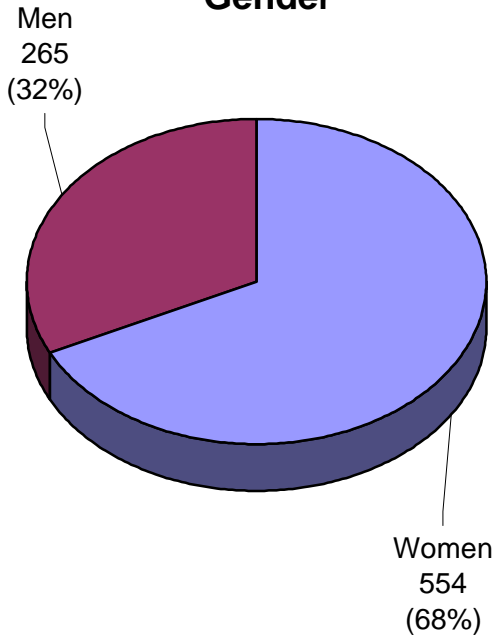

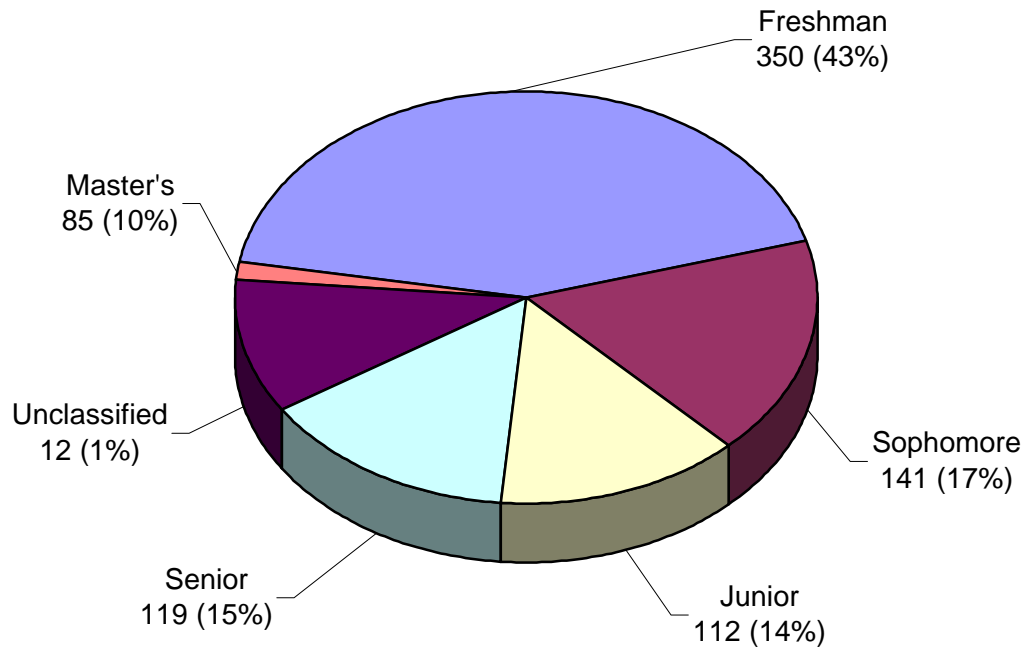

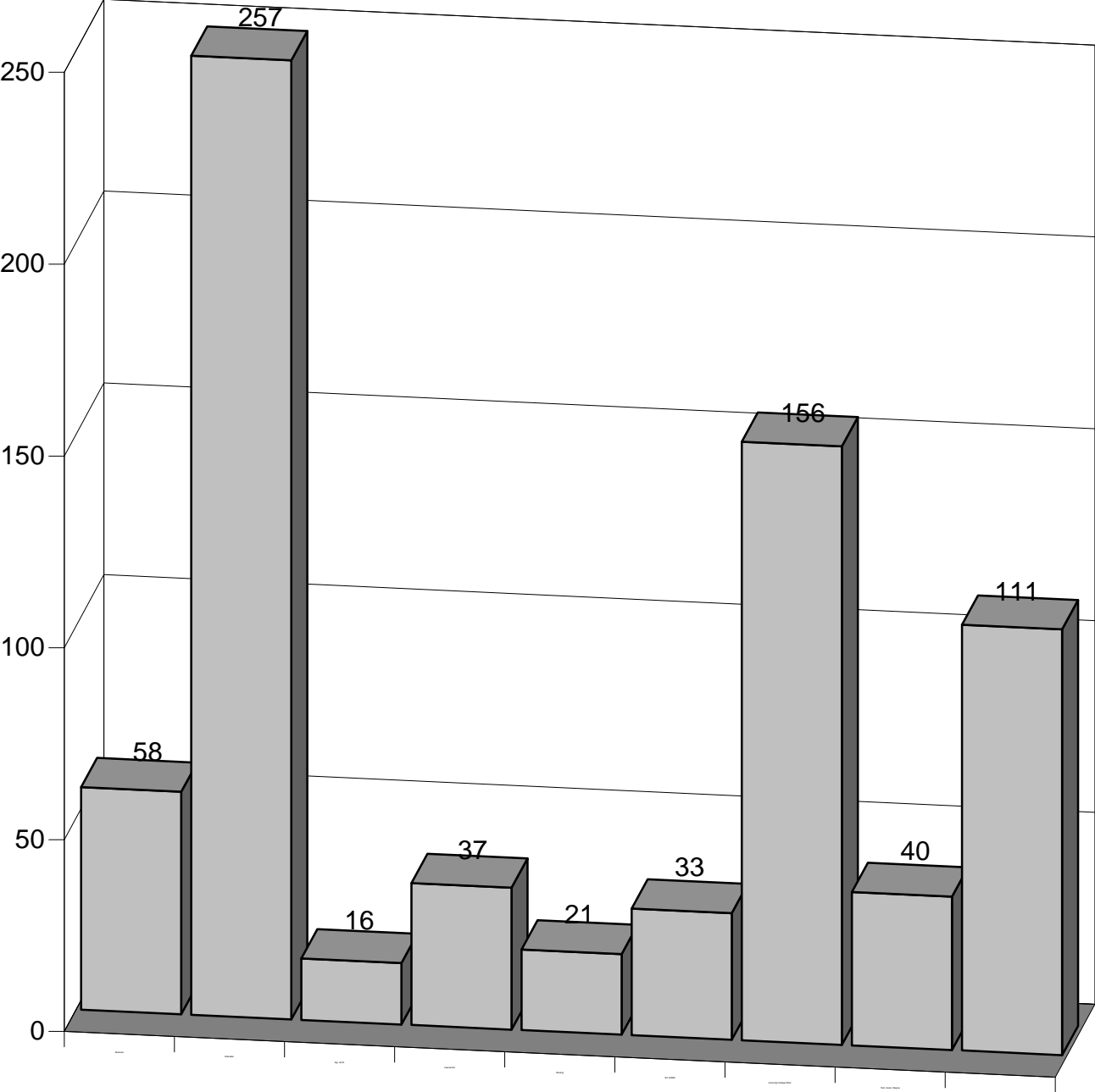

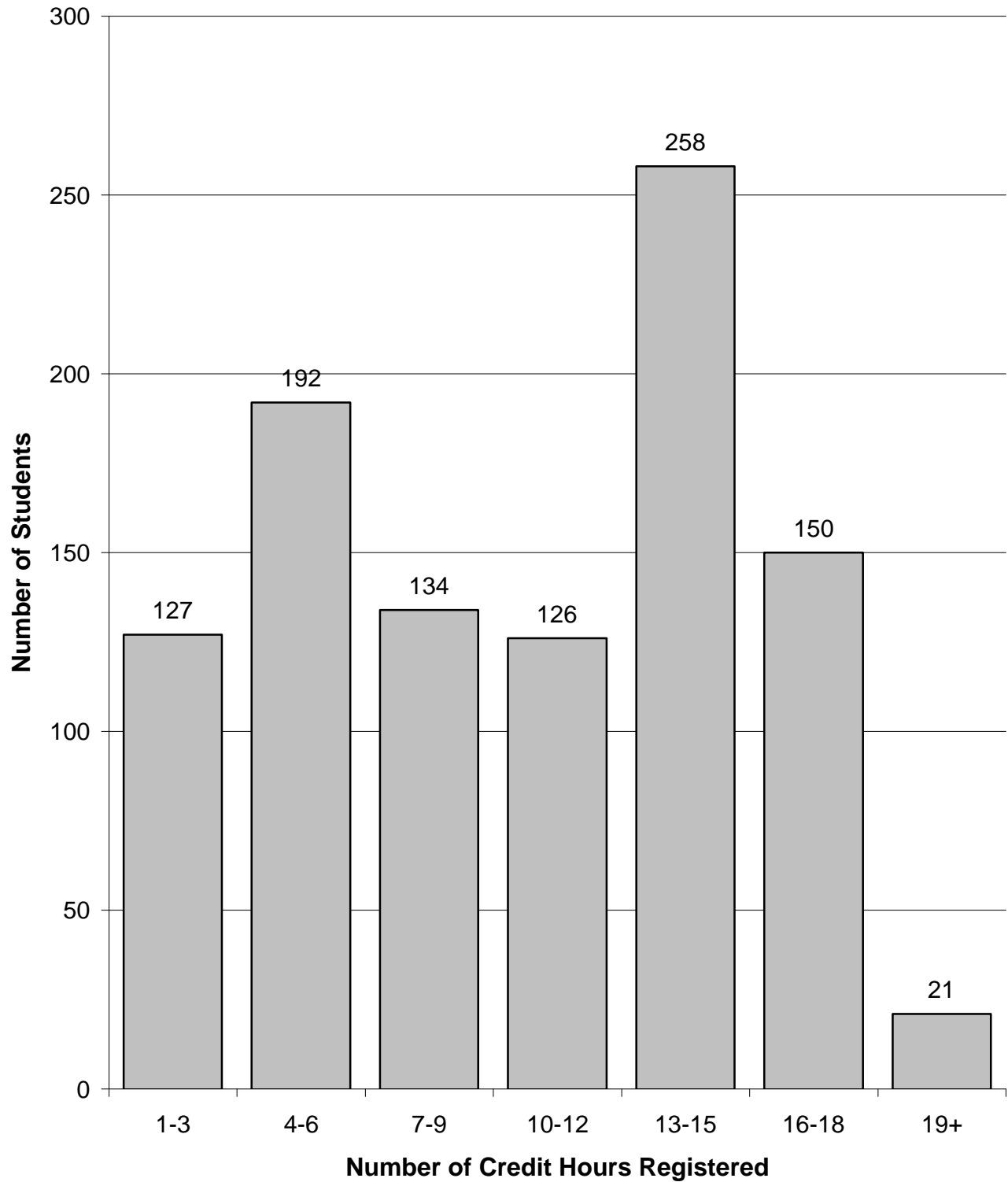

## Credit Hours Registered



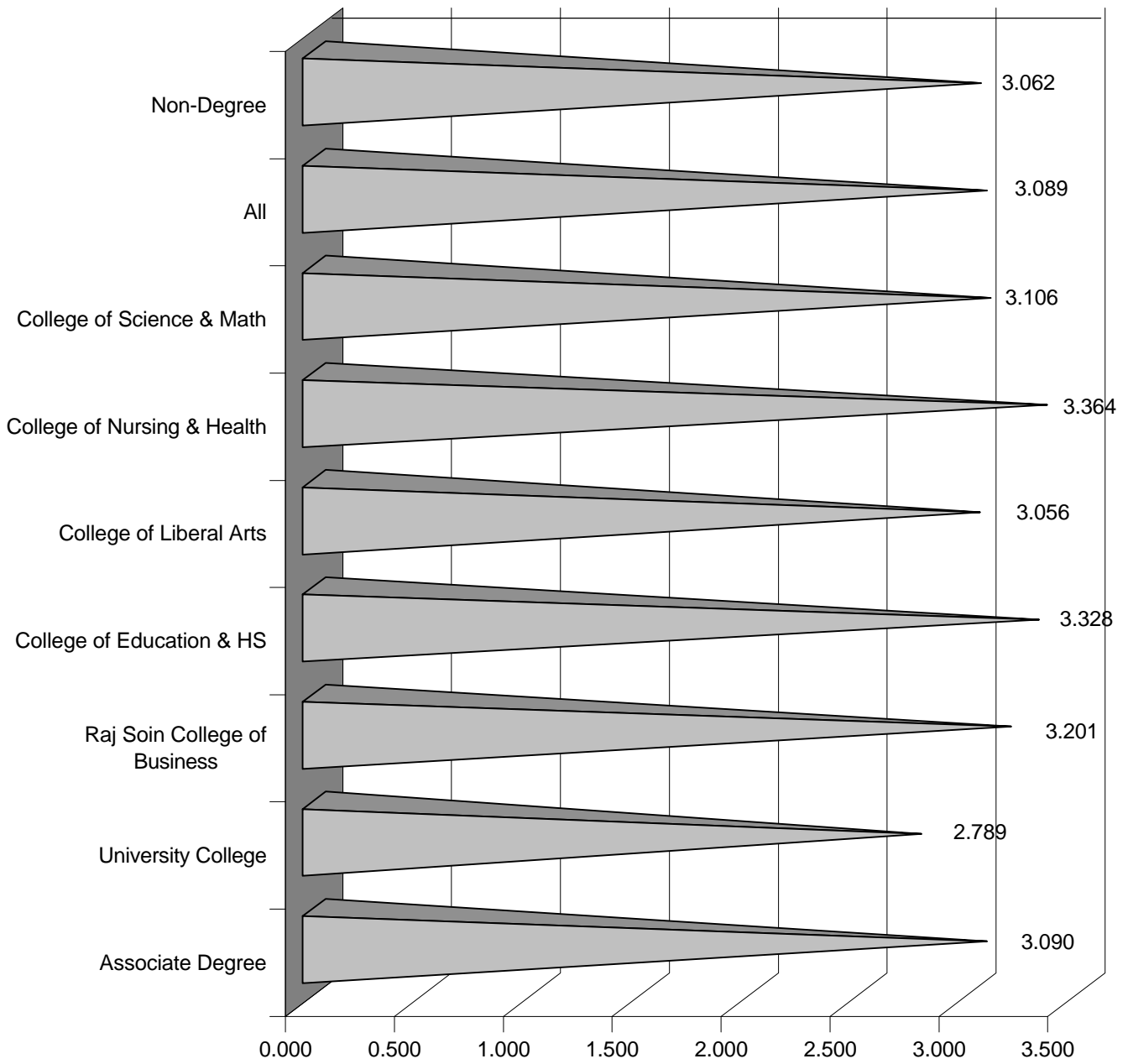
