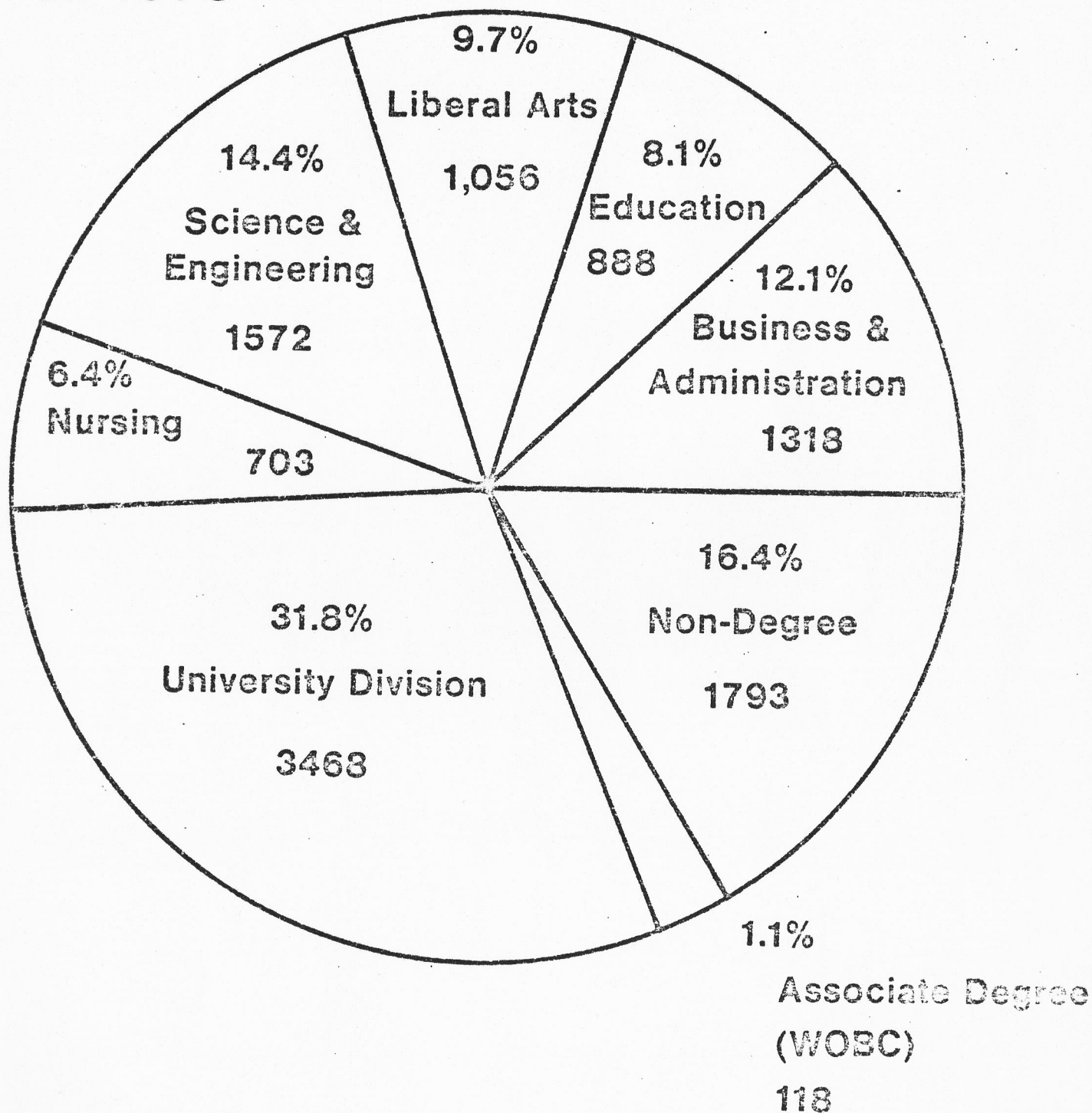

Wright State University Undergraduate by College Fall 1978



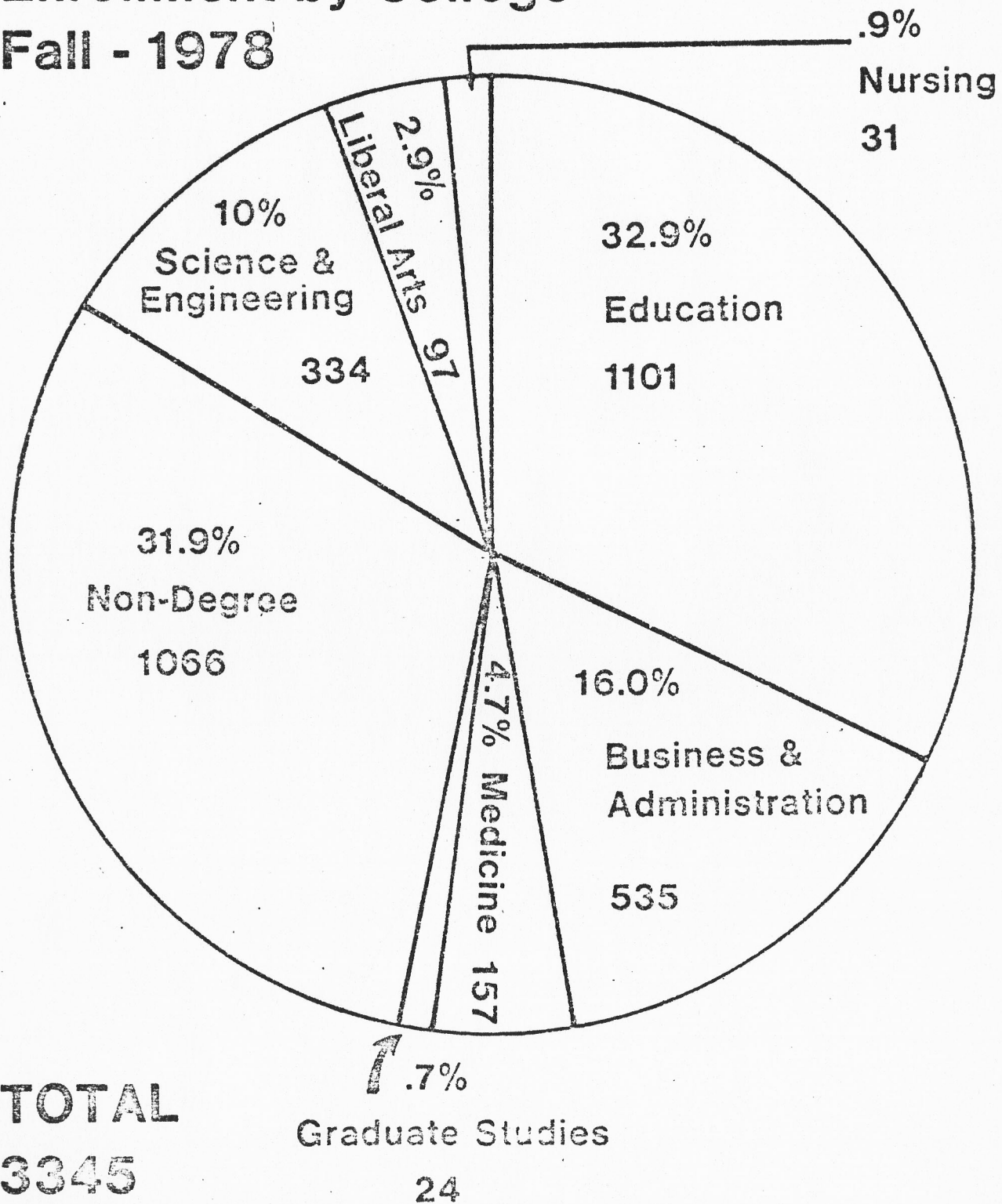

Enrollment by College

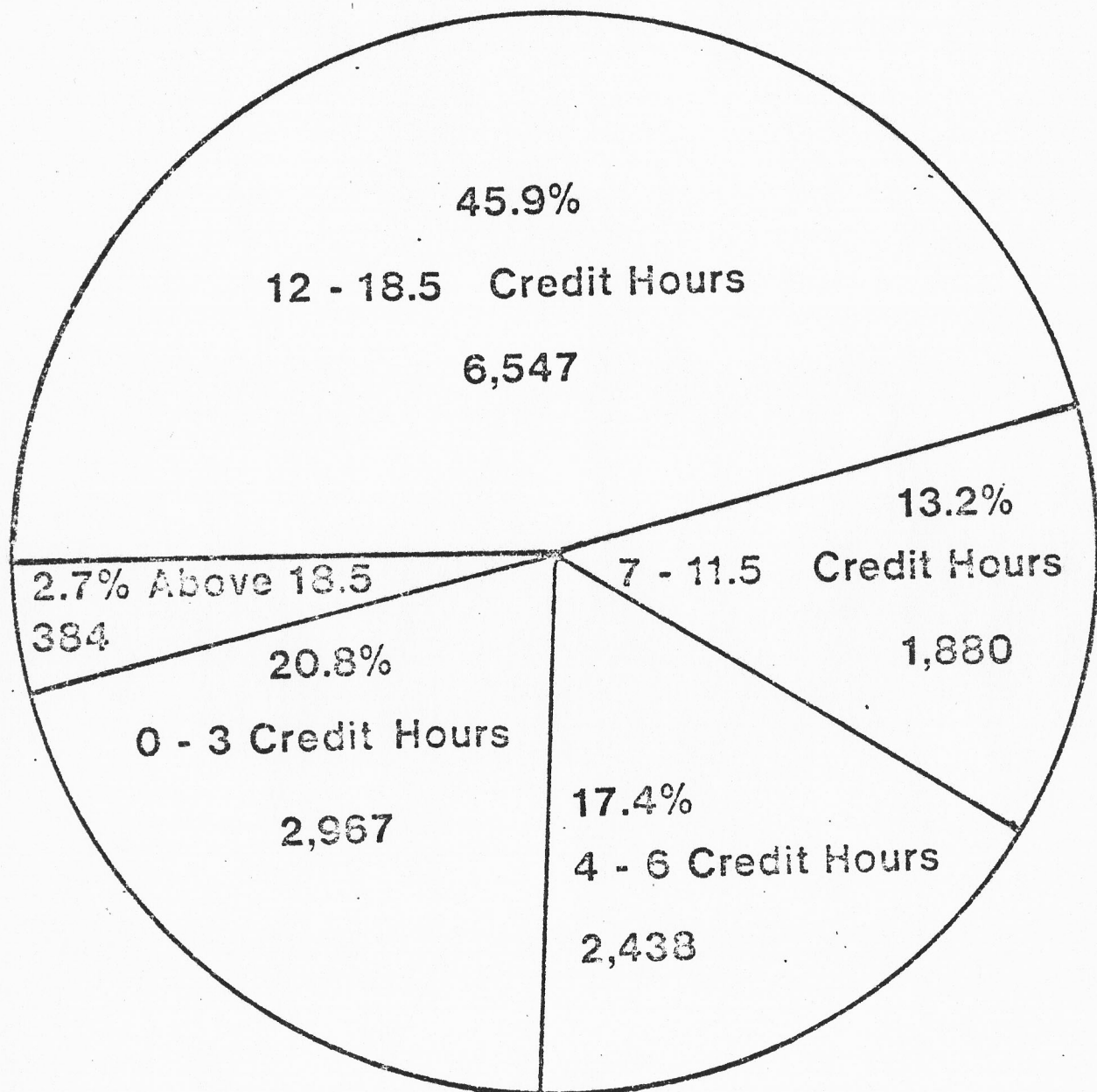
Fall - 1978

EXPANDED HORIZONS

Expanded Horizons for Women is a program for women who have been away from school for a long time. The program is designed to offer support and to minimize the problems of transition into college life.

The Women in the Expanded Horizons program range from 24-65 years old. They are married, single, widowed, divorced. Many have children and while some are homemakers, a large number are working outside of the home. Most see the program as a stepping-stone to change - in their personal growth and/or career endeavors.

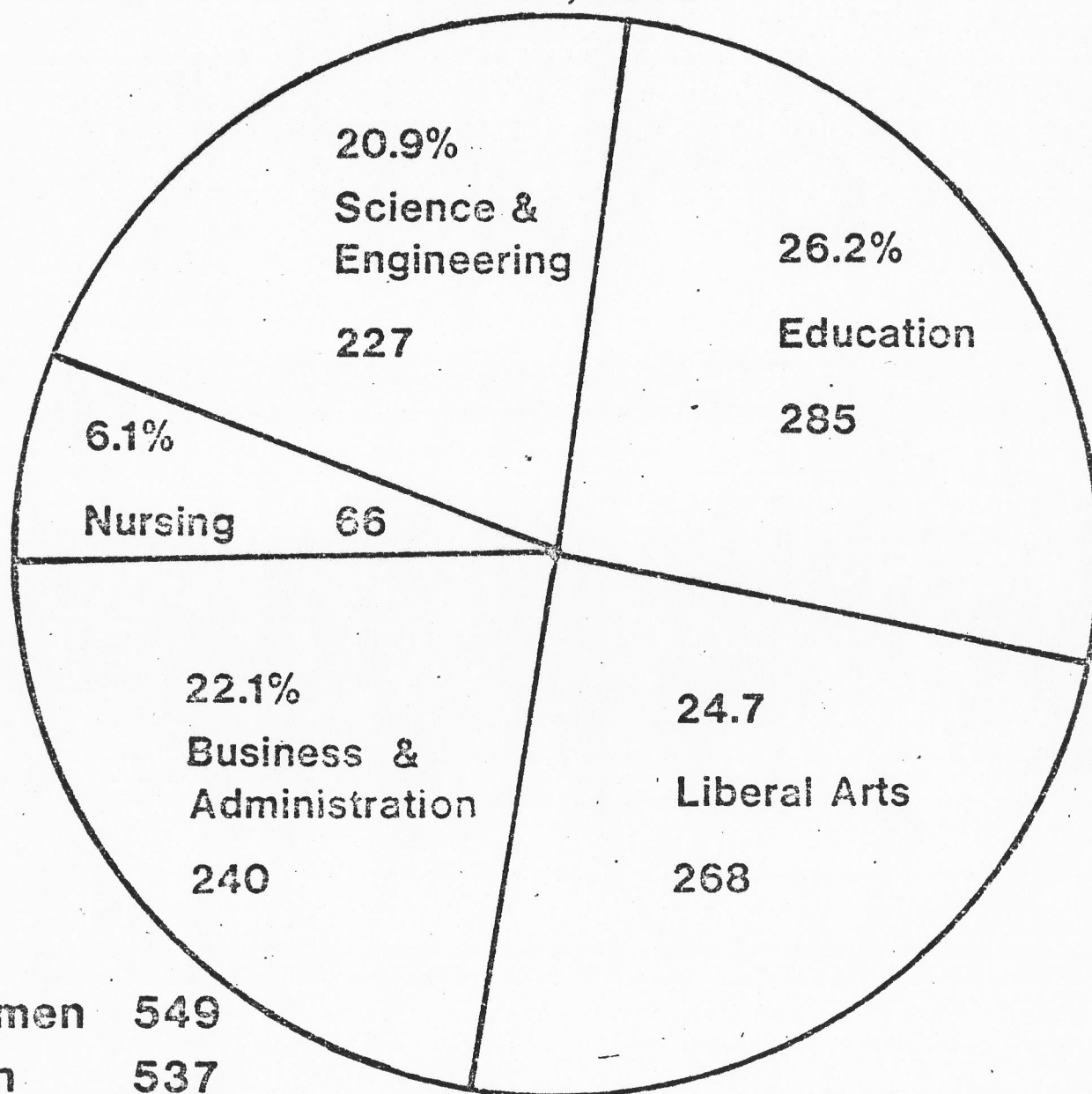

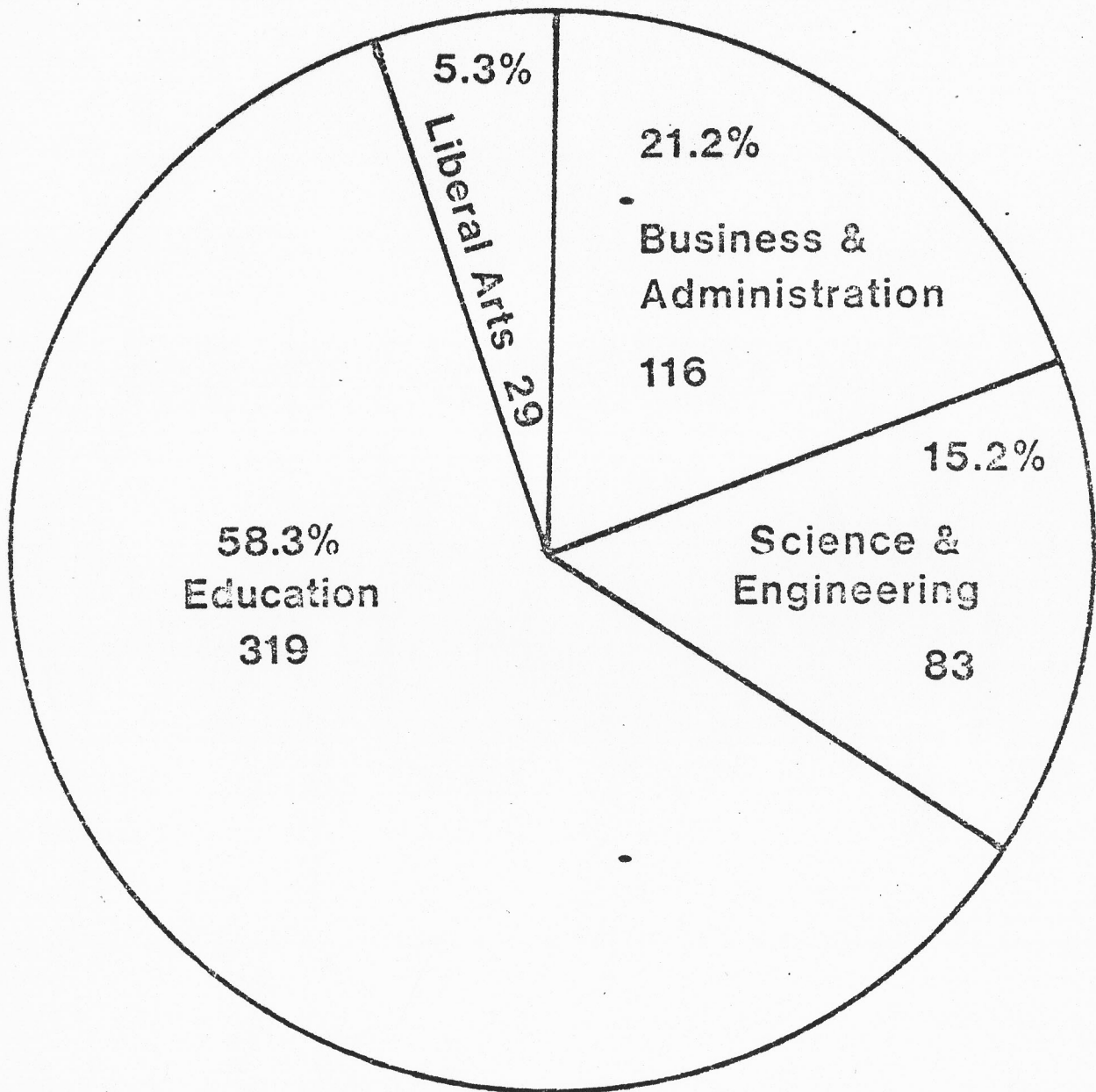
