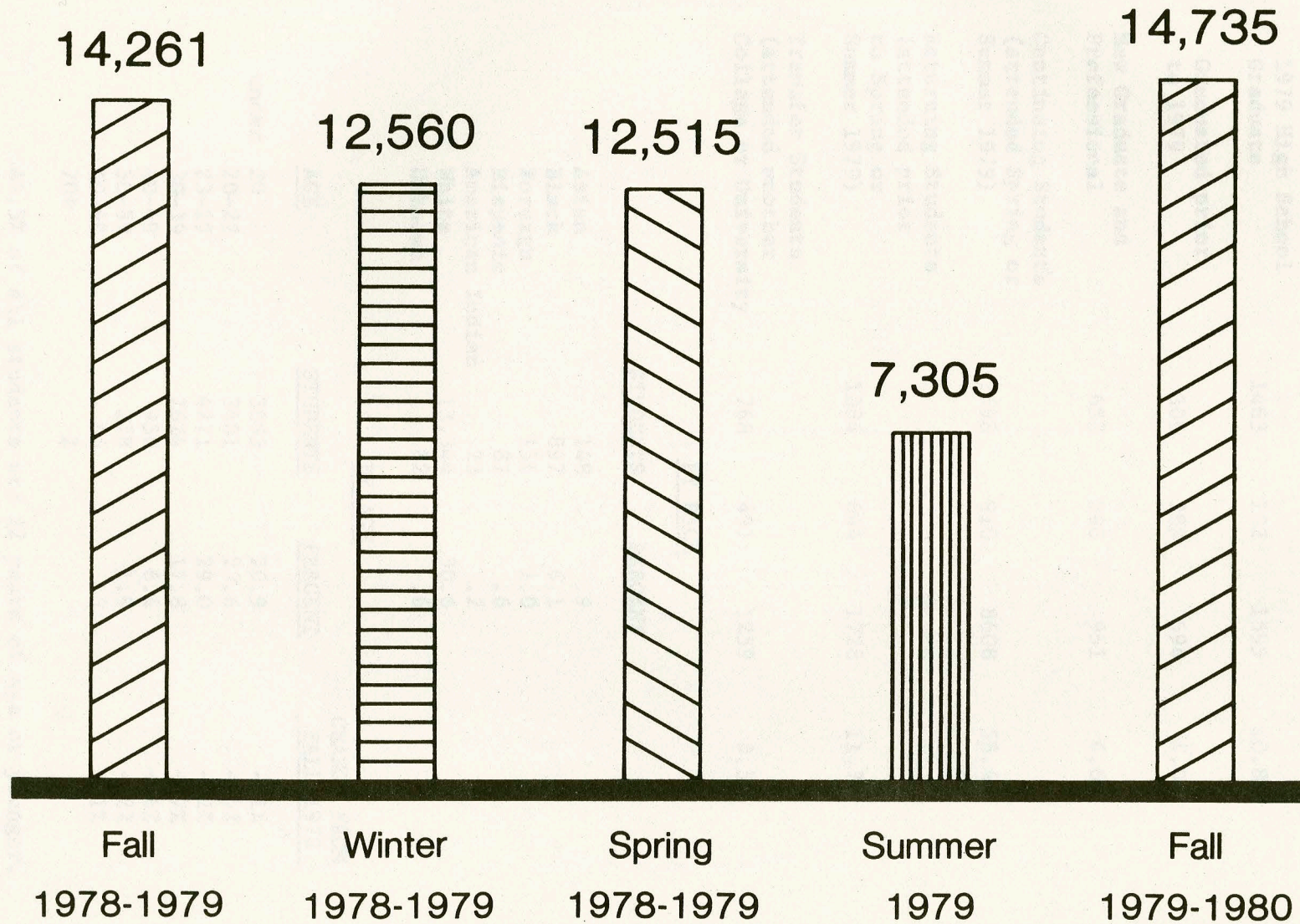

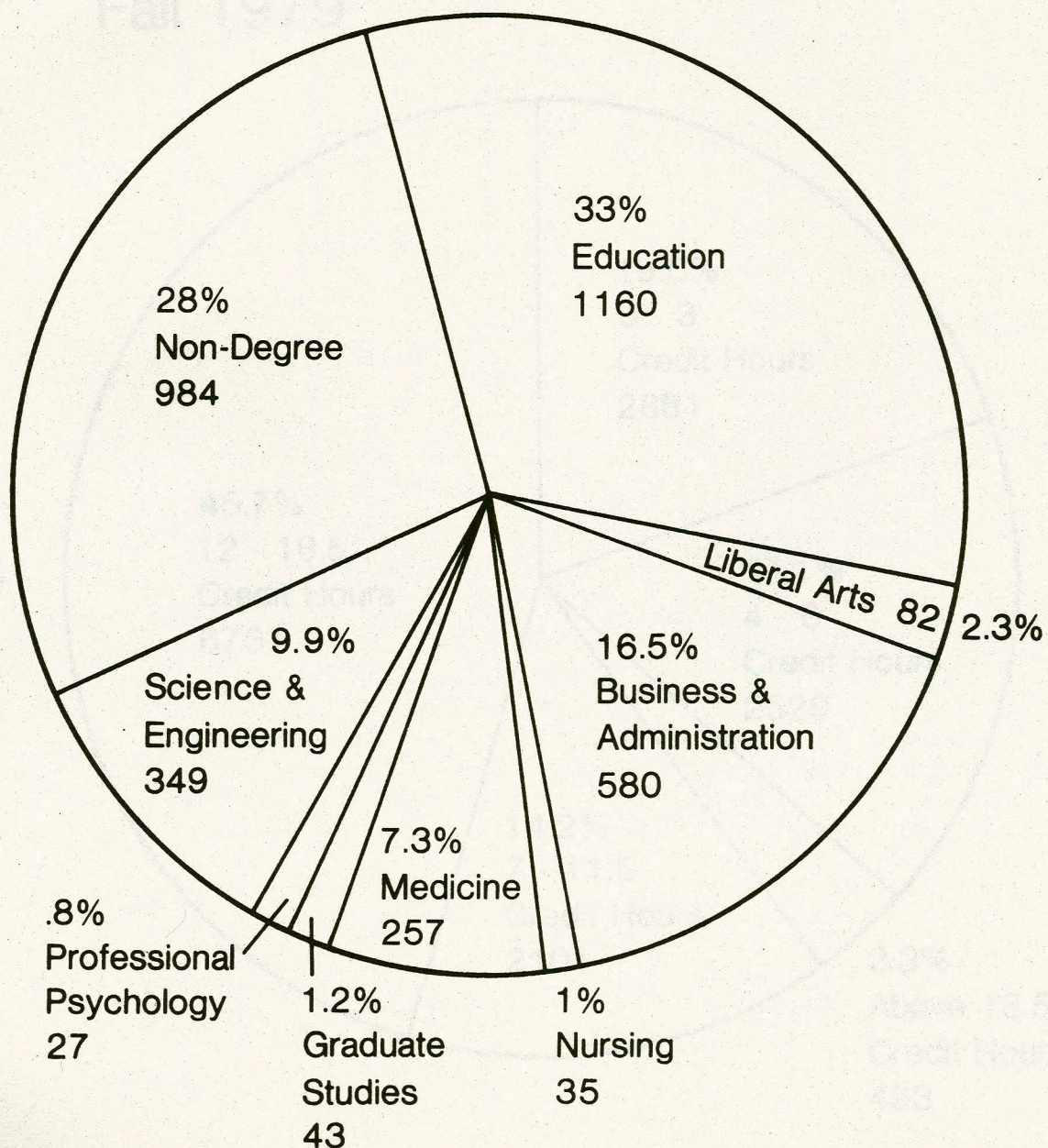

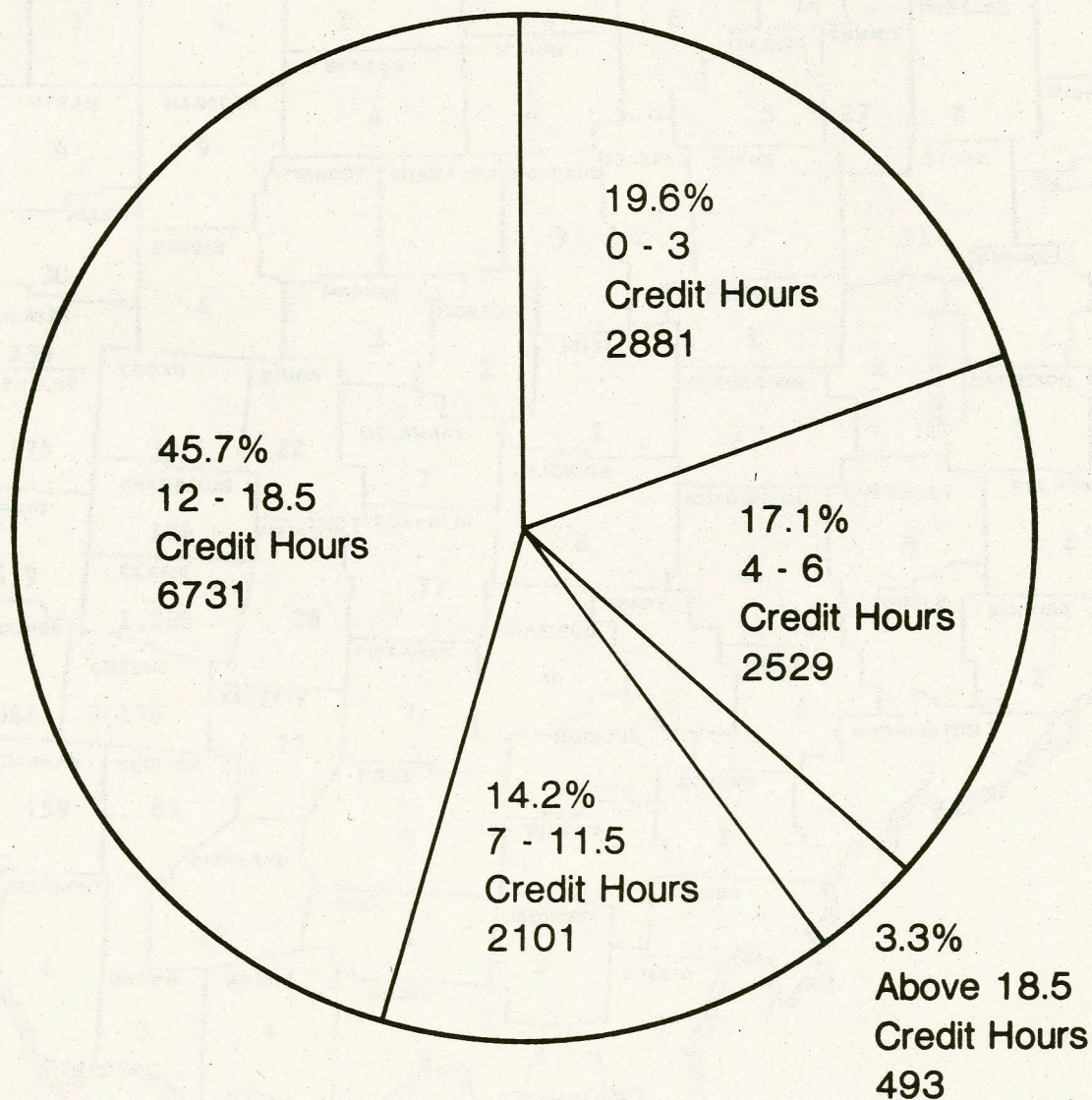

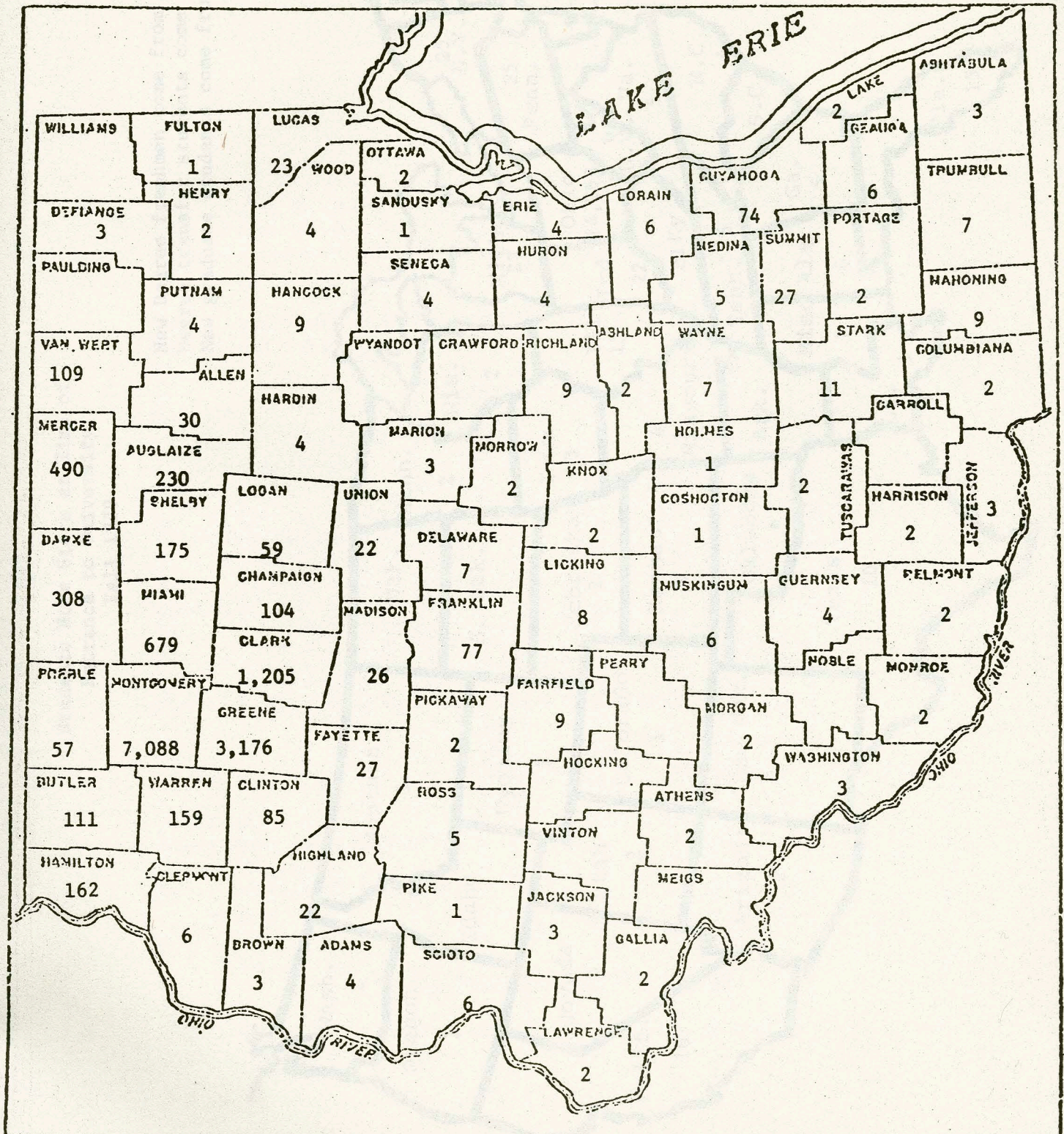

All Students

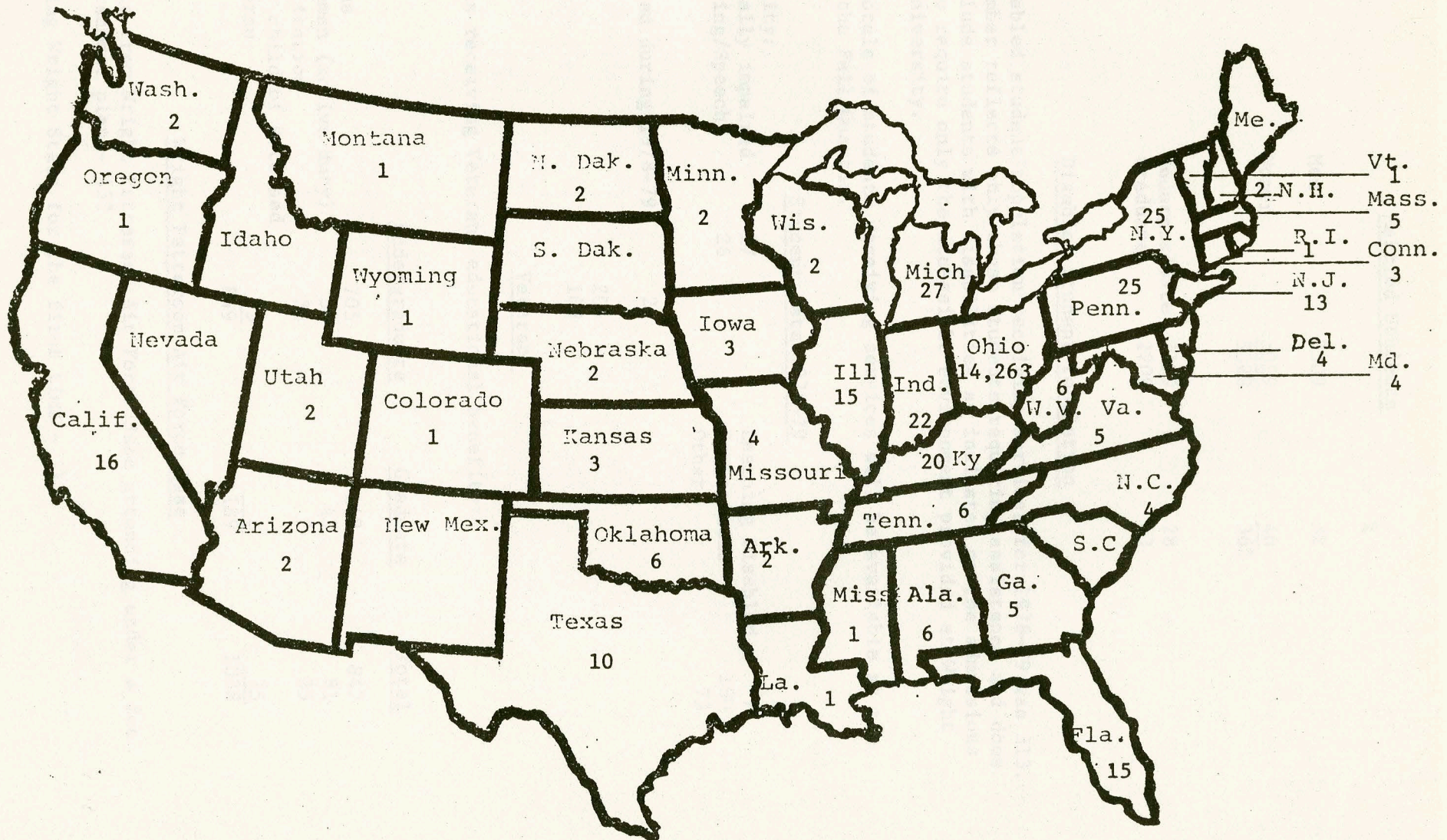

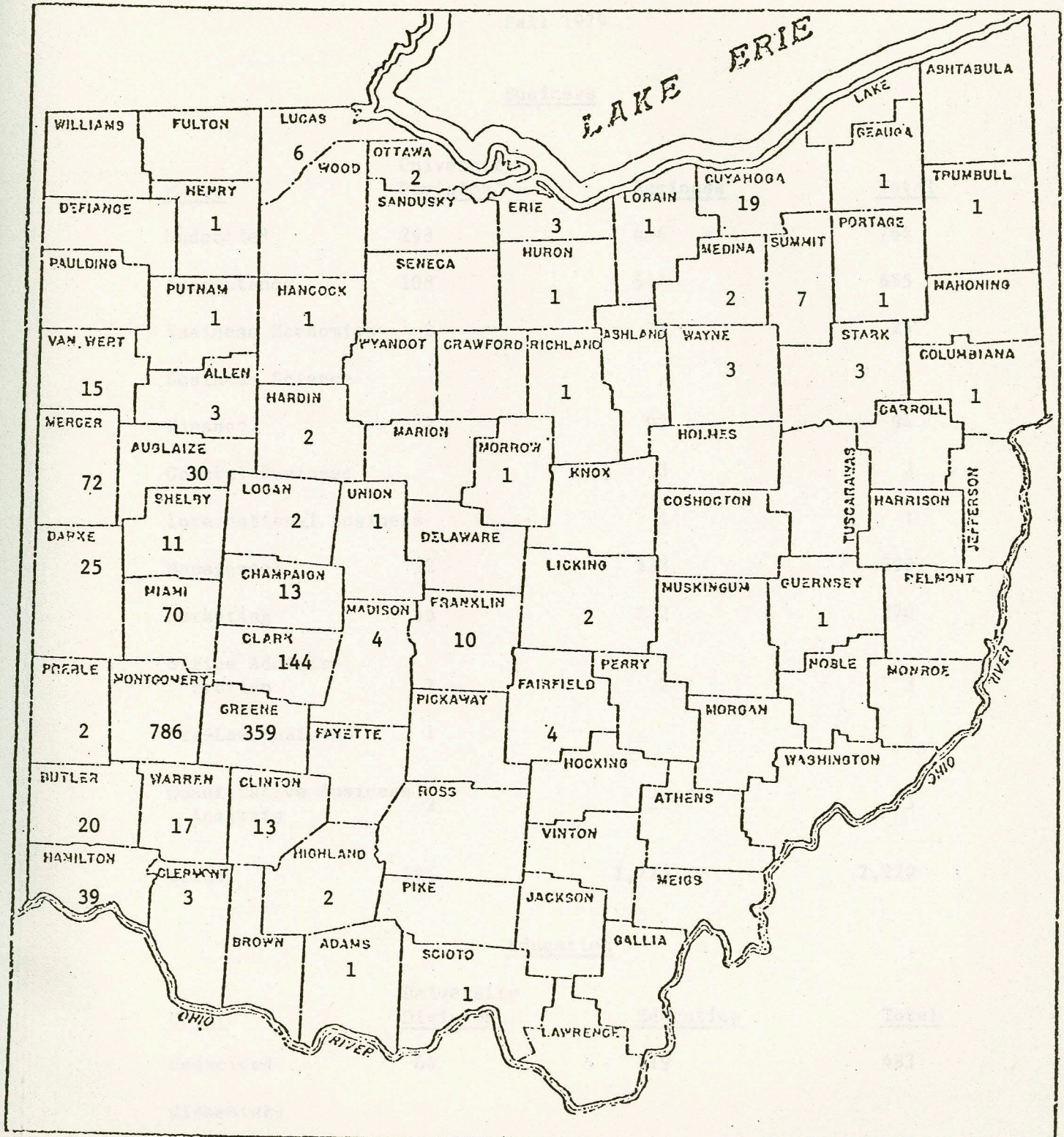

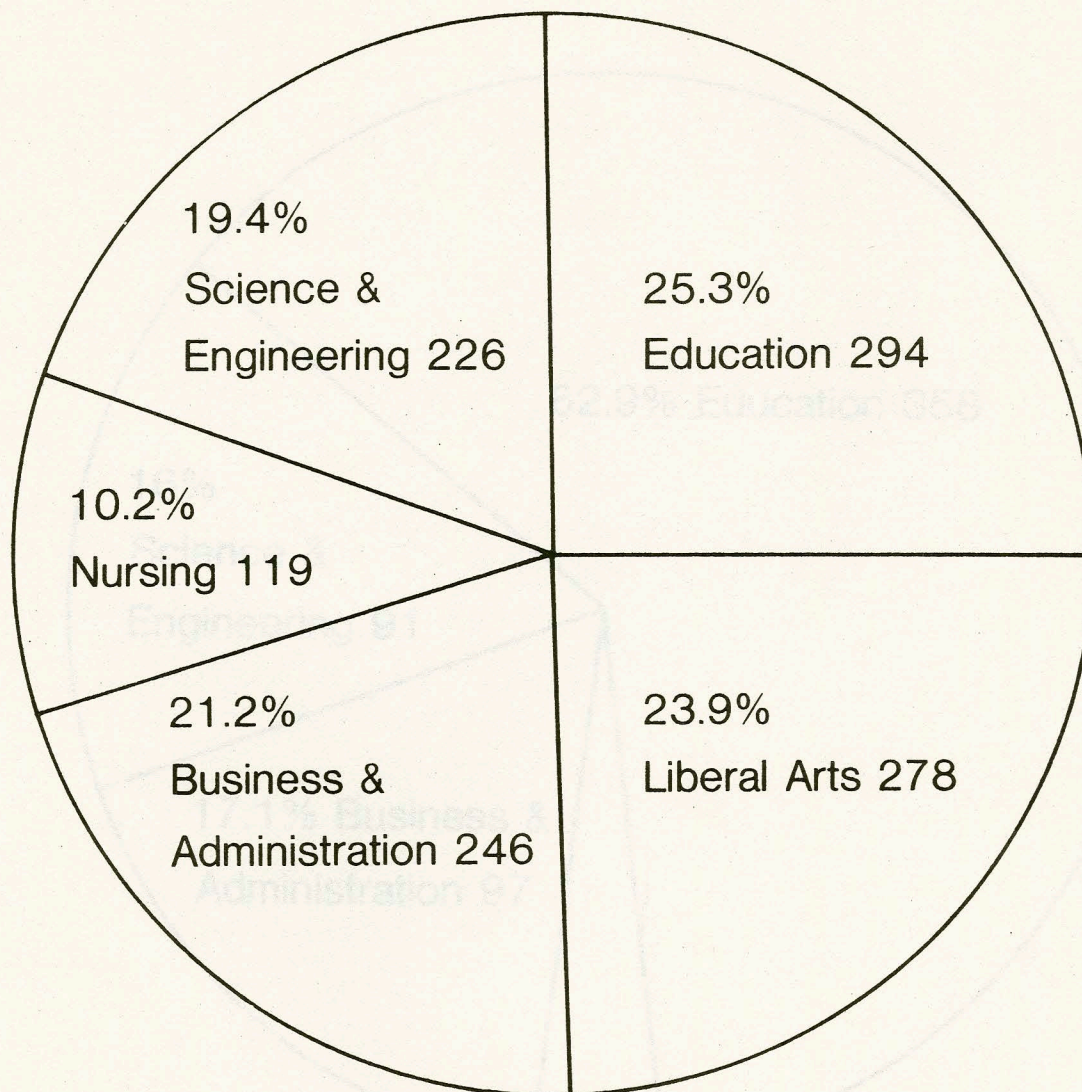

July 1, 1978 - June 30, 1979



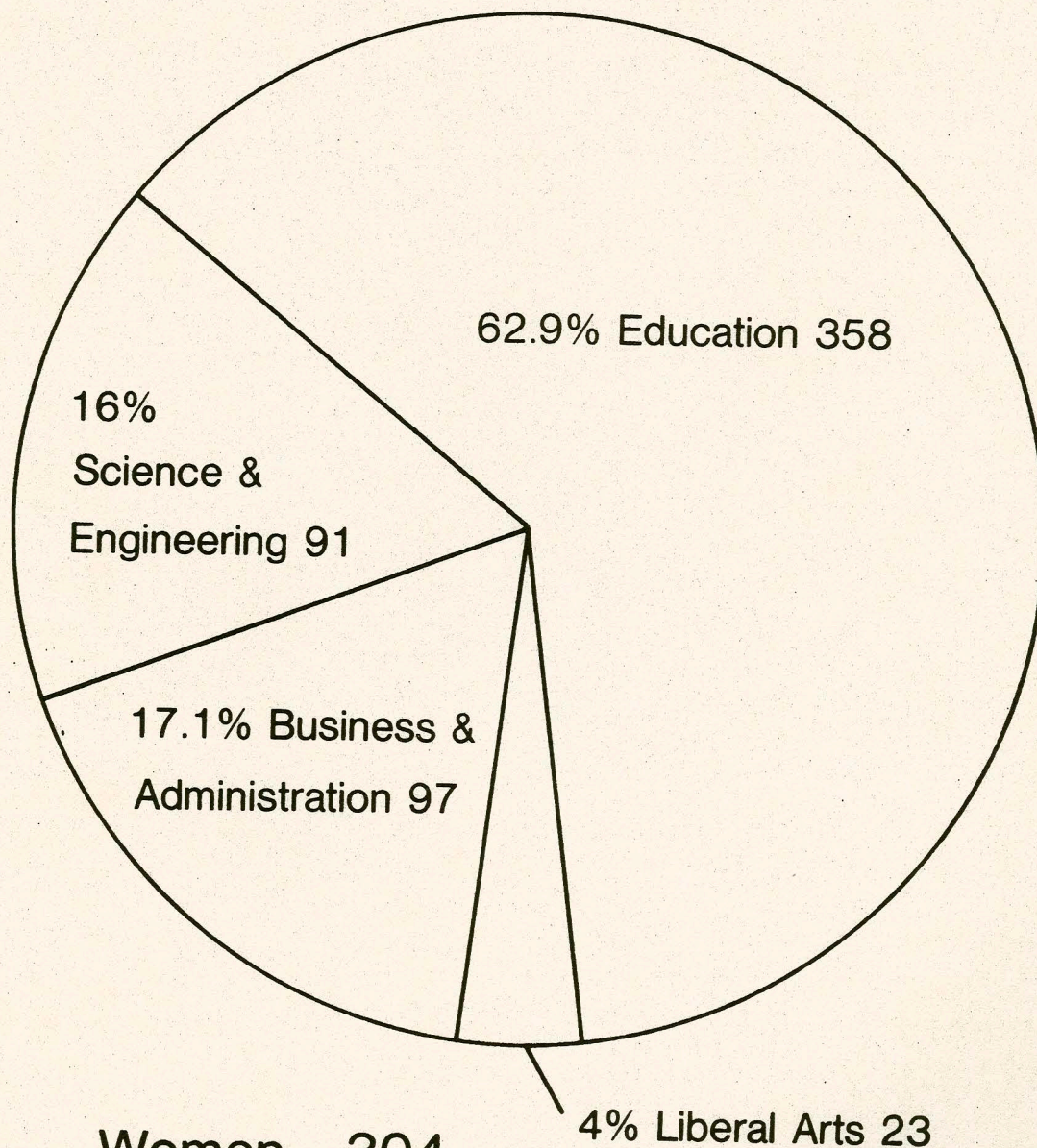
