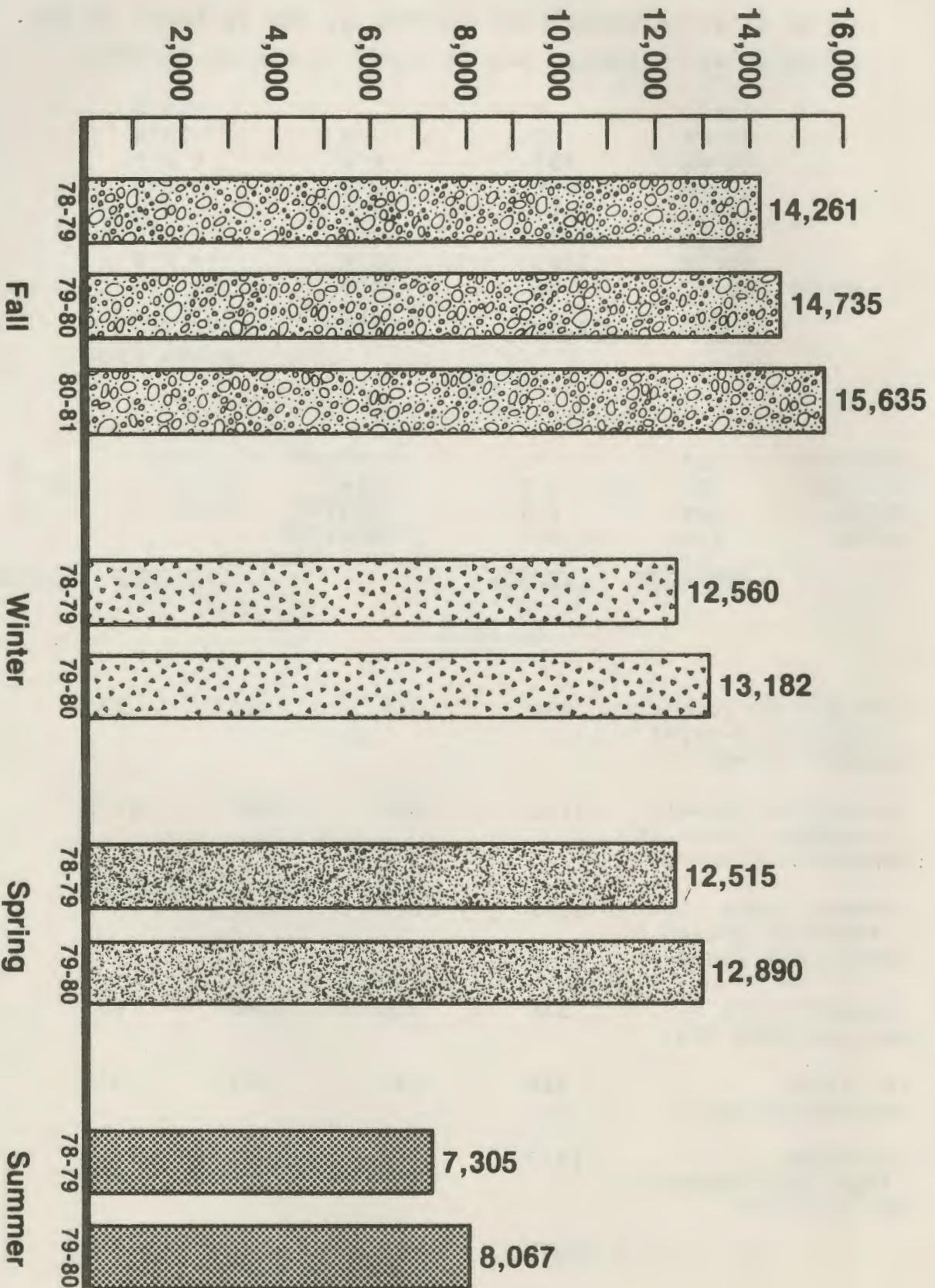

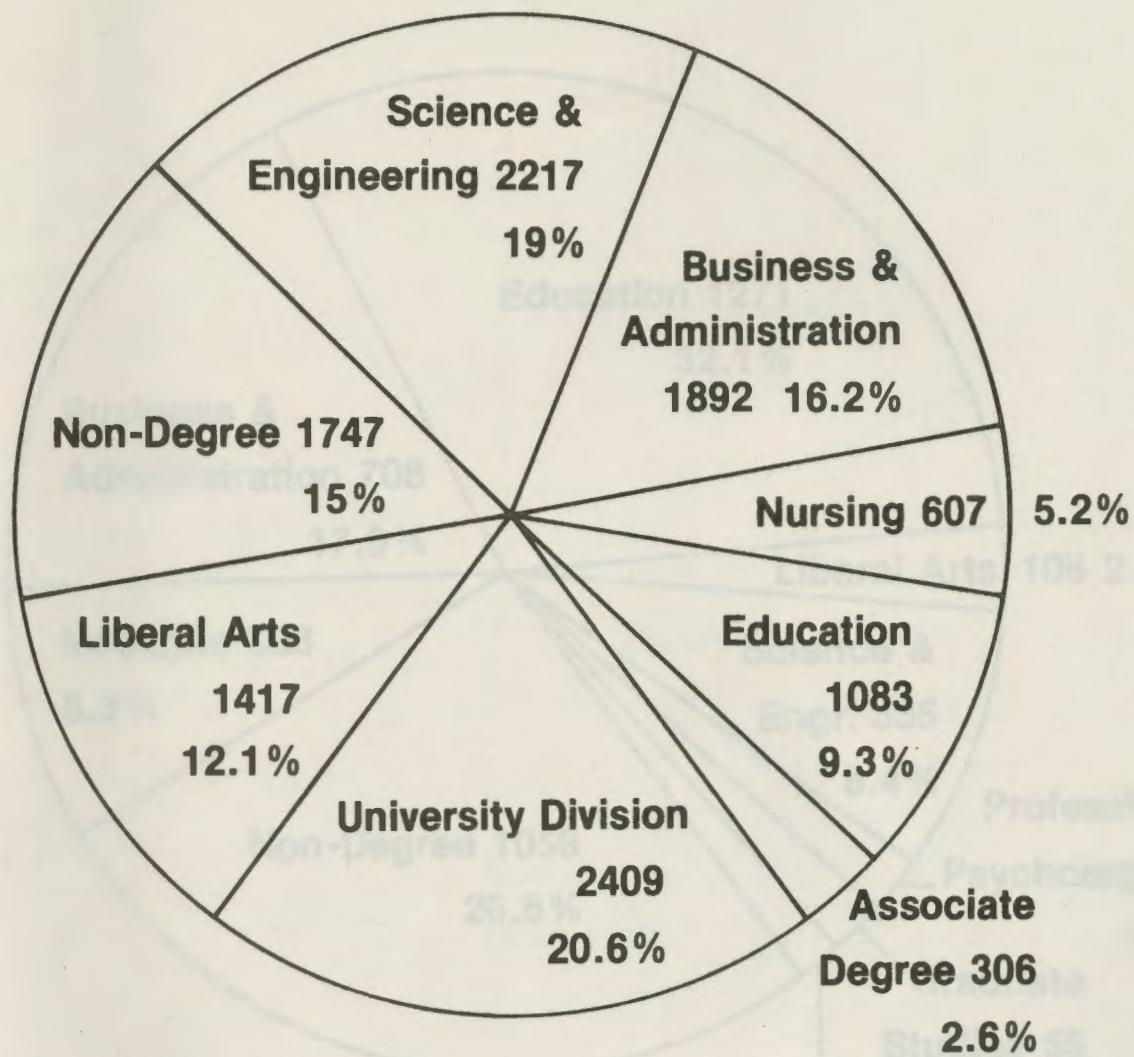

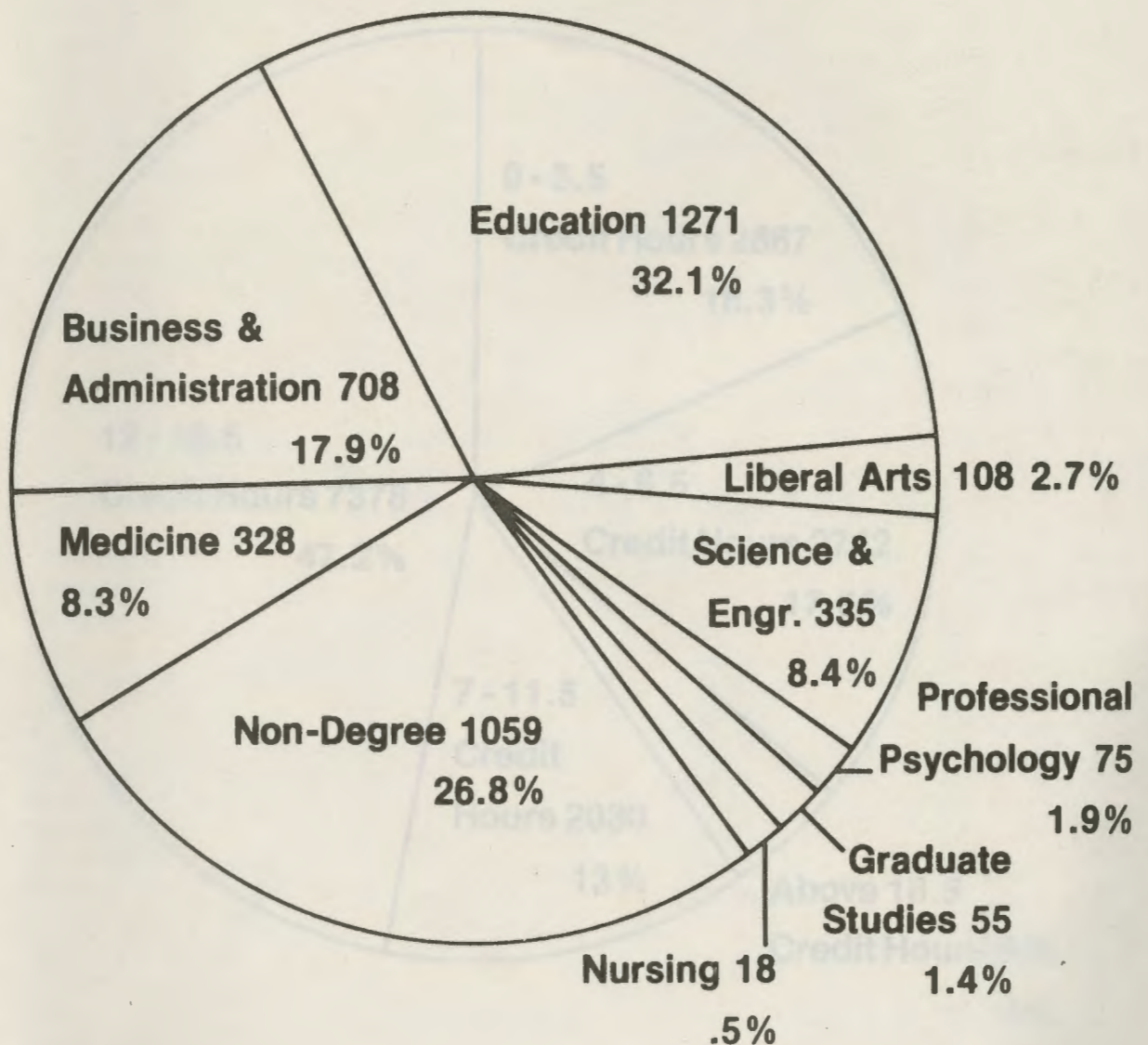
Undergraduate by College/School

Wright State University Graduate and Professional Enrollment by College/School Fall 1980

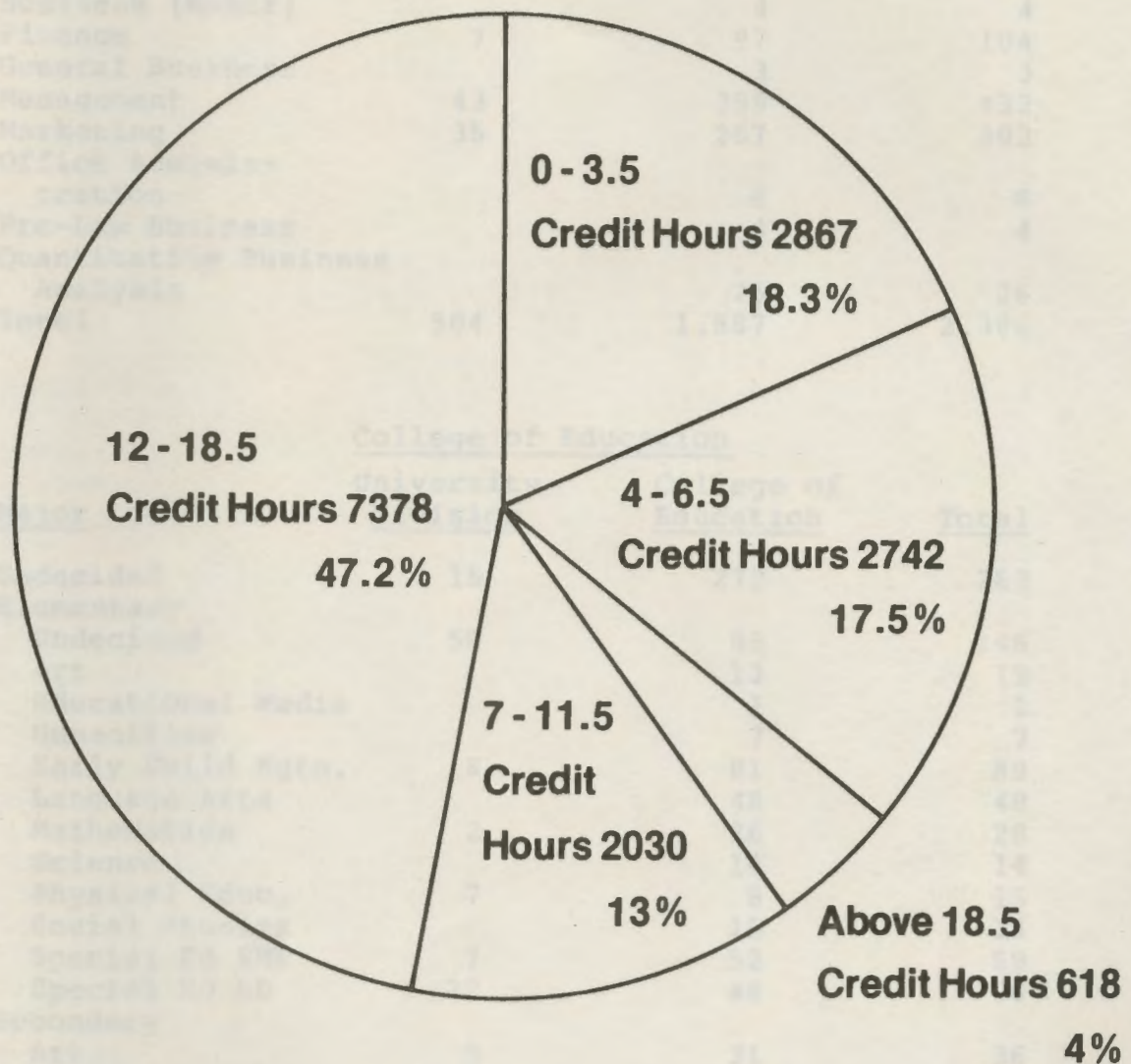

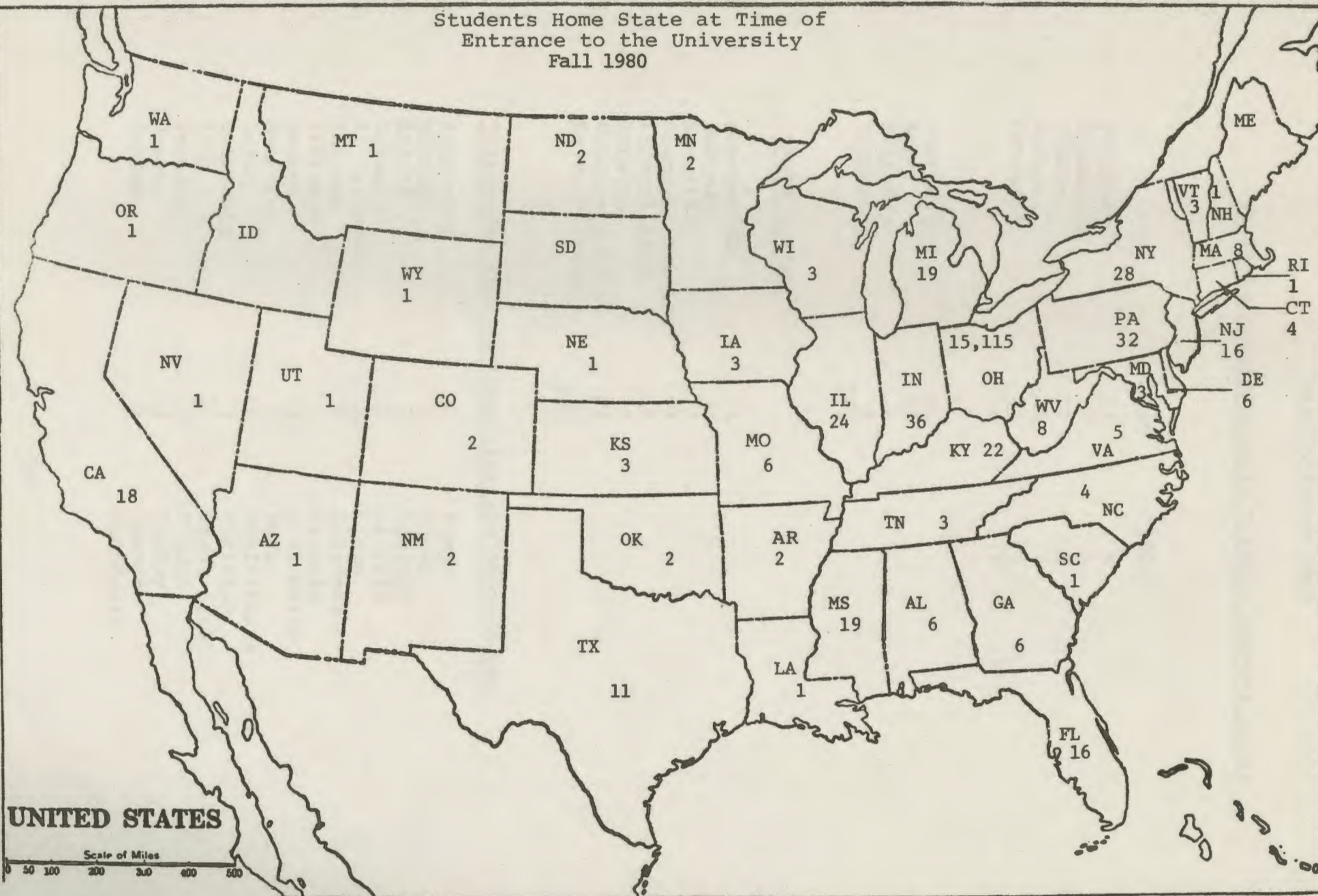

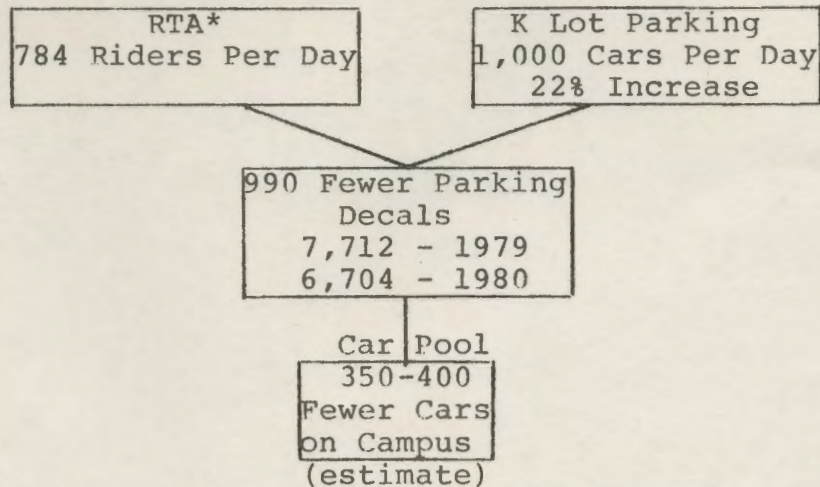

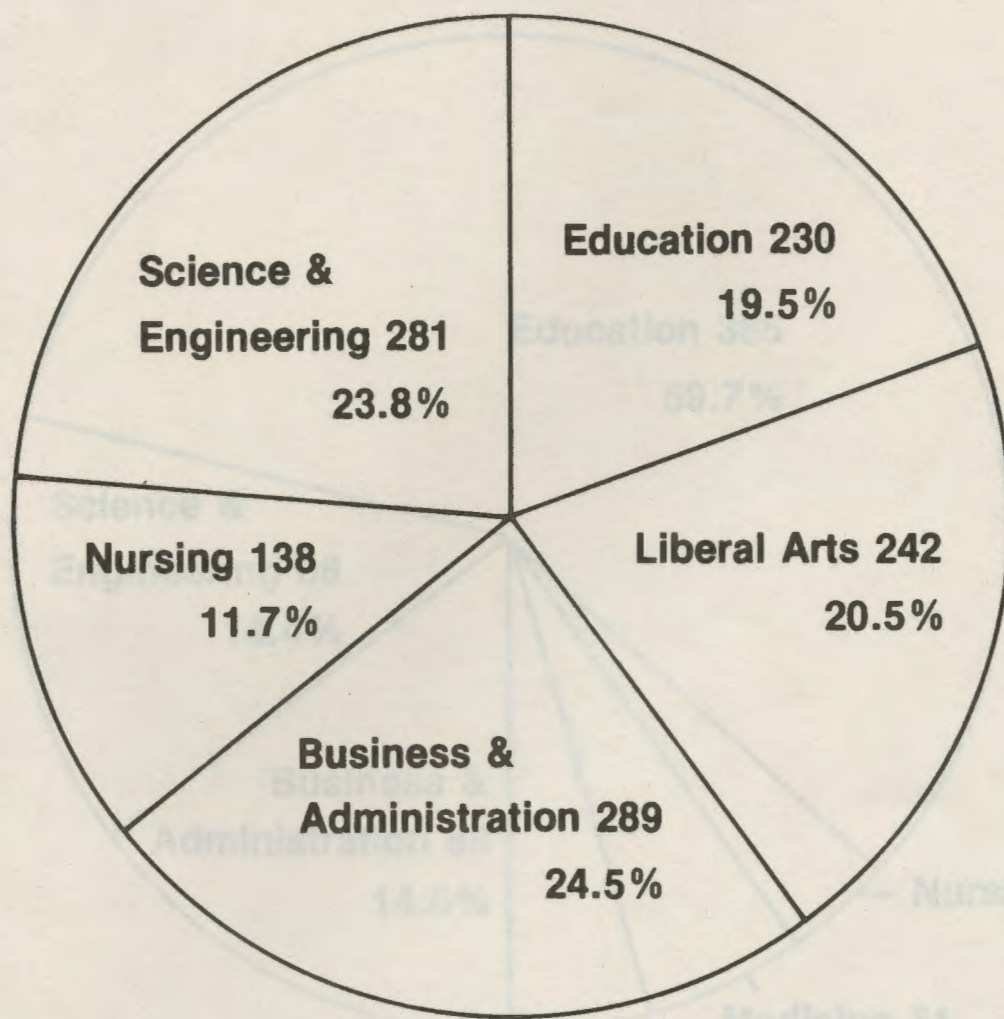

July 1, 1979 - June 30, 1980



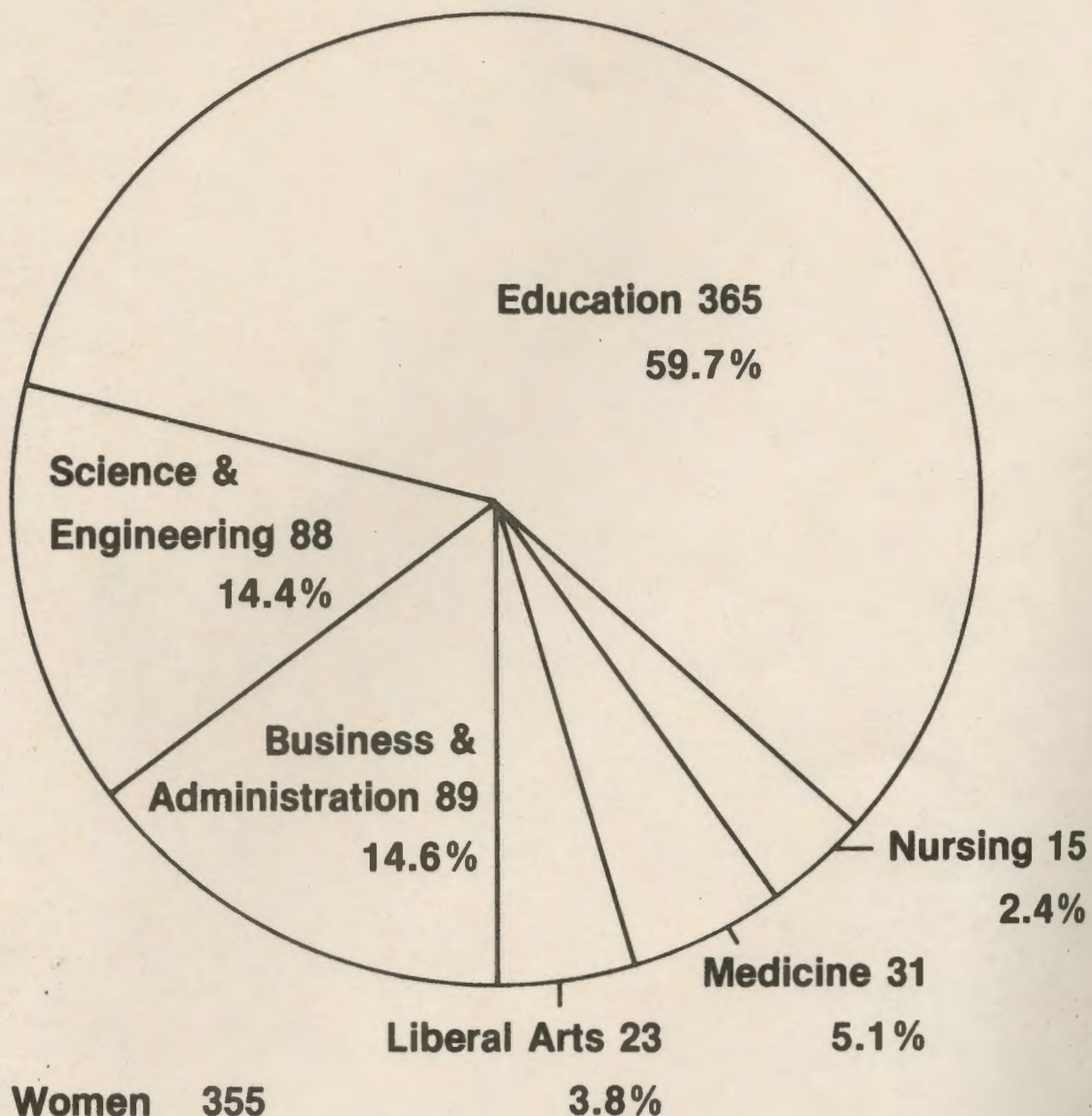
