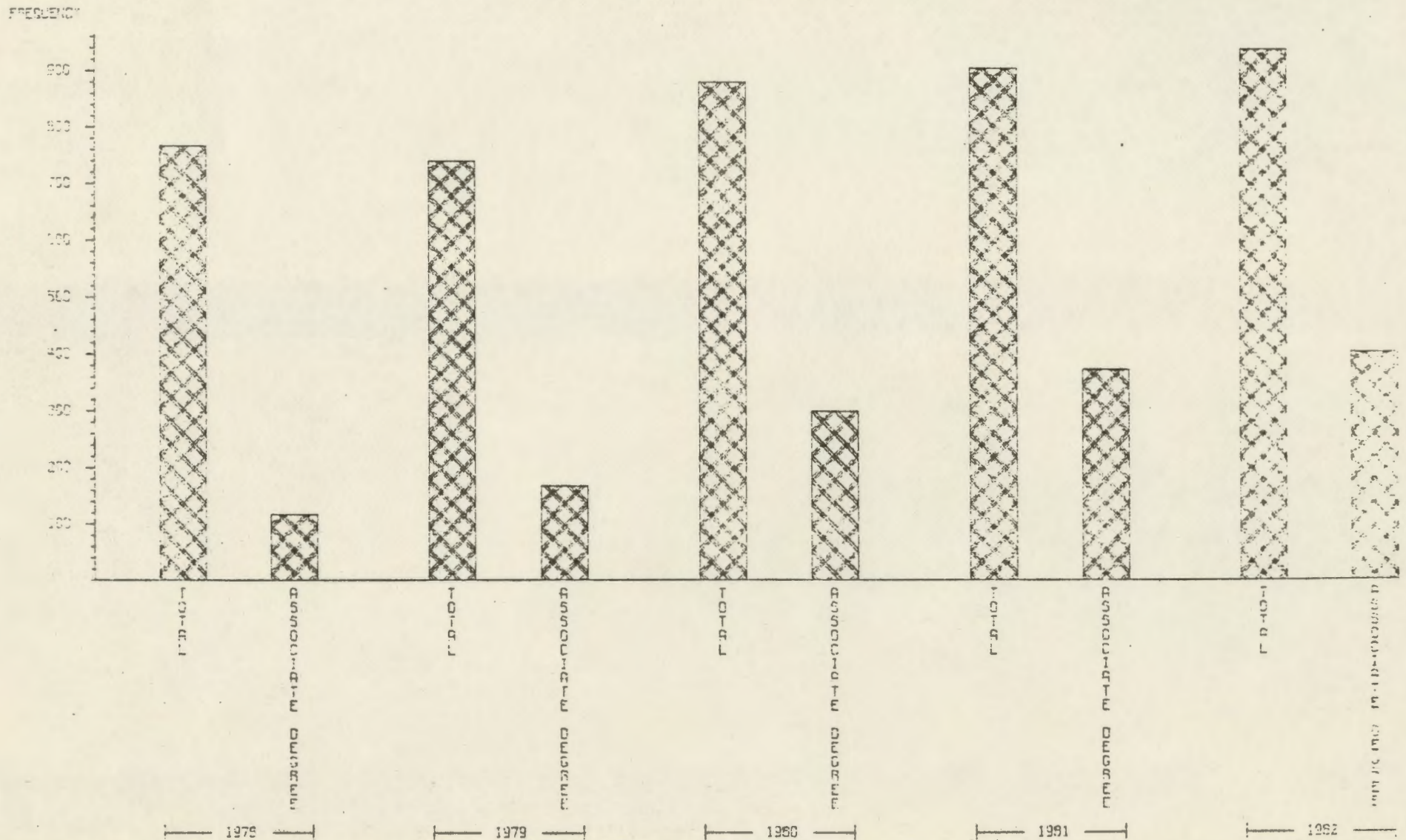

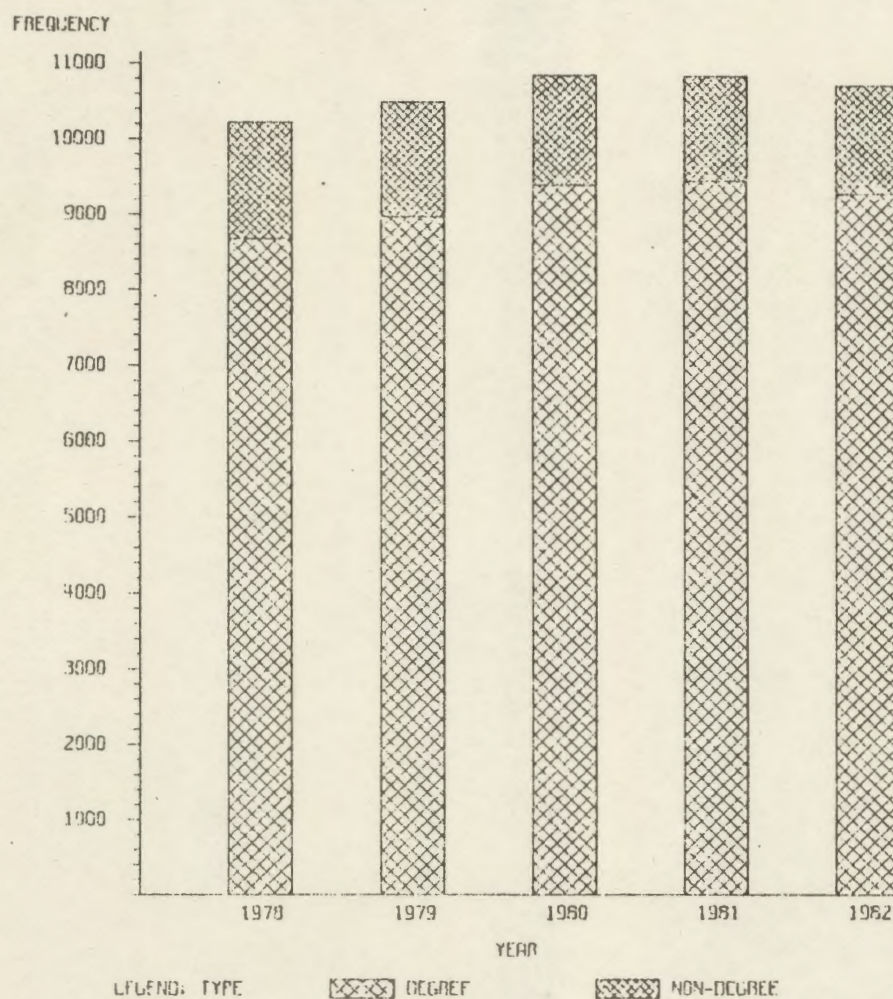
WRIGHT STATE UNIVERSITY FALL 1982

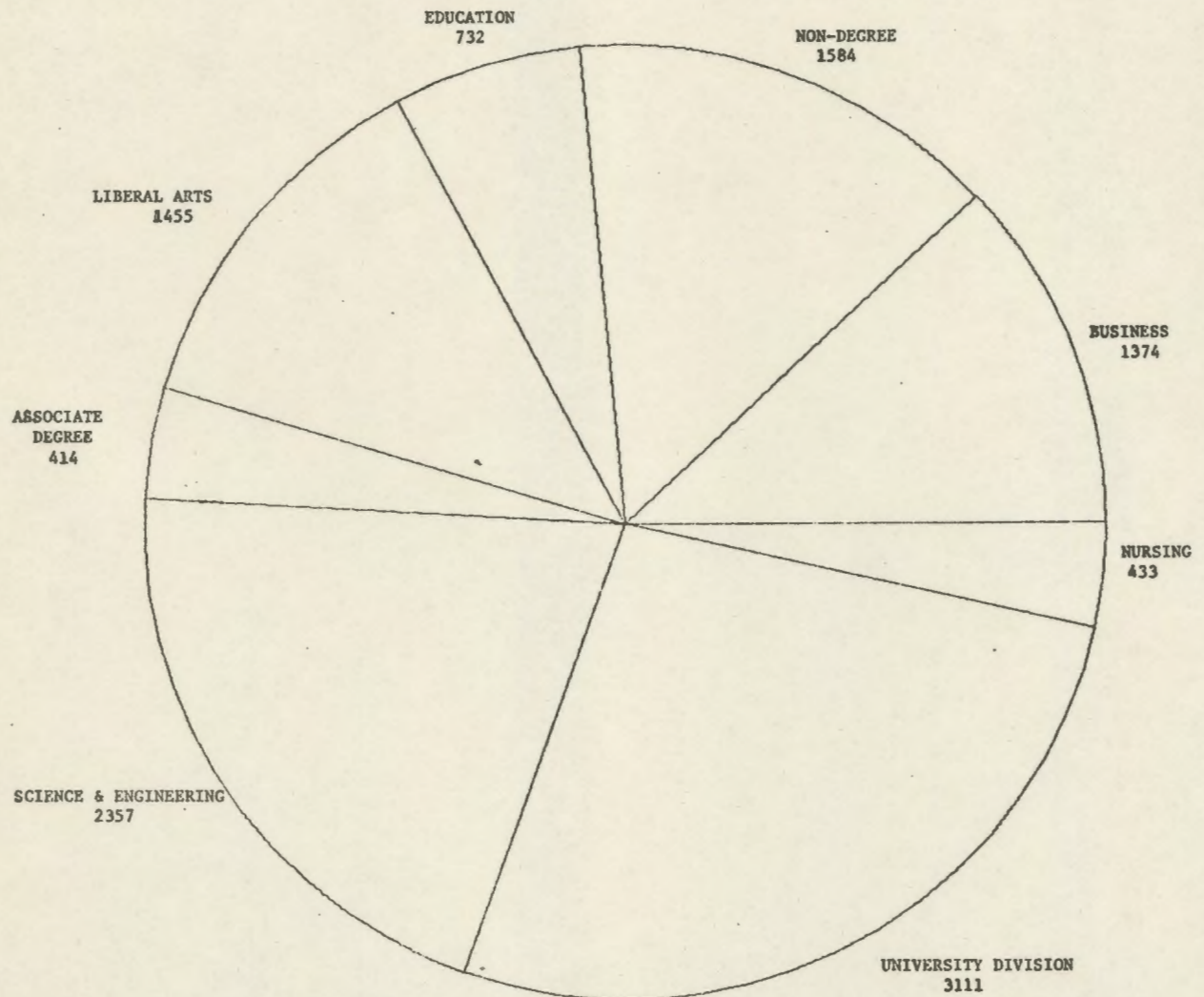

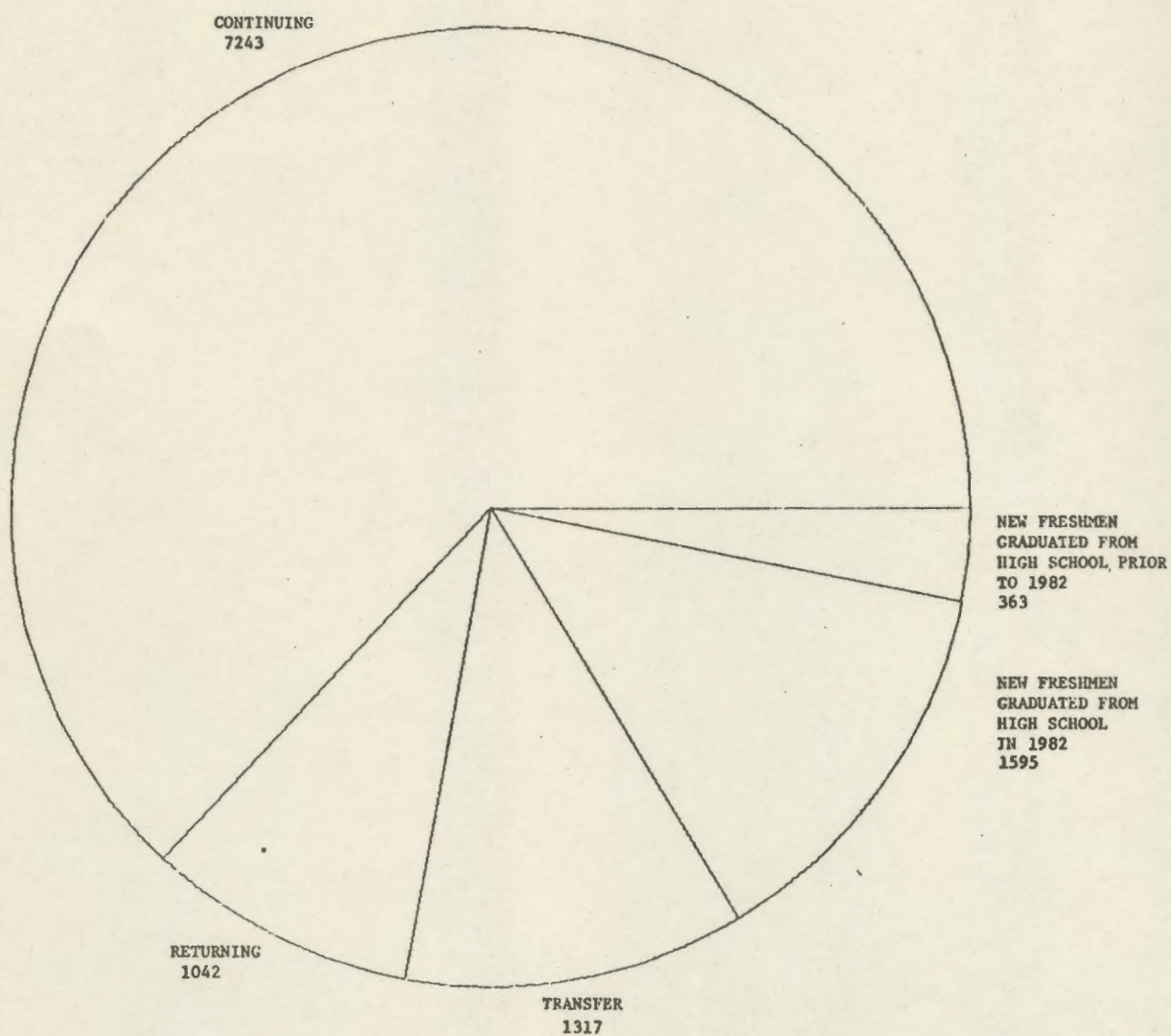
UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS IN NON-DEGREE PROGRAMS

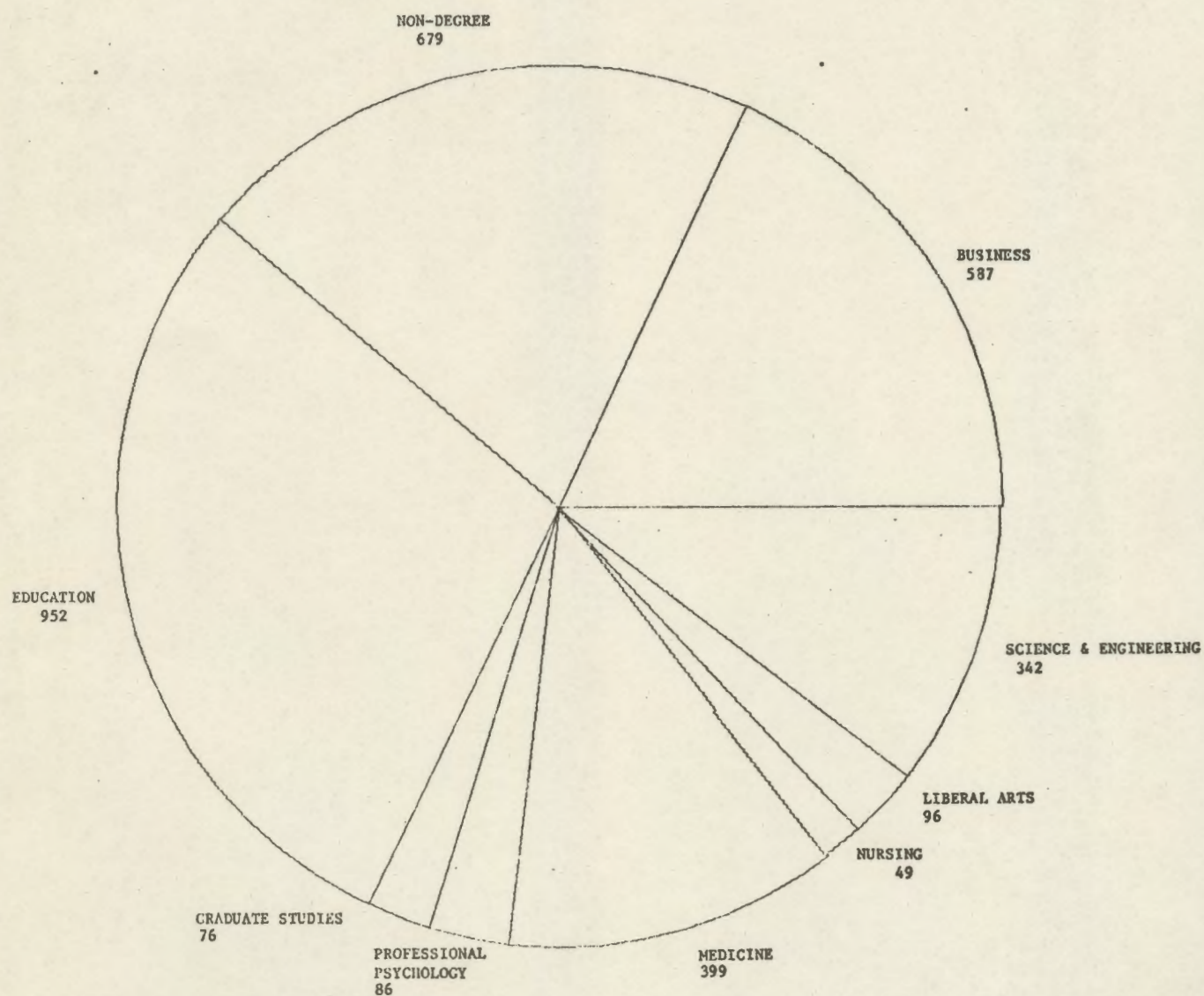

Ohio County of Residence

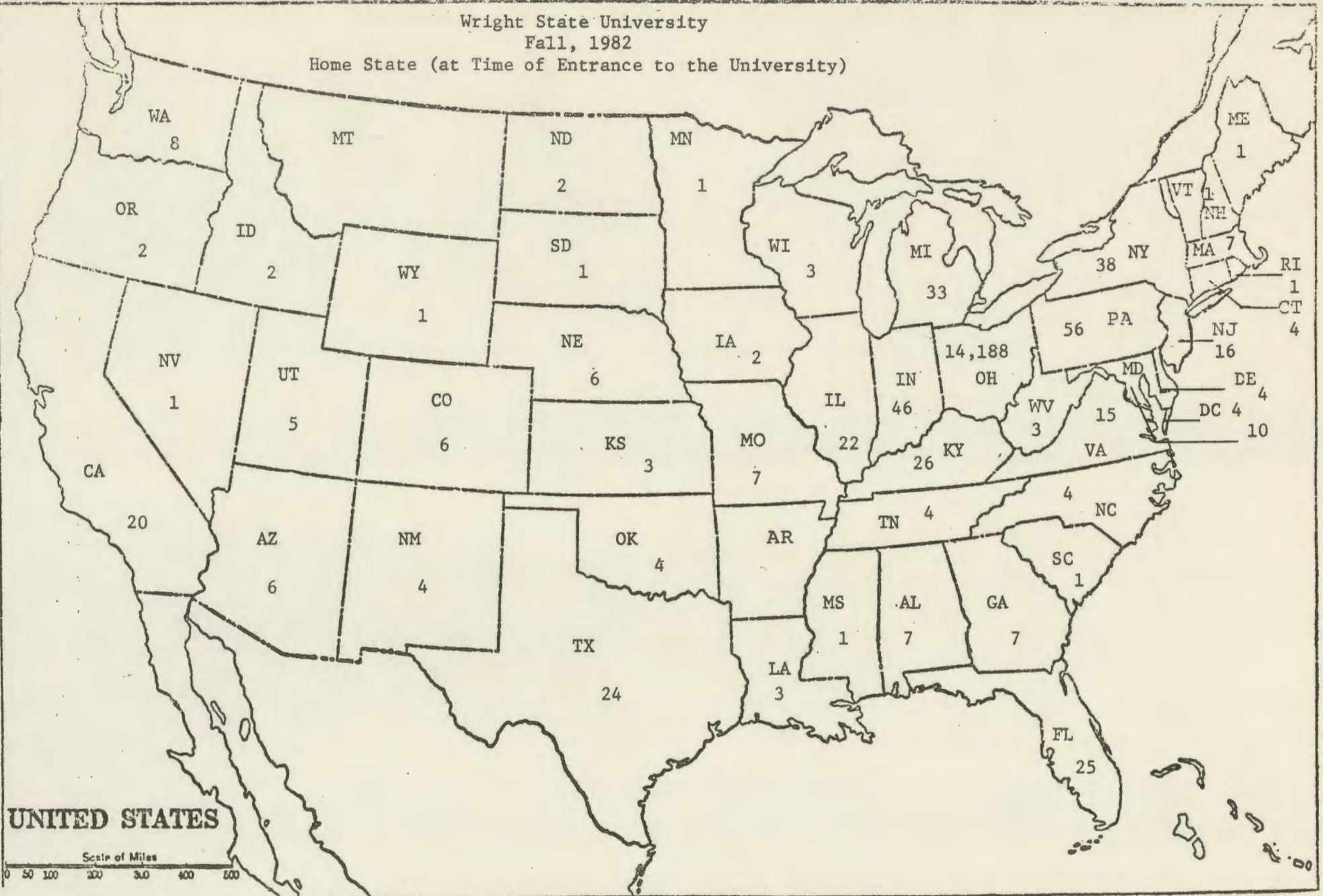

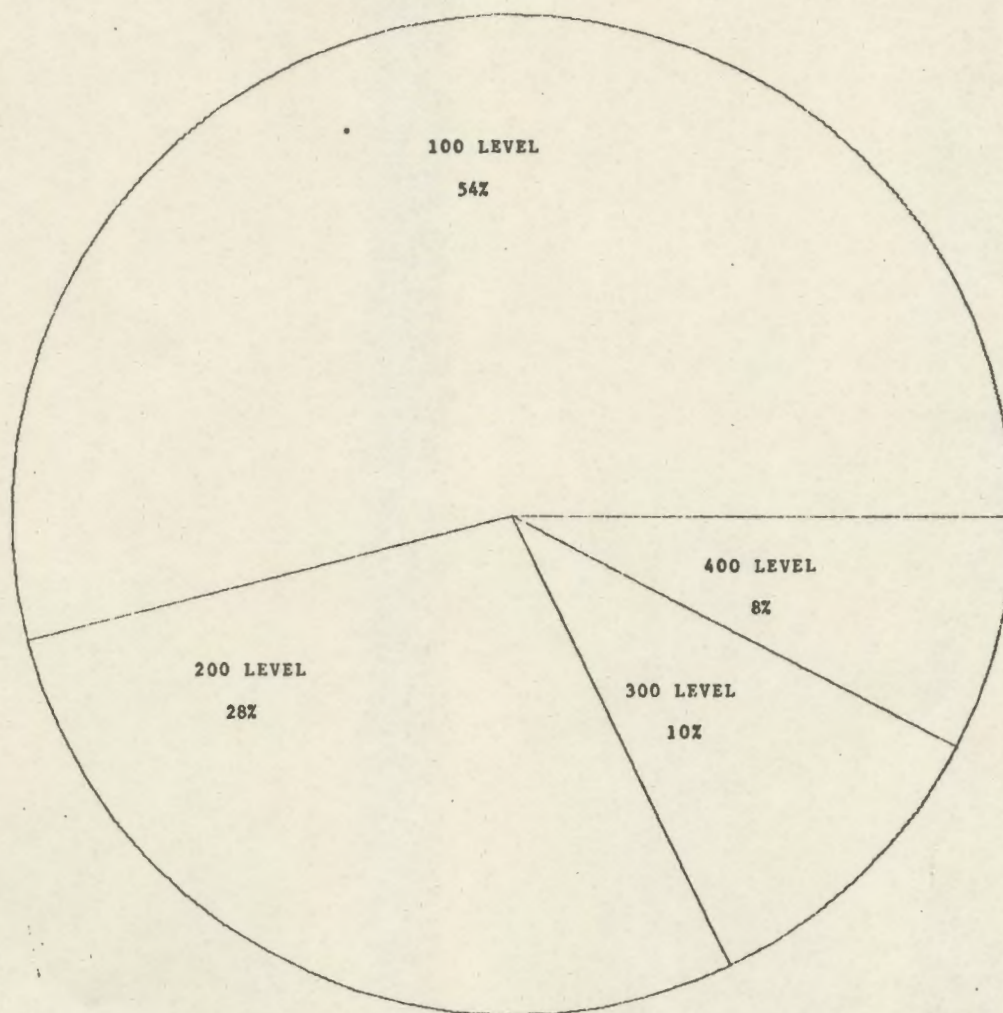

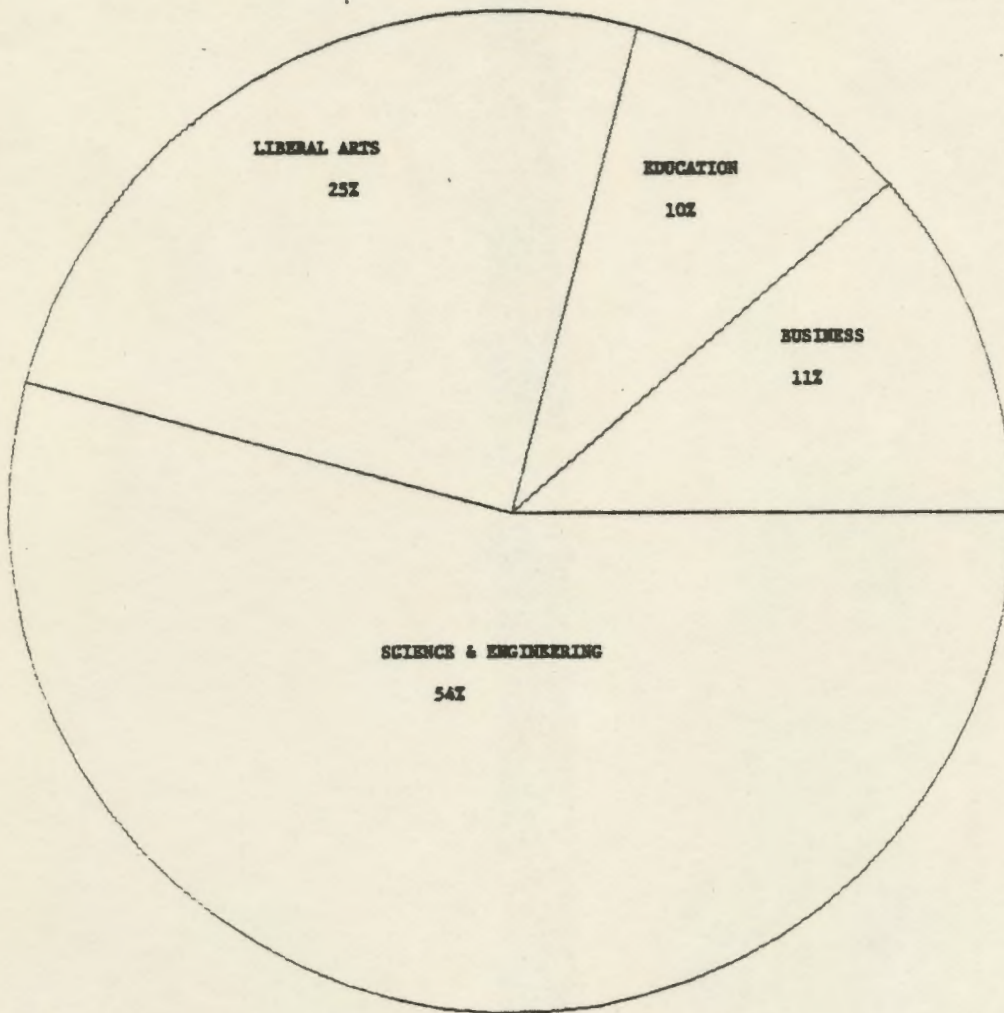

NEW DEGREE FRESHMEN

1658 students registered for the first time in an undergraduate degree program. 1455 students are 1982 high school graduates while 203 graduated from high school prior to 1982.

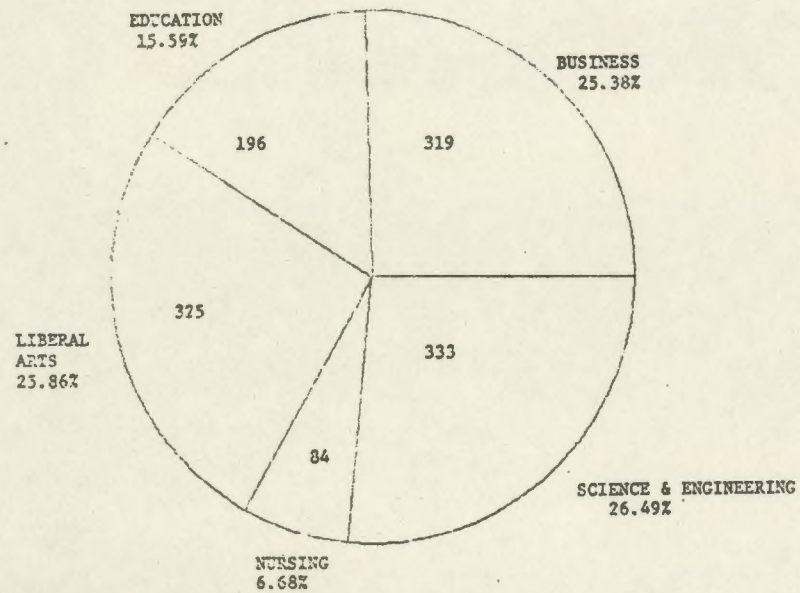
