
#### TOTAL ENROLLMENT FOR ALL CAMPUSES




## TOTAL ENROLLMENT ALL CAMPUSES




#### MASTERS/PROFESSIONAL/DOCTORAL ENROLLMENT

#### DEGREE ENROLLMENT FOR ALL CAMPUSES








