

1,812 students registered for the first time in an undergraduate degree program. 1,600 students are 1984 high school graduates while 212 graduated from high school prior to 1984.

High School Origin

248 public and private Ohio high schools are represented. In addition, students also come from high schools in 27 states.

95% of the new degree freshmen graduated from Ohio high schools. 43 Ohio high schools are represented by 10 or more students comprising 67% of the entering freshman class.
