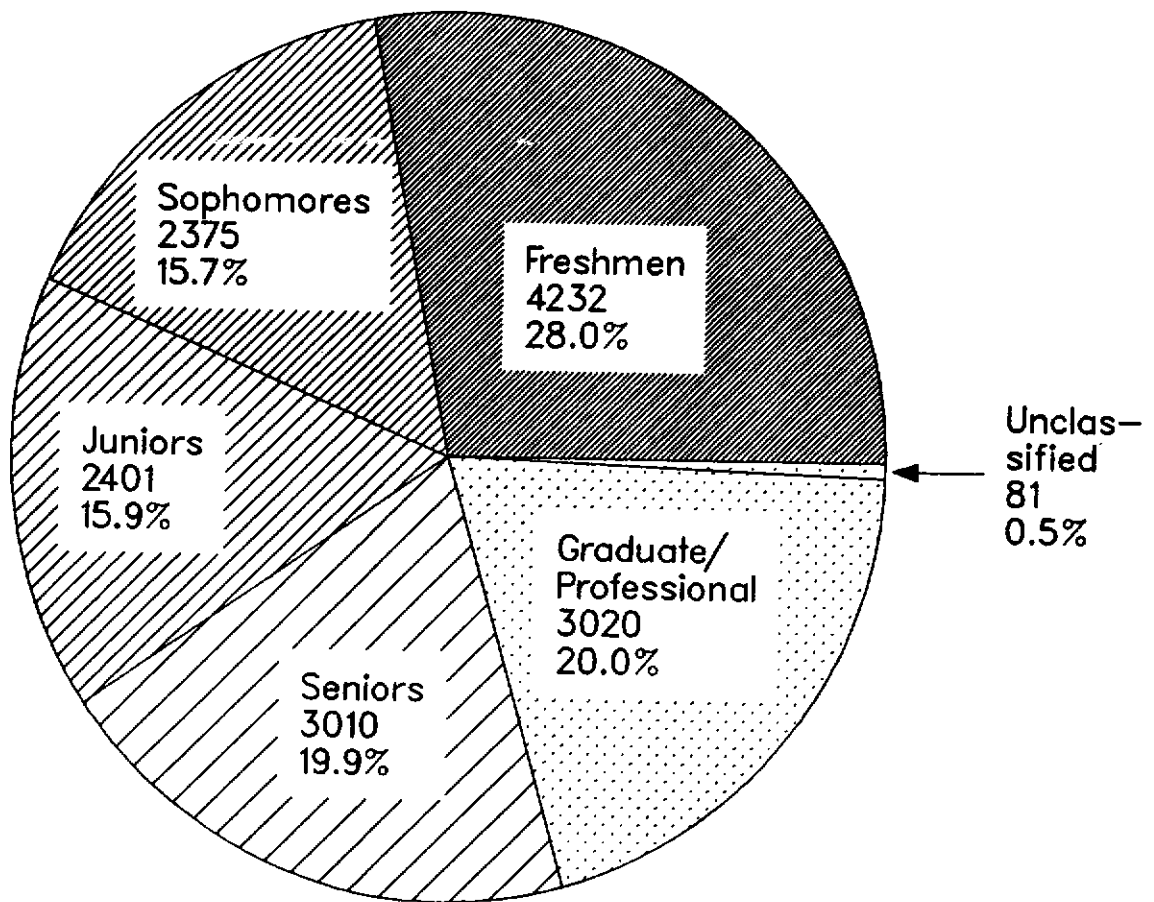

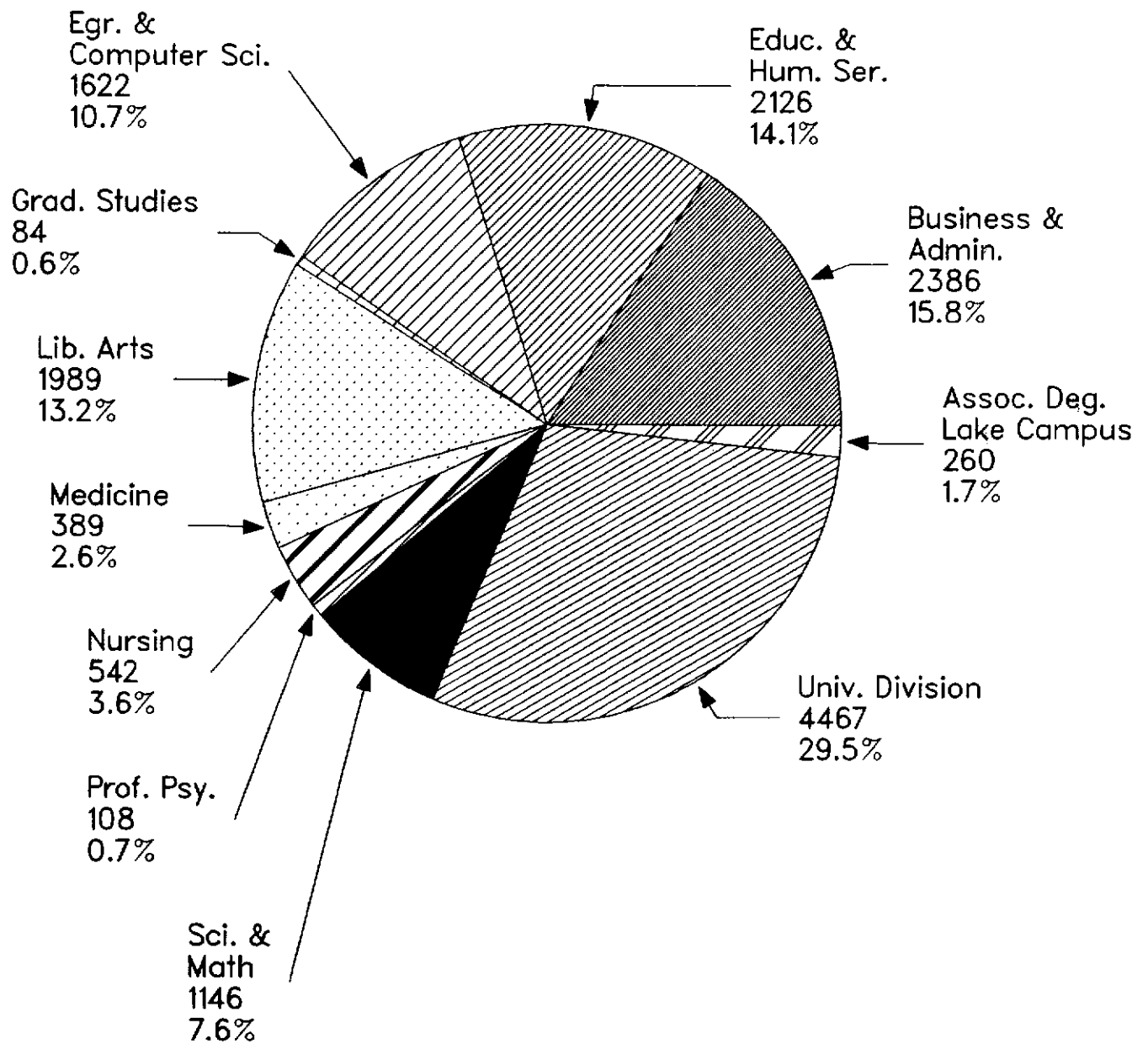

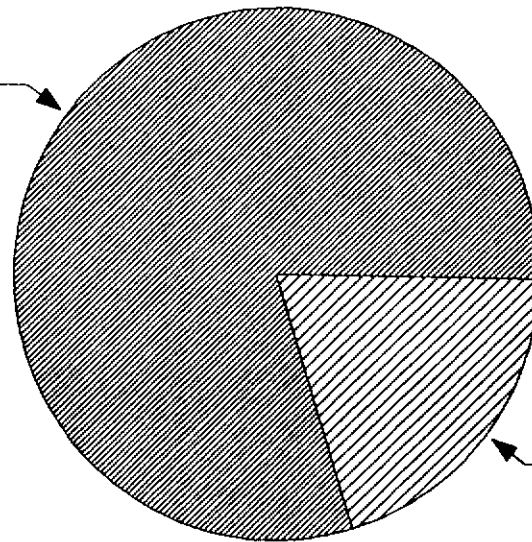
Enrollment by College/School Fall 1987

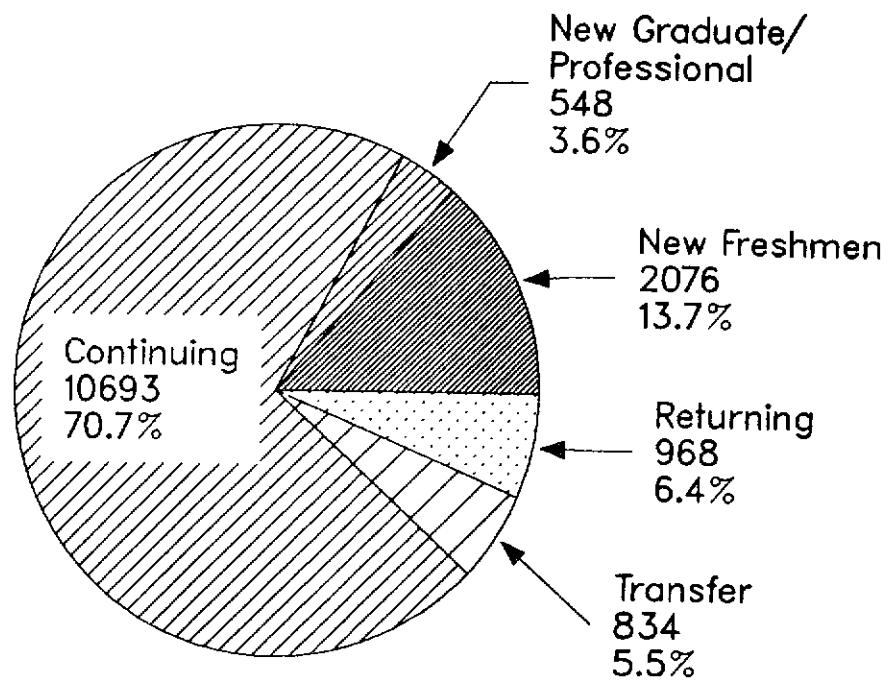

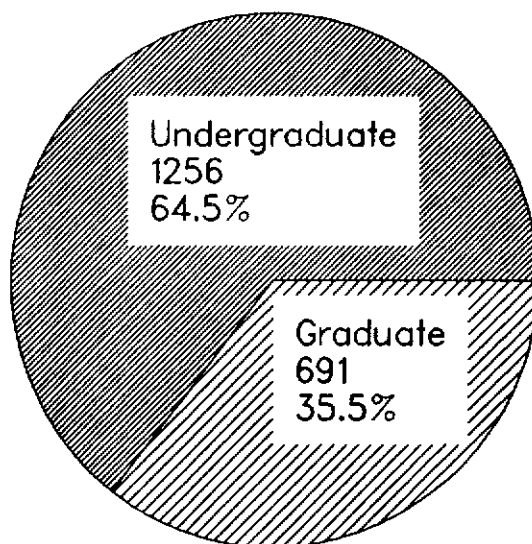

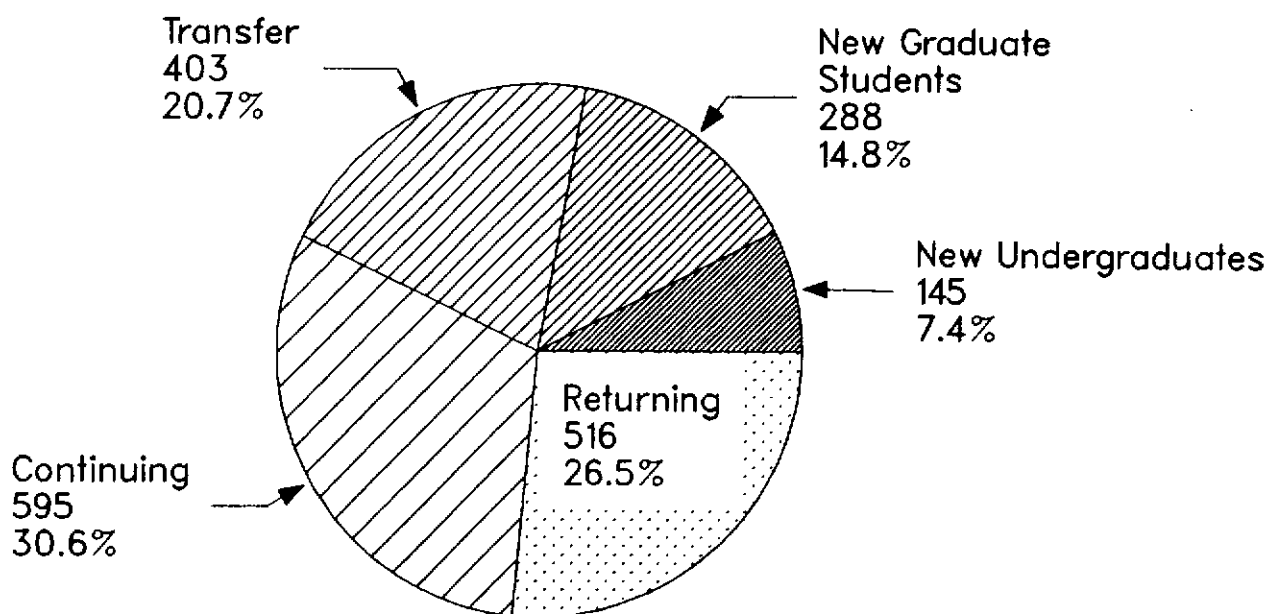

Entrance Status



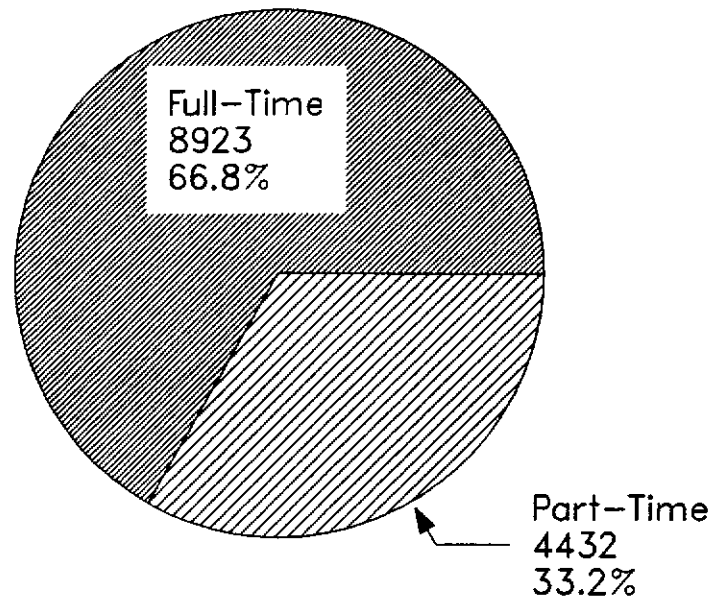
