#### **Preface**



Only data considered to be of general interest to the university community were selected for publication. ### Highlights

- \* Total enrollment is 17,657
  - \* Undergraduate enrollment is 13, 699
  - \* Graduate / Professional enrollment is 3,958
- \* 63% of all students are full time
  - \* Undergraduate 73%
  - \* Graduate / Professional 30%
- \* Women are in the majority, accounting for 54% of the enrollment
- \* 67% of all students come from Montgomery, Greene, Clark and Miami Counties
- \* 1,817 students live in university housing
  - \* 44% of entering freshmen live in University Housing
- \* Minority students account for 9% of enrollment
- \* Average age of all students is 26.3 years
  - \* Undergraduate 23.9 years
  - \* Graduate / Professional 33.5 years
- \* Undergraduate grade point average is 2.785
- \* 2,521 degrees were granted during 1991-92







# Mean Cumulative Undergraduate Grade Point Average by College Degree Students













# Wright State University Lake Campus Credit Hours Registered Fall 1992






