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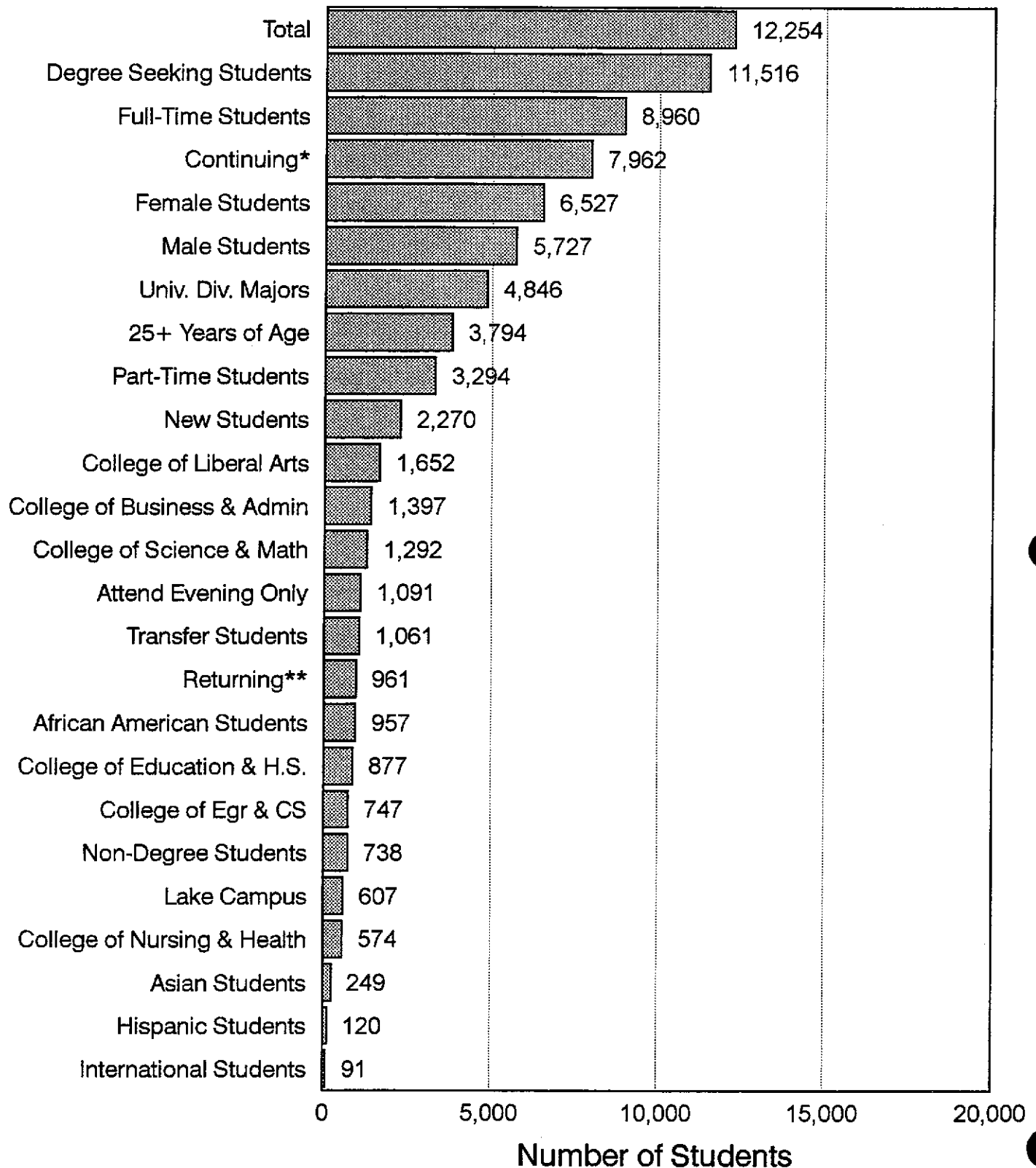
The Nineteenth Annual Student Fact Book provides information about students enrolled for the Fall Quarter 1995. Longitudinal information is also provided for the last six years. Only data considered to be of general interest to the university community were selected for publication. Requests for other types of student data may be directed to the Office of Institutional Research, 154 Allyn Hall, x 2729.

Highlights

- Total enrollment is 16,488
 - Undergraduate enrollment is 12,254, graduate enrollment is 3,750
 - Professional enrollment is 484
- 63% of all students are full time
 - Undergraduate, 74%, graduate 27%
- Women are in the majority, accounting for 55% of the enrollment
- 61% of all students come from Montgomery, Greene, Clark and Miami Counties 48% of entering freshmen come from these counties
 - 48% of entering freshmen come from these counties
- 2,055 students live in campus housing
- Minority students account for 11% of enrollment
- African American enrollment is 1,242, the highest in the university's history
- Average age of all students is 26.8 years
 - Undergraduate 24.1 years, graduate 33.9 years
- 10% of all undergraduates have all of their classes in the evening (after 5:00 p.m.).
- 41% of all undergraduates have both day and evening classes
- Undergraduate grade point average is 2.805 and has remained constant for the past 10 years
- 2,919 degrees were granted during 1994-95, the largest number in the university's history
- Compared to Fall 1994
 - Enrollment declined 1.9% (335 students)
 - Degree enrollment declined 4.0% (613 students)
 - New first time freshmen increased 4.7% (93 students)
 - African American enrollment increased 2.8% (33 students)

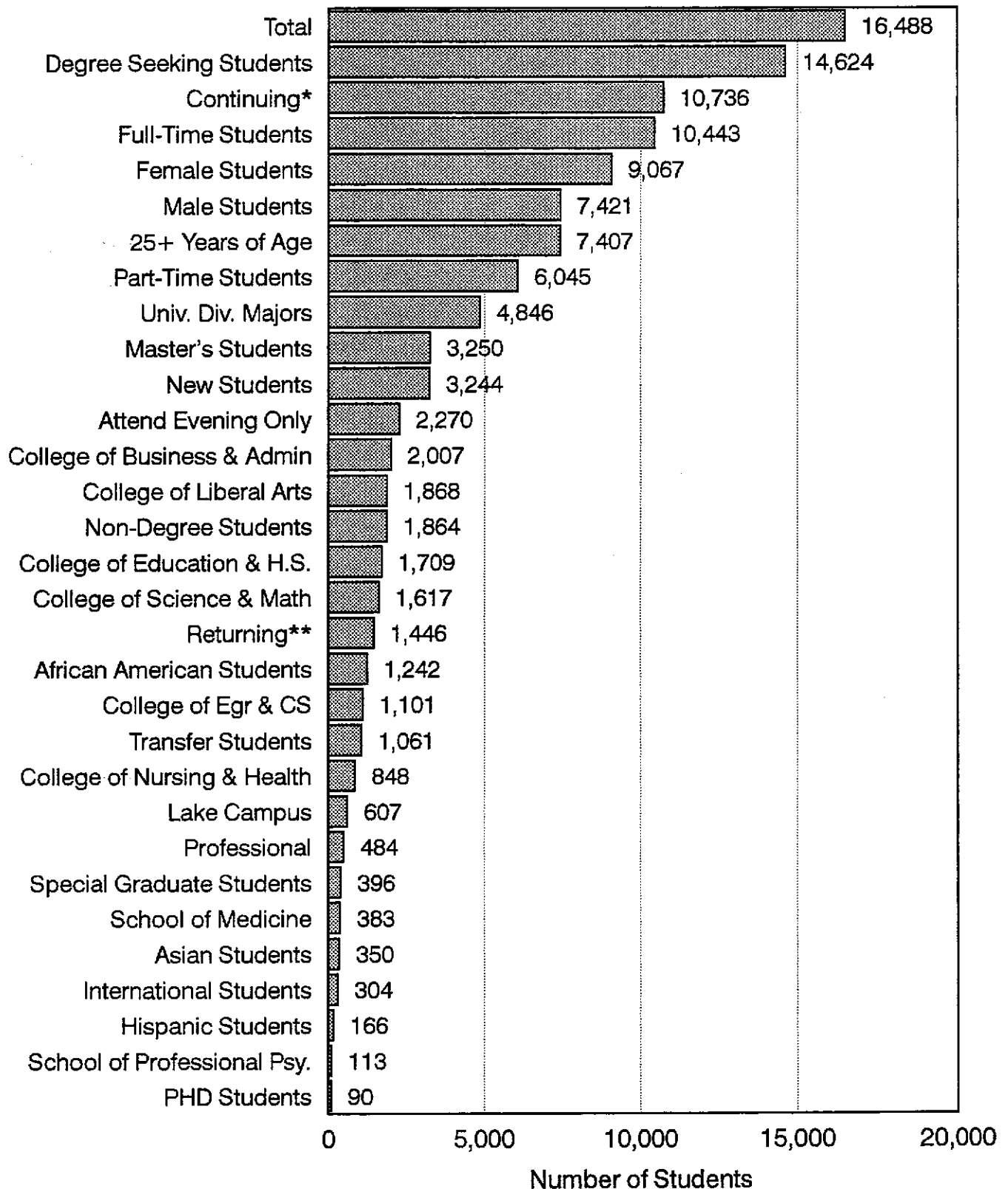

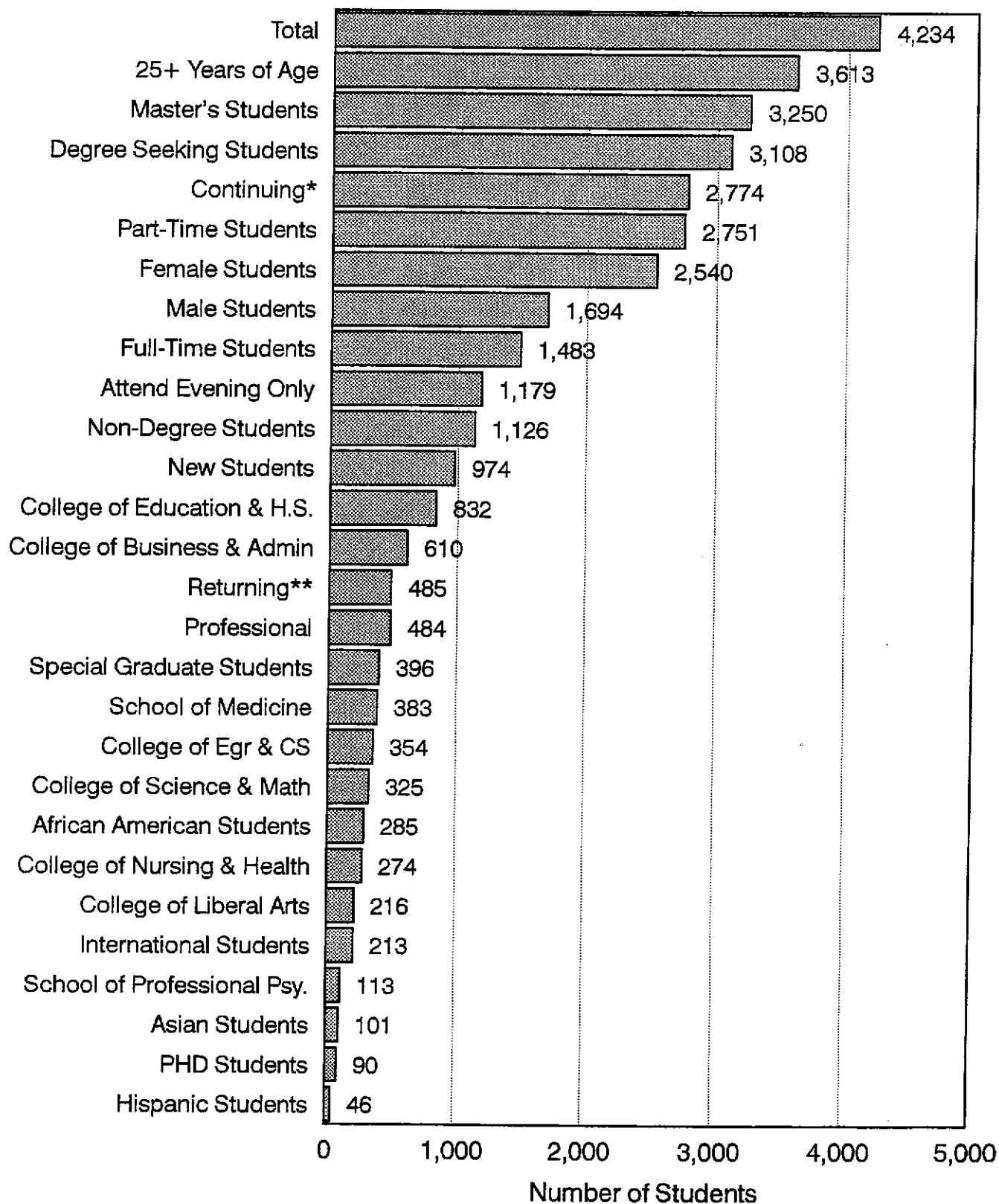

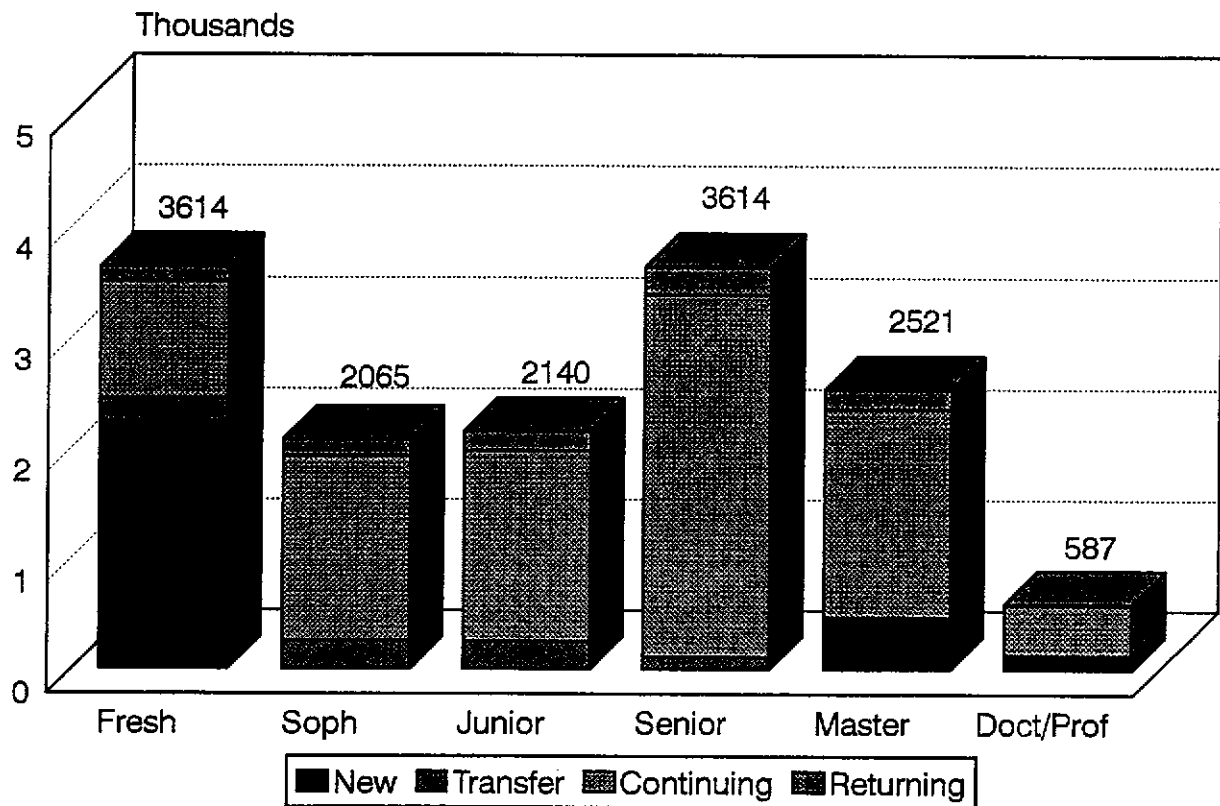

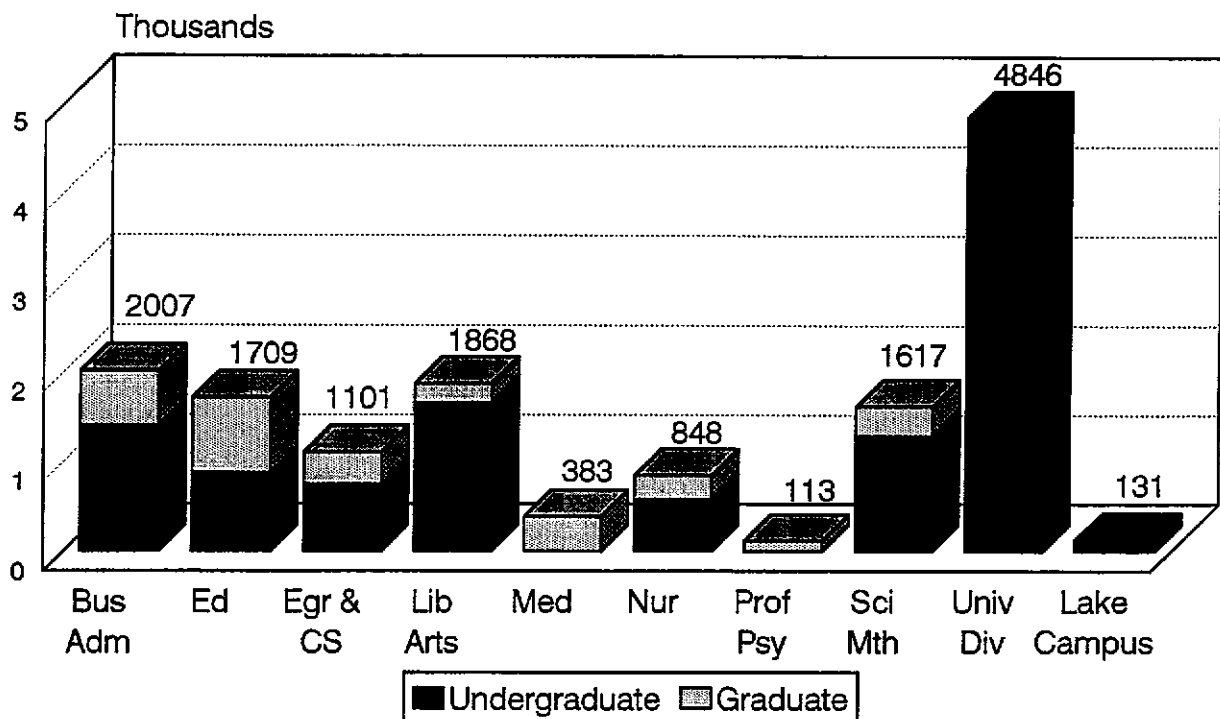

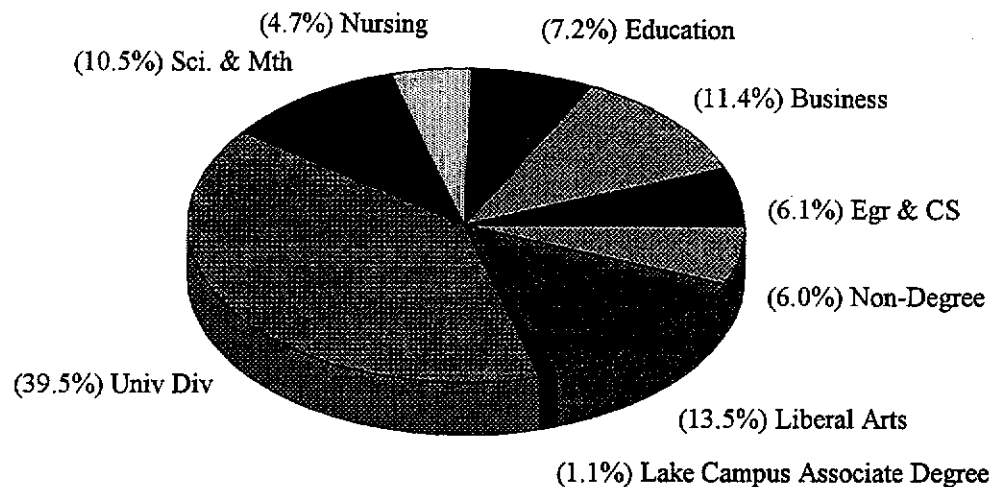

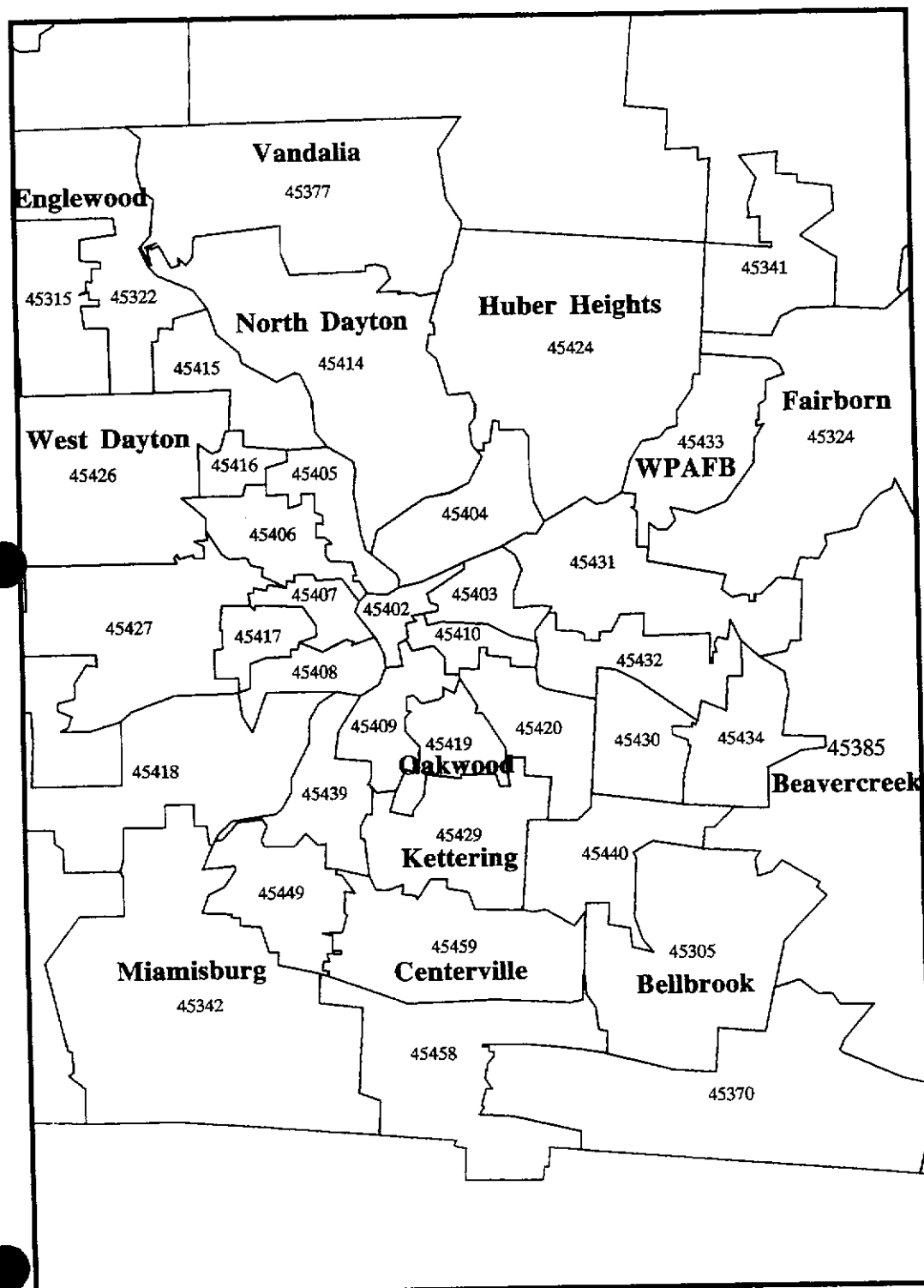

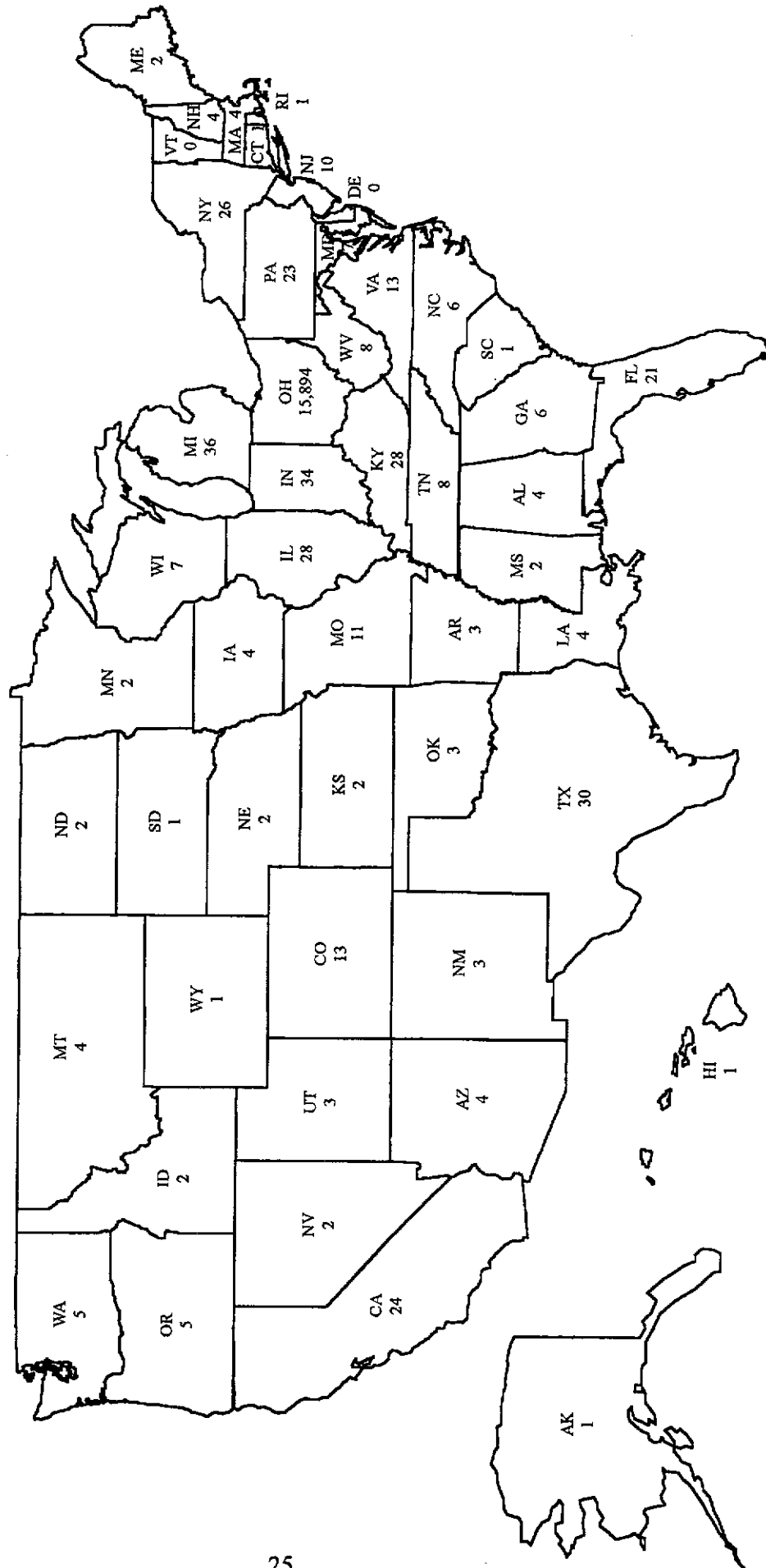

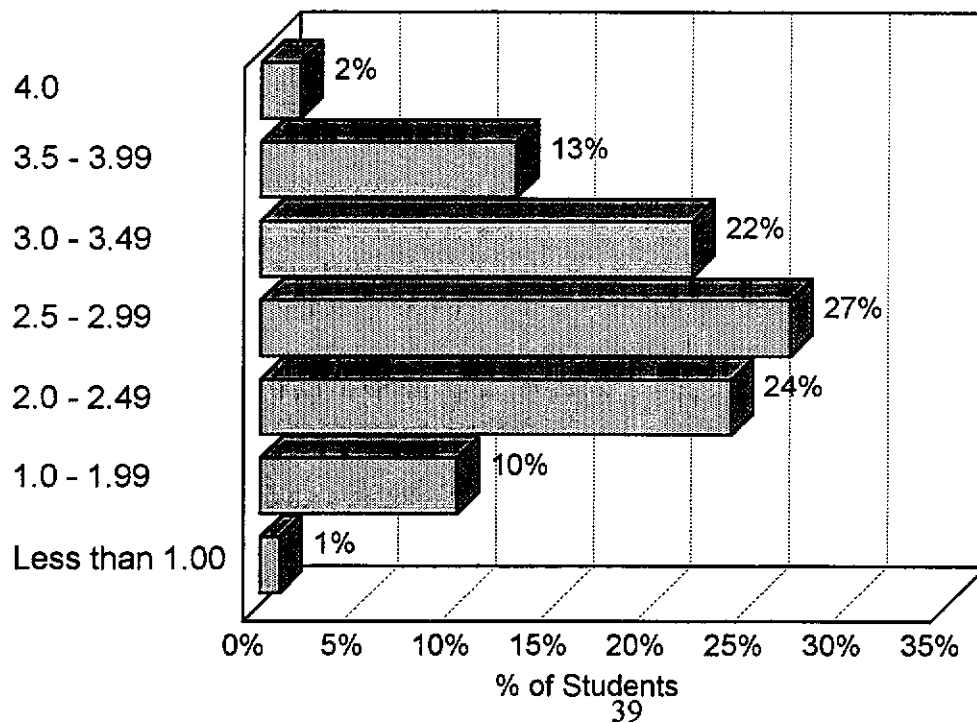

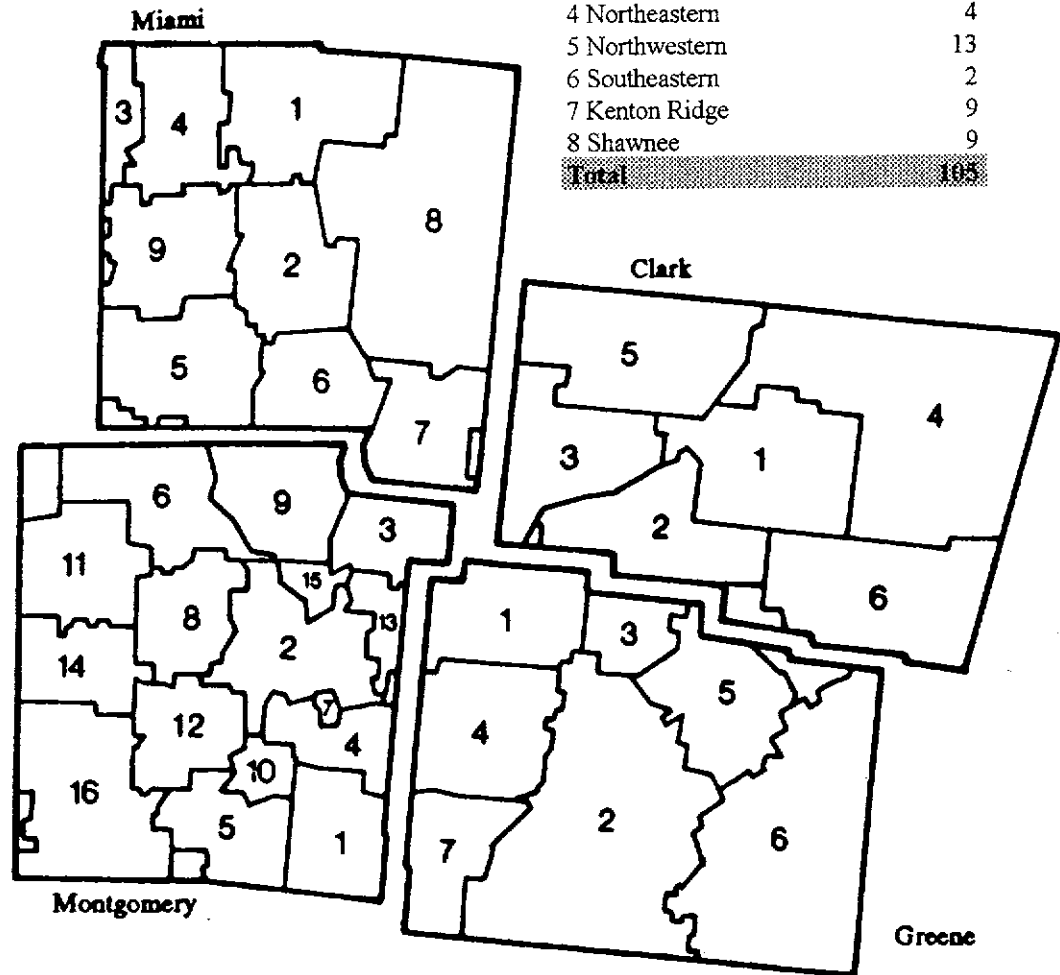

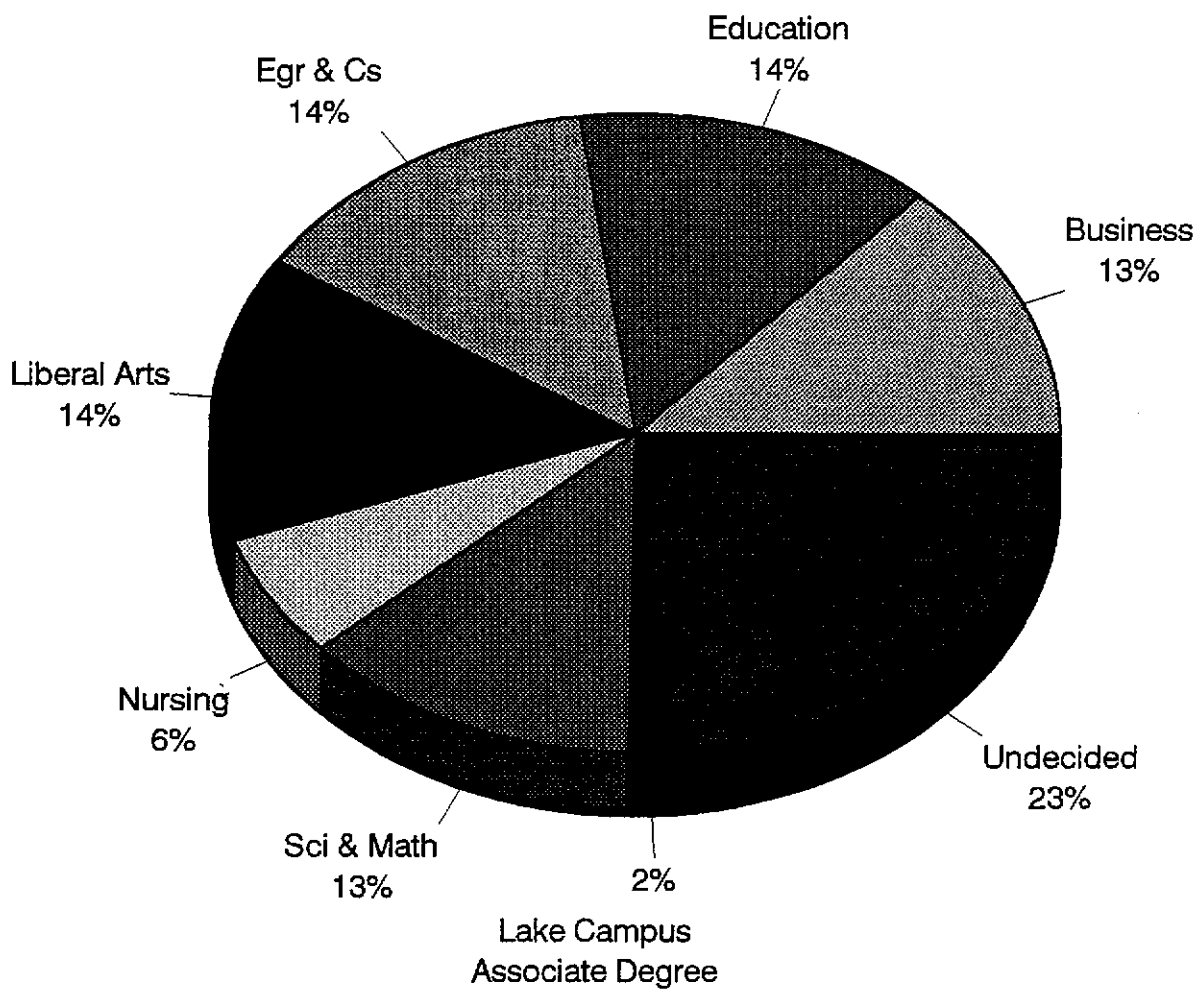

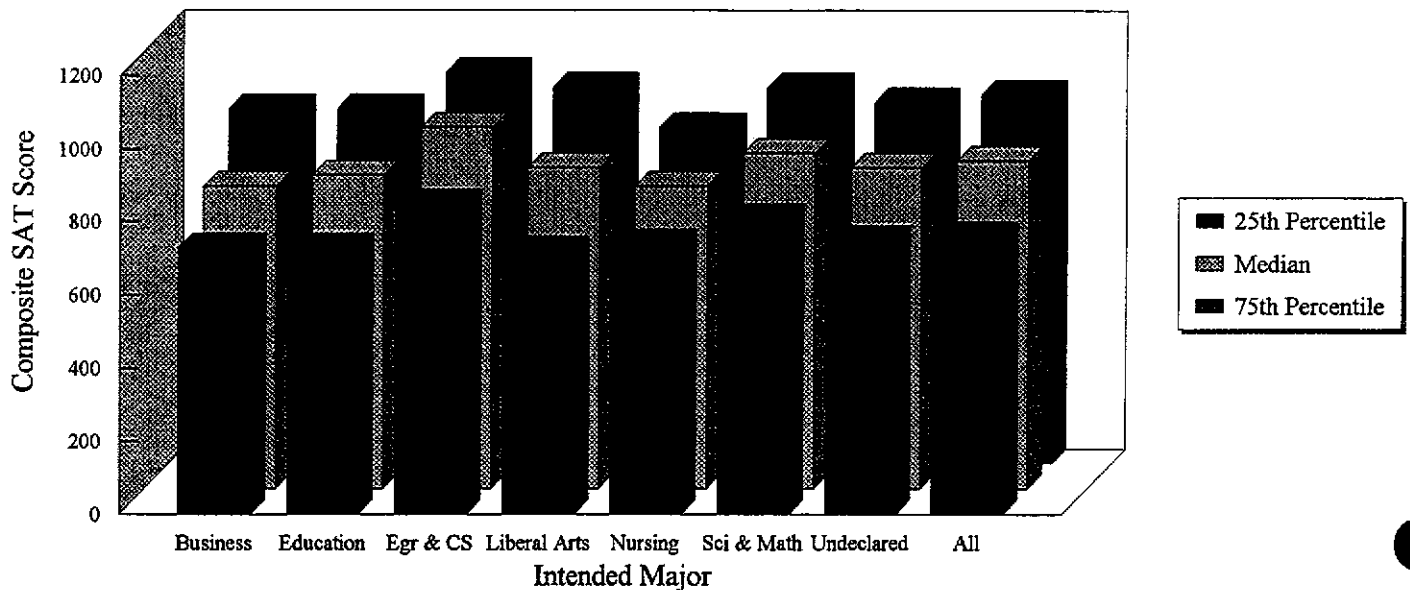

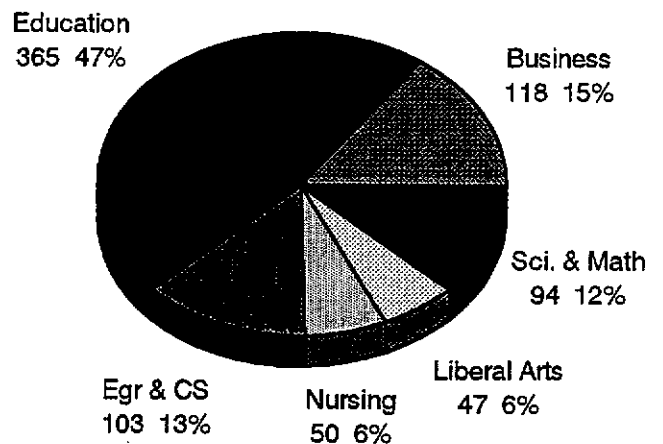


Bachelor's Degree
