



## **Brothers Against Drunk Driving (BADD)**

In order to live out the true meaning of “I am my brothers keeper” it is necessary to create a program to curb drunk driving. We are supposed to be taking care of one another but every time we allow a member of our organization to drive under the influence we are allowing them to put themselves and others at risk. Those risks include jail time, financial trouble resulting from the DUI, or even death of themselves or another. The program entails several parts listed below:

1. In an attempt to curb driving under the influence, there will be two designated drivers from 10:00pm to 3:00 am, Thursday through Saturday nights. All members of the chapter, actives and pledges, will take turns being the designated driver. The program will be used every night it is scheduled and will not be cancelled for any reason unless voted on by the chapter at the regularly scheduled meeting prior to the night of cancellation.
2. The designated driver may not use drugs or alcohol during, or for eight hours prior to his shift.
3. The designated driver is responsible to find his own car to drive and must pay for the gas he uses out of his own pocket.
4. The designated driver will be given a cellular phone for use on his shift. This phone will be picked up from the Risk Management Chairman at the beginning of the shift and returned to the Risk Management Chairman the morning after his shift. No personal calls may be carried out using the cellular phone, records will be kept and checked by the Risk Management Chairman.
5. All rides given by the designated driver must be to and from destinations within the Dayton metro area, unless time permits and the driver is willing to drive the extra distance. The final destination for all riders each night must be a living unit, not a late night party.
6. Individuals who fail to participate as the designated driver on their assigned night or fail to find a substitute, may not take part in the next social event, and will be fined by the Kai Board.
7. Individual found not to be taking full advantage of BADD (i.e. driving drunk) will be brought up on charges to the Kai Board. The following is a list of possible punishment for violators:
  - a. Extra Nights as BADD drivers
  - b. Social Probation
  - c. Alcohol Awareness Class
  - d. Fines
  - e. Expulsion
8. This program will be set up and overseen by the Risk Management Chairman.
