Standard Member Expectations

The following are the minimum expectations for a member of Beta Theta Pi, as developed by the participants of the 1999 Chapter Alumni Advisors Board. This list of minimum expectations should serve as a basic guideline for all undergraduate members. While these are only minimum expectations, each member should strive for excellence in all facets of the college life. For just being a member does not bring you honor, your work alone will bring you the rewards you deserve.

- Attend at least 85% of all chapter meetings and 100% of ritual ceremonies.
- Serve on at least one committee.
- Participate in at least one charitable event each semester.
- Pay all bills on time.
- Participate actively in recruitment both internally with the chapter and externally with I.F.C. Identify a minimum of two prospects for new membership each semester.
- Know and understand the by-laws of the Fraternity and Chapter.
- Participate in all chapter programming events i.e. risk management seminars, date rape programs, etc.
- Participate in at least one extra-curricular activity outside the chapter.
- Support intramurals by either playing or attending at least one season of sport events.
- Participate in song practice.
- Have respect for Brothers and Beta property.
- Read, understand and follow Beta's Risk Management Policy.
- Support and participate in all fundraising events for the Chapter.
- Take responsibility for your actions both on campus and off.
- Attend at least one I.F.C. meeting.
- Attend at least one Alumni Association meeting.
