**Wright State University Academic Policy on College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)**

**Wright State University accepts only College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) Subject Matter tests. The guidelines that govern the application of transfer credit will be used to apply credit to degree requirements for students who score at or above designated minimums on College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) Subject Matter tests.**

**Individual academic departments have determined how CLEP credit is to be awarded. If the department has determined that the CLEP exam is the equivalent of a specific course, credit will be awarded for that class as shown above. In some instances, a department has determined that the CLEP exam does not cover the equivalent content of a single course, but will award "general elective" credit according to the recommendations of the American Council on Education (ACE). In other cases, the department has determined that there is no equivalency, and no credit will be awarded.**

**The above course equivalencies and credit hours will be awarded only to students whose CLEP scores have not already been evaluated at Wright State. Course equivalencies and credit hours are subject to change without notice and will be granted in accordance with those current when CLEP scores are evaluated.**
