**Agreement for the Articulation
Between
Career Paths for the Teaching Professions Program of the
Warren County Career Center
and
Wright State University
College of Education and Human Services
Teacher Education Programs**

Purpose: To establish program requirements and procedures for a close working relationship between the above institutions in order to implement a well-coordinated education program leading to a Bachelor of Science in Education (Early Childhood Education, Middle Childhood Education); Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science (English Education, Social Science Education, Mathematics Education, Science Education); or Bachelor of Fine Arts (Art Education).

Program: This program is designed to include one year of secondary school participation preceding graduation from the Career Paths for the Teaching Professions program at the Warren County Career Center (approved by the Ohio Department of Education) followed by at least four years of higher education.

Program Area: Education

Entrance requirements: Students must follow the current college admissions applications process and timeframes and meet the following criteria:

- Complete the 450 hour Teaching Professions program
- Complete all requirements of field experience with mentor teacher(s)
- Obtain a minimum score of 72 (that is, an average score of 3 on each indicator) on the program portfolio rubric

Post Secondary Portion of the Program

Upon acceptance into professional cohort at Wright State University, the student will receive college level credit for the following course:

- ED 301 Schooling in a Pluralistic society—5 credit hours
- ED 221 Practicum Experience—1 credit hour

A letter from the Career Pathways Coordinator will serve as documentation that the student met the entrance requirements as noted above. Application for credit

along with the appropriate documentation should be submitted to the CEHS Office of Student Services.

Timeframe for Honoring Course By-Pass and College Credit Opportunities


This agreement is in effect for two years for the high school graduating classes of 2010 and 2011. To receive credit for ED 301 and ED 221, students must matriculate at Wright State by summer 2012. Students covered by this agreement who matriculate fall 2012 or later will receive credit for the semester course(s) established as the equivalent of ED 301.
