### First Year Curriculum Guide Intended Major: Nursing Prepared by the University College 2008-2009

Welcome to Wright State University!

To remain on track during your first year, you should:

1. Complete an English composition course each quarter with a grade of P, C or better until ENG 102 is completed;
2. Complete a mathematics course each quarter with a grade of P, C or better until STT 160 is completed;
3. Maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA\*, including the following courses
  - ENG 101, 102
  - STT 160
  - PSY 105, 110; SOC 200
  - CHM 102; M&I 220, Ant 310
4. Earn a minimum of 36 quarter hours;
5. Satisfy all high school deficiencies, if any.

Admission to Wright State University does not guarantee entry into a major program of study. The most qualified nursing applicants are selected from the eligible applicant pool based on competitive grades. To be considered for admission to the College of Nursing and Health (CONH) you must have:

1. 48 quarter hours earned;
2. 2.5 minimum cumulative GPA\*;
3. Complete the following prerequisite courses with a 2.5 minimum GPA\* and a grade of C or better in each: ENG 101, 102, PSY 105, PSY 110, CHM 102, ANT 310\*, M&I 220\*, SOC 200 and STT 160. (**CHM 102 is a prerequisite for ANT 310 and M&I 220**)
4. Apply to College of Nursing and Health.

***Students may repeat any science course once, but only two science courses may be repeated while meeting prerequisites to the CONH.***

Ideally, you will enter the College of Nursing and Health at the end of the quarter in which you earn 48 credit hours, but no later than your sixth quarter at WSU.

***Therefore, you must plan your course of study so that your GPA is competitive with 80% of the June 15 or December 15 cohorts of nursing applicants.***

***\*Admission to the nursing major is very competitive! A G.P.A higher than a 2.5 is usually necessary to be admitted to the college.***
