**MATHEMATICS PLACEMENT**

There are seven (7) mathematics placement levels linked to the results of the Mathematics Placement Test. You may not enroll in a course at a level higher than your placement level.

**NOTE:** The following exceptions apply to a student earning 27 or higher on the ACT-Math or 620 or higher on the SAT-Math and who do not have a high school math deficiency:

- a.) Students with ACT-Math scores of at least 27 or SAT-Math scores of at least 620 may register for MTH 143, MTH 145, MTH 228, STT 160 or STT 264.
- b.) Students with ACT-Math scores of at least 27 or SAT-Math scores of at least 620 intending to major in fields requiring Calculus may register for MTH 229 provided they received A's and/or B's in high school precalculus and trigonometry (these two courses may be integrated into one course at some high schools). Students must register in one of these courses no more than 1 year after graduation from high school

Mathematics placement levels are valid for one calendar year. If you do not begin taking mathematics or statistics classes during your first year at Wright State University, it is strongly recommended that you retake the Mathematics Placement Test to determine where you should begin.
