Multiple Answers:

Remark allows questions to have more than one correct response. You must identify the logic to be used.

AND An "and" indicator states that <u>all</u> correct responses must be selected for the question to be correct. For instance: If **A** and **D** are indicated on the key with an **and** condition:

```
⊕ B C ⊕ E (correct, both responses were chosen)
⊕ B C ⊕ E (incorrect, D was omitted)
⊕ C ⊕ E (incorrect, A was omitted)
⊕ C ⊕ E (incorrect, B is not a correct response)
⊕ B C ⊕ E (incorrect, Blank)
```

OR An "or" can be used when you want one <u>or</u> the other counted as correct, <u>not</u> more than one/both. This prevents students from guessing and selecting several responses to try to choose the correct answer. For instance: If **A** and **D** and indicated on the key with an **or** condition:

```
⊕ ® C ⊕ € (incorrect, more than one response was chosen)
⊕ ® C ⊕ € (correct, A is a valid response)
⊕ © C ⊕ € (incorrect, too man and an incorrect response)
⊕ ® C ⊕ € (incorrect, Blank)
```

Steps:

- Mark the correct answers for the multiple mark question on your exam key sheet
- On the back of your request form, write the question number and choose if "and" or "or" is to be used
