## Multiple Answers:

Remark allows questions to have more than one correct response. You must identify the logic to be used.

AND An "and" indicator states that all correct responses must be selected for the question to be correct. For instance: If $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{D}$ are indicated on the key with an and condition:

OR An "or" can be used when you want one or the other counted as correct, not more than one/both. This prevents students from guessing and selecting several responses to try to choose the correct answer. For instance: If $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{D}$ and indicated on the key with an or condition:


## Steps:

- Mark the correct answers for the multiple mark question on your exam key sheet
- On the back of your request form, write the question number and choose if "and" or "or" is to be used
