

**Wright State University Retirees Association (WSURA)**  
**Annual Meeting Summary**  
**June 7, 2013**

President Pacernick called the meeting to order. The minutes from the May 1 meeting were unanimously approved.

President Pacernick said he has enjoyed his time in office and is very appreciative of the support he received from the members during his term. Abe Bassett will assume the presidency at the end of this meeting. Gary ended by reciting these lovey words from one of his favorite poems, a passage from Walt Whitman's,

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Treasurer, Carol Stevenson distributed the year-end Treasurer's Report, dated June 7, 2013. Carol pointed out two questionable postage charges on the university reports, and said she is going to check into them further for clarification since they are both unusual. One for \$3.18 appeared on the WSURA university's Unallocated General Fund report - showing a postage charge used in April, but it was not reported until May; the second one, a larger charge for a bulk mailing in the amount of \$418.16 is also questionable. She said these two charges need to be clarified. Gail Whitaker will take over the treasurer position during the coming year. Marlene Bireley said name tags have been purchased but the cost has not yet been posted.

Historical Preservation, Lou Shupe is in the process of scheduling interviews with various individuals who have long been associated with Wright State. They include Juanita Wehrle-Einhorn, former Director of Affirmative Action and WOW (Wright State Organization for Women); Lorraine Wagley and Marilyn Willis regarding The Women's Club; and possibly Craig Willis, the first Dean of University College. Other potential interviewees are Steve Simon, Jeff Vernooy (Disability Services,) and Carl Simms (Security).

Activities Chair, Mary Gromosiak seeks permission to spend a modest amount for postage to inform retirees, who do not receive e-mails, about upcoming WSURA activities. The last group trip to the Carew Towers and the American Sign Language Museum in Cincinnati was pleasant. Luncheon at the The Netherland Plaza restaurant was excellent. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves and found the museum very interesting. Mary also announced the upcoming *Create Your Own Fiesta* event on August 24 at 4:00 at her home. She will send an invitation outlining the details to everyone soon.

Scholarship Chair, Paul Wolfe said he still needs to receive the list of scholarship applicants. He also needs help to evaluations the applications. Mary Kenton and Gail Whitaker both volunteered to help with the evaluation process.

Athletic Council Liaison, Mary Kenton reported she attended the last council meeting in April. The big issue on the table is the future status of the Horizon League. Efforts are being made to recruit Oakland University to replace Butler University. It was good to hear WSU Athletics, overall, are in good shape.

Bob Wagley announced that there is going to be an alumni basketball game coming up between former WSU and UD players. As soon the date is set, the details will be sent to retirees.

Library Liaison, Gary Barlow asked the group for their ideas for workshops they would enjoy for the coming year. Last year's workshop on genealogy was successful. He pointed out that WSURA is required to make deposits to the university archives every two years. Among the documents that need to be sent over are copies of our meeting minutes and copies of our Extension newsletters. It was also suggested that a copy our current handbook is included.

**OTHER BUSINESS**

Marlene announced the Annual WSU Retirees Picnic is today, and will start in the Garden of Senses following today's meeting. She encouraged everyone to go and enjoy!

The final order of today's business was "passing of the gavel" from President Gary Pacernick to the incoming president, Abe Bassett. To make his appointment "official", in closing, Abe recited his own, original poetry:

#### NEW BUSINESS
