Because of the restriction on the number of applications per institutions, Research and Sponsored Programs is requesting that all those interested in applying to this program submit an abstract for their project to Deborah Lundin by **Monday, November 20**. If the number of abstracts we receive exceeds the number of applications we are allowed to submit, we will advise the relevant faculty on how a nomination selection will be determined and how to proceed with the application submission.
