Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree at Clark State Community College may transfer into the Anthropology BA program at Wright State University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their associate degree requirements.


Admission Requirements to Anthropology Program at Wright State

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.0,
2. Grade of "C" or better in ENG 1100 equivalency, and
3. Two additional Arts/Humanities or Social Sciences.

Additional Information

- All Liberal Arts B.A. and B.S. majors at Wright State must complete 42 semester hours of courses at the 3000/4000 level.
- All Liberal Arts B.A. majors at Wright State require a foreign language through the 2020 level. If possible, students should take the entire two-year language sequence at Clark State.
- No more than 45 hours of course work in the major department will be counted toward the bachelor's degree.

This agreement will expire two years from date of signature. These requirements are subject to change. Contact a Wright State advisor in your major at least once each academic year to verify current requirements.

*Wright State offers other foreign language options in Arabic, German, Chinese, Greek, Latin, Italian, Japanese, Russian, and Sign Language that students may choose. Clark State student who wish to pursue one of these languages may cross register through SOCHE to complete the Wright State course while attending Clark State. Students who complete the Ohio Transfer Module at Clark State will have met the requirements for the Wright State Core, including requirements for Multicultural Competence courses and Core Integrated Writing courses. However, Anthropology students will still need to complete ATH 2200 (Archaeology) and ATH 2100 (Introduction to Biological Anthropology) to complete major-related general education requirements. Students must complete at least two designated Integrated Writing courses in the major.
