Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their associate degree requirements.

Admission Requirements to Crime and Justice Studies Program at Wright State

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5,
2. Grade of "C" or better in ENG 1100 equivalency, and
3. Two additional Arts/Humanities or Social Sciences.

Additional Information


- All Liberal Arts B.A. and B.S. majors at Wright State must complete 42 semester hours of courses at the 3000/4000 level.
- All Liberal Arts B.A. majors at Wright State require a foreign language through the 2020 level. If possible, students should take the entire two-year language sequence at Clark State.
