

Health & Physical Education Bachelor of Science (BS ED) Clark State to Wright State Completion Program

Students at **Clark State Community College** should complete the following courses in preparation for transfer to Wright State University to pursue the BS ED in Health & Physical Education. See the articulation chart on page two of this agreement for a detailed list of courses required for the BS ED in Health & Physical Education at Wright State University.

Students are encouraged to complete the **Ohio Transfer Module** while at Clark State Community College. The following courses should be taken as part of the Ohio Transfer Module in order to meet specific general education requirements for the BS ED in Health & Physical Education.

BIO 1105 Fundamentals of Anatomy & Physiology

Students are encouraged to complete the following additional courses while at Clark State Community College:

Currently, there is no associate degree program that aligns with the BS ED in Health & Physical Education.

Admission into the BS ED in Health & Physical Education

Students applying for admission to the university may be admitted to pre-major status in order to begin appropriate coursework while completing the process for full program admissions. Admission into pre-major status requires a 2.5 or better cumulative GPA.

The BS ED in Health & Physical Education program admits new students once per year. All application materials must be submitted by the application deadline in late January to be admitted into the program for fall semester of that academic year.
