

Middle Childhood Education Bachelor of Science (BS ED) Clark State to Wright State Completion Program

Students at **Clark State Community College** should complete the following courses in preparation for transfer to Wright State University to pursue the BS ED in Middle Childhood Education. See the articulation chart on page two of this agreement for a detailed list of courses required for the BS ED in Middle Childhood Education at Wright State University.

Admission into the BS ED in Middle Childhood Education

Students applying for admission to the university may be admitted to pre-major status in order to begin appropriate coursework while completing the process for full program admissions. Admission into pre-major status requires a 2.5 or better cumulative GPA.

2.5 or better cum GPA

30 or more credits hours

NOTE: The BS ED in Middle Childhood Education does qualify a candidate for the Middle Childhood Education teaching license. After completing the BS ED, candidates must also complete a one-year graduate level teacher preparation program.
