



## Sports Science Transfer Program

Students who complete an **AA degree** in at Clark State Community College may transfer into the Sports Science program at Wright State University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their associate degree requirements.

### Admission Requirements to Sports Science Program at Wright State

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher,
2. At least 30 hours earned,
3. Program application, and
4. Two letters of recommendation.

### Additional Information

- Students applying for admission to the university may be admitted to pre-major status in order to begin appropriate coursework while completing the process for full program admissions. Admission into pre-major status requires a 2.5 or better cumulative GPA.
- The Sports Science program admits new students one time per year. **All application materials must be submitted by March 1<sup>st</sup>** to be admitted into the program for fall semester of that year.
- Students who would like to complete the A.A. before transferring would be required to take 2 credit hours of general electives that would not apply to the bachelor degree. However, completing the associate degree prior to transfer could qualify students for additional transfer scholarships.
