Although format does assist us in making objectives and outcomes more recognizable to HLC, the real reason we're making changes is a bit deeper.

HLC, in review of our 2020 assurance argument and in our mid-cycle review, criticized Wright State curriculum for not differentiating and distinguishing between our objectives, which communicate and signal future learning, from our outcomes which communicate and signal what successful students can do as a result of their learning experience in our courses.

I'm so sorry, I understand this is quite the change, which should have taken place in the past. Nevertheless, these necessary changes were not specified earlier and must be accomplished now in the little time we have left to address all of our focused visit challenges. And, I must admit, making these two changes in our curriculum now in as little as six months can seem abrupt.

What concerned me about the conversation between you, Wafa, and I, however, was the suggestion that in response to these changes and clarifications we should not make changes and, instead, communicate to the student that the student wouldn't be able to graduate(?).

Please, I have offered to work with you and countless others in making the changes that are necessary. If you need any assistance, I'm available to help you. Generally, we are able to accomplish the necessary

changes within as little as 15 minutes.
