Students who complete an **A.S. degree** in Education at Edison Community College may transfer into the Middle Childhood Education program at Wright State University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their associate degree requirements.

Admission Requirements to the Middle Childhood Education Program at Wright State

1. Earn at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA, and
2. 30 semester hours,
3. Declaration of Middle Childhood Content Areas—form found on web site:
