Program Description			
<p>The College of Nursing and Health offers a graduate program leading to a Master of Science degree with a major in nursing, as well as a dual degree program leading to a Master of Science degree and a Master of Business Administration degree in administration of nursing and health care systems. For the Master of Science degree, students may complete the requirements for two concentrations while pursuing a nursing Master's degree. The bridge option enables a registered nurse with a bachelor's degree in a traditional discipline outside of nursing to enroll in a professional nursing bridge courses leading to a master's degree. All programs prepare nurses for advanced leadership roles in practice and administration, as well as for doctoral study in nursing. The curriculum offers students the opportunity to select a clinical specialization and role (clinical specialist, nurse practitioner, nurse administrator, nurse educator or school nurse). Nurses already possessing a master's degree with a major in nursing may earn a second M.S. degree in nursing. The programs accommodate both full-time and part-time students, with most classes offered in the late afternoon and evening. The sequence of course offerings is flexible. Full-time students may complete the program within one or two calendar years, depending on the major. Part-time students must complete all requirements for the degree within five years. Student successfully completing all concentration requirements are eligible to sit for a variety of national certification exams.</p>
