Students must also complete at least two designated Integrated Writing courses in the major at Wright State. If students complete Sinclair's BIO 2130 and 2310 equivalencies, the Biology Department will help them identify two other Integrated Writing courses in the major to fulfill this requirement.

The following additional coursework will be required to complete the BS in Biology program at Wright State University. Sinclair equivalents are identified for students wishing to complete additional hours beyond the AS before transferring to Wright State.
