



## Crime and Justice Baccalaureate Completion Program

Students who complete an AAS degree in Criminal Justice Science/Corrections at Sinclair Community College may transfer into the Crime and Justice program at Wright State University. Students should verify their satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements with the financial aid office before pursuing classes outside of their associates.

### Admission Requirements to Crime and Justice major at Wright State

1. Cumulative GPA of 2.5
2. Grade of "C" or better in ENG 1100 equivalency (ENG 1101 at Sinclair)
3. Two additional Arts/Humanities or Social Sciences

### Additional Information

- All Liberal Arts B.A. majors at Wright State require 42 semester hours of credit at the 3000/4000 level.
- Criminal Justice majors must take a minimum of 50% (22.5 hours) of criminal justice courses at Wright State.
- All Liberal Arts B.A. majors at Wright State require a foreign language through the 2020 level.
- No more than 45 hours of course work in the major department will count toward the B.A. degree.
