Students at **Sinclair Community College** should complete the following courses in preparation for transfer to Wright State University to pursue the BS ED in Health and Physical Education. See the course equivalency chart on page two of this agreement for a detailed list of courses that can be completed at Sinclair Community College to meet course requirements for the BS ED in Health and Physical Education at Wright State University.

Admission into the BS ED in Health and Physical Education

Students applying for admission to the university may be admitted to pre-major status in order to begin appropriate coursework while completing the process for full program admissions. Admission into pre-major status requires a 2.5 or better cumulative GPA.
