



Psychology Baccalaureate Completion Program

Students who complete an Associate of Arts (A.A) in Psychology degree at Sinclair College may transfer into the Bachelor of Science (B.S) or the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Psychology at Wright State University. Students pursuing the B.S. in Psychology may choose an optional track in Behavioral Neuroscience, Cognition and Perception, or Industrial Organizational.

Students should verify their satisfactory academic program (SAP) requirements with the Office of Financial Aid before pursuing classes outside of the A.A. degree requirements.

Admission Requirements to the Psychology Program at Wright State

1. 15 semester hours earned
2. Complete introduction to psychology with grade of at least a C
3. Cumulative GPA of at least 2.25

This agreement will expire two years from date of signature. Please note, requirements are subject to change. Contact a Wright State advisor in your major at least once a year to verify current requirements.

** Students transferring from Sinclair with PSY 2200, PSY 2217, PSY 2220, and PSY 2225 will have fulfilled 4 of the required 6 Psychology Core Courses required by Wright State. Because B.S. intending students will still be required to complete an additional 3 PSY Core courses (assuming PSY 2228 was NOT completed), 1 of the Sinclair courses will be reassigned as a Psychology Elective, leaving 9 Psychology elective credits remaining. If students transfer in 5 of the 6 required PSY Core courses (i.e., PSY 2200, PSY 2217, PSY 2220, and PSY 2225, and PSY 2228), then only 2 PSY Core courses remain (i.e., Pick 2 from PSY 3210, PSY 3610, PSY 3710, PSY 3820, or PSY 3910). Among the psychology electives, students may transfer PSY 2180 (Psychology of Gender) and PSY 2126 (Stress Management) to Wright State to be accepted as part of either the B.S. or B.A. psychology elective requirements. A total of 12 Psychology electives are required for the B.S. whereas 15 psychology electives are required for the B.A.
