We discuss what, if any, changes are needed. This processes meets the CSWE requirments for program review. Again, we review 9 competencies, each of which is measured twice. This exceeds the WSU assessment requirments. All of the competencies were exceeded, except for competency 5 Measure 1 = 85% in year 1. More clear instructions can be given to the students in the course that administers the competency 5 assessment in the future although the program faculty did not think major changes were necessary during covid times, especially considering that100% of the students met the competency in year 2.
