Additional Steps to Enter the Social Work Program

- Submit a complete program application. Go to wright.edu/socialwork for application.
- Pass an Introduction to Sociology class (SOC 1101/SW 2700).
- Pass or enroll in SWK 1213: Introduction to Social Welfare (or Wright State equivalent).
- Pass or enroll in SWK 2207: Cultural Competency in a Diverse World (or Wright State equivalent).
- Earn a 2.25 overall GPA.
- Provide two professional references.
- Complete a criminal background disclosure statement.
- Write and submit a social work professional statement and a social issue statement.
