



## Baccalaureate Completion Transfer Program

Lawrenceburg Early College High School students who successfully complete credits and/or an associate degree or graduation certificate through Vincennes University may transfer to Wright State to pursue a baccalaureate degree. While all of the college-level credits earned with at least a D grade will transfer, students should work with a Wright State academic advisor to determine which credits are required by the major they intend to pursue.

### Application process to Wright State

1. Admission application ([wright.edu/applynow](http://wright.edu/applynow)),
2. Application fee,
3. Lawrenceburg High School transcript,
4. Vincennes University transcript,
5. ACT and/or SAT score, and
6. AP scores, if applicable.
