- WSURA has 284 members.
- WSURA moved from the Foundation Building back to campus (328 Fawcett Hall).

Retirees' Giving

Our Endowed Nick Davis Scholarship:

- Account balance: \$101,254. This year we gave three \$1,500 scholarships.
- Retirees have given \$1.538 million to the university (June 30, 2012 to June 30, 2022).

Membership

• Since June 30, 2021, we have welcomed 22 new members, and renewed 21 annual members. Two of those renewals moved to Lifetime Membership.

Activities and Living-Learning Workshops

COVID 19 required the innovative use of Zoom for Board meetings and eliminated many indoor group activities. This year we held naturalist guided tours of the Beavercreek Wetlands, hosted a panel discussion on retirement, and held presentations hosted by faculty on topics as varied as Vincent Van Gogh and tracing Lebanese ancestry. Our fall lineup of Zoom meetings included ones on heart health, the midterm elections and their impact on the nation and Ohio, and China's evolving international role and relationship with the United States. Spring 2023 will have inperson discussions on misinformation in our modern world and on Ohio's ancient cultures at Fort Ancient.

Spring Luncheon

- Cancelled for the last two years because of COVID-19, we held a well-attended event on May 6, 2022, in the Berry Room at the Nutter Center. Our guest speakers shared recent investments and innovations in the city of Dayton. The 2023 luncheon is scheduled for May 5.
- We have developed an awards program for outstanding retired faculty and staff: The Lew Shupe Faculty Service Award and the Rich Johnson Staff Service Award, given at the spring luncheon. In 2022, Marlene Bierley received the faculty service award and Barb Weinert-McBee the staff service award.
