Retirees' Giving:

Nick Davis Scholarship:

- Account balance: \$91,900
- This year we added a fourth \$1500 scholarship
- Recipients are children or grandchildren of retirees

Coming Soon: Experiential Learning Scholarship:

• Will support students working with faculty, traveling to conferences, etc.

Oral History Project:

- Three current board members have interviewed retirees for the project
- WSURA has contributed student employee time at a cost of \$475 to support the project

Activities and Living-Learning Workshops:

• Dozens of retirees participate in educational and social activities throughout the academic year

Spring Luncheon:

- The year's culminating event attracts up to 80 retirees

Web Site Redesign:

- Long-term board member, Abe Bassett, led a full renovation of the website, which now is in keeping with University standards
- Two new board members have dramatically updated and improved our online publications

New Service Award for Retirees:

- Lew Shupe and Rich Johnson—These retirees (both deceased) were members of the original WSURA board which created the Association
- We'll establish the Lew Shupe Award for a retired faculty member and the Rich Johnson for a retired staff member, to be awarded annually

Strategic Planning (Donna):

Art Gallery:

• Board member Gary Barlow has created a small art gallery in our boardroom! The effect is stunning.

Volunteerism:

- Individual members—nearly every board member participates in volunteer activities in their communities and beyond
- Pending volunteer corps—Eric Corbitt, Director of the Student Union has suggested a partnership with WSURA to provide support during events in the Student Union
- Several board members have offered to work during the annual Phonathon.
- "Giving back" is a frequent topic of discussion. We will continue to seek opportunities to contribute to our university.

The 2017 OPERS Popular Financial Report was finally published on their WEB site. 2017 was a very good year, with a 16.62% return on investment. The funding ratio, comparing pension commitments to assets, is good but not great. The ratio moved from 80% in 2016 to 81 % in 2017. OPERS still has a \$19 billion unfunded liability. However, the current OPERS amortization (the amount time that will be needed to fund remaining liabilities) is 18 years which is within the statutorily required 30 year window.

They still will be asking the legislation to approve the changes to the automatic 3% cost of living adjustment that were proposed last year. The growing retiree base, retirees living longer and

escalating health costs will increase their liabilities. There is also concern that we may have stagnant economic growth in the future due to an aging population with a declining birth rate. In regard to Health Care Financials, the changes made in 2016 with the Medicare Connector have resulted in a savings of \$12 billion dollars. OPERS is not required by law to provide Health care and will not allow Health care funding to jeopardize the pension funding so beginning in 2018 all available funding has been allocated to the pension fund.. The Health care fund is currently enhanced solely by investment returns and has about 12 years of solvency under the current health care programs. **Open enrollment for retirees begins Oct. 15, 2018.**
