The above minimum scores are based on recommendations from the American Council on Education (National Guide).

Individual academic departments have determined how Cambridge Assessments AS or A exam credit is to be awarded. If the exam is the equivalent of a specific course, "Pass" or "CR" credit will be awarded for that equivalent class or credit as shown above.

The above course equivalencies and credit hours will be awarded only to students whose courses have not already been evaluated at Wright State. Course equivalencies and credit hours are subject to change without notice and will be granted in accordance with those current when Cambridge Assessment grades are evaluated.
