- Students must apply for admission to Wright State by January 15 for fall and September 15 for spring start of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Clark State). Additionally, students must apply for field experience, ED 2650 Field Experience I at Wright State, by January 15 for fall and September 15 for spring start of sophomore year/year two.  
\*Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university before field experience application can be approved.
- All students with declared English major are automatically admitted as Pre-English students.
- In order to be admitted fully as an Integrated Language Arts/English Education major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.6 from Wright State.
- Students must earn a C or higher in EDU 1110, EDU 2217, ENG 1111, PSY 2218, and ENG courses at Clark State.
- In addition to the above requirements, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Adolescent and Young Adult Licensure program:
  - Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
  - Grade of C or higher in each of the following:

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- Any equivalent transfer courses and Wright State courses that are applicable to the Wright State Core Requirements that are related to the students' respective content area and all required courses
  - All Teacher Education courses:
    - Clark State: EDU 1110, EDU 2217, and PSY 2218
    - Wright State: ED 2800
  - All English courses
- Passing scores in each of the following areas:
  - One of the following reading scores:
    - ACT reading score of 19 or better
    - SAT evidence-based reading and writing score of 520 or better
    - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators reading score of 162 or better
  - One of the following writing scores:
    - ACT writing score of 6 or better
    - SAT writing dimension score of 5 or better
    - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators writing score of 165 or better
  - One of the following math scores:
    - ACT math score of 17 or better
    - SAT math score of 510 or better
    - ETS praxis core academic skills for educators math score of 158 or better

## 1. ADMISSIONS AND DEADLINES

### *Join the Wright Path Program*

Students interested in applying to the Wright Path must submit a request for membership at [wright.edu/wrightpath/clark-state](http://wright.edu/wrightpath/clark-state).

High School students must have completed their junior year before applying to the Wright Path, and current Clark State College students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

### *Transfer to Wright State University*

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Clark State College in order to transfer to Wright State.



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Students must apply to the Undergraduate Admission one semester prior to completing their studies at Clark State College.

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\*Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university before field experience application can be approved.

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In addition to the above requirements, the following criteria are required for full admission into the Adolescent and Young Adult Licensure program:

- Cumulative minimum GPA of 2.6
- Grade of C or higher in each of the following:
  - Any equivalent transfer courses and Wright State courses that are applicable to the Wright State Core Requirements that are related to the students' respective content area and all required courses
